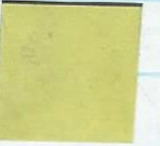
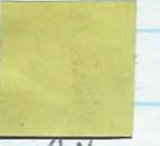
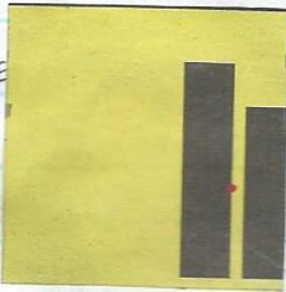
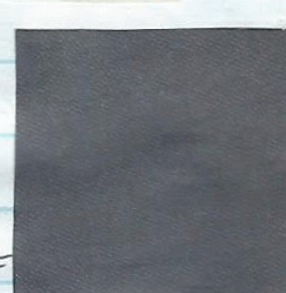
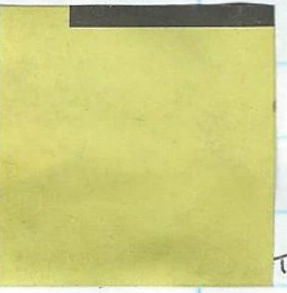
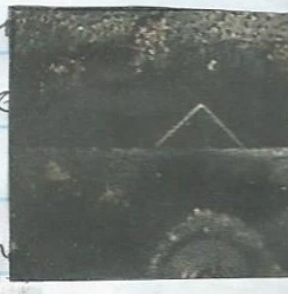


Collapsed wall gets a closer look

Yasmin Donlon has put together a story called *Cat Naps Agrissola* aka Whitey, about her cat, which sleeps 23 hours a day.

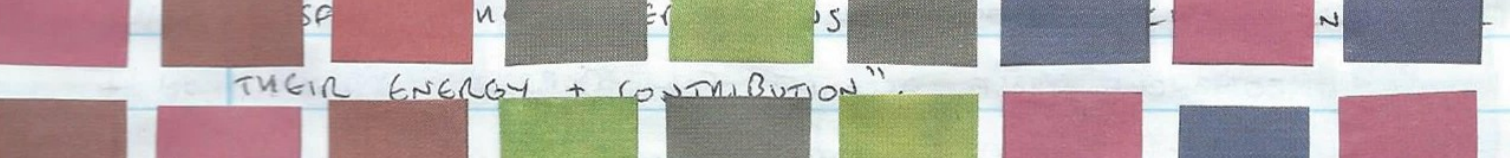
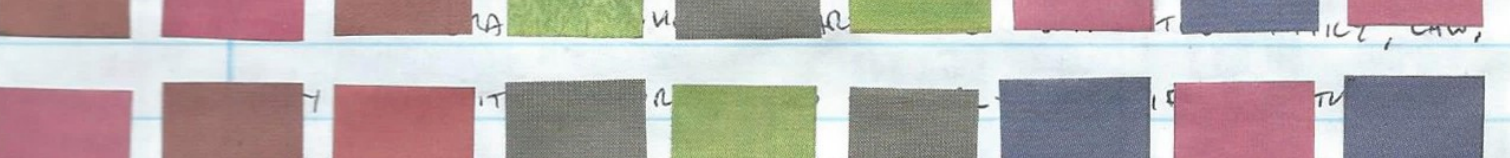
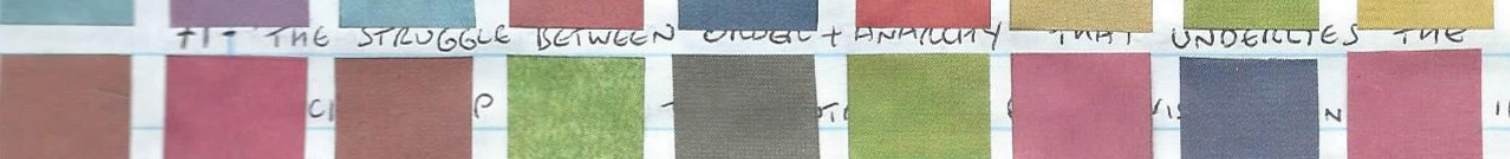
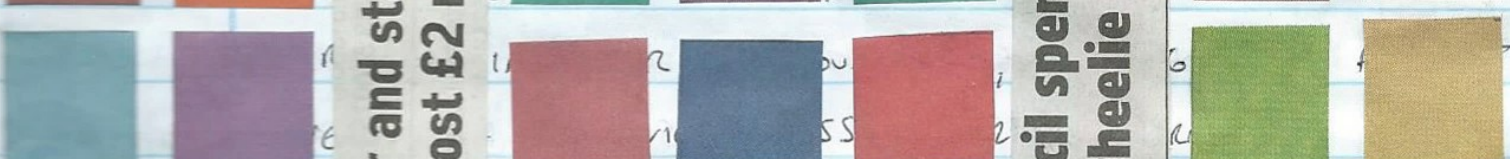

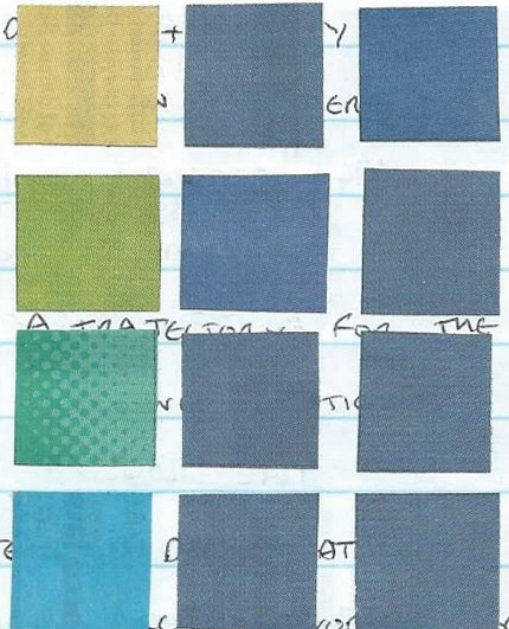
**Barbecue

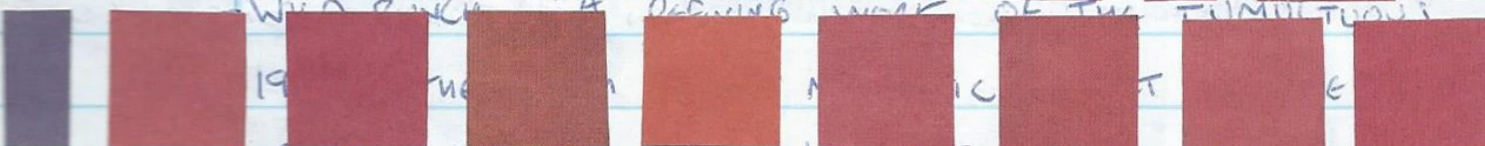
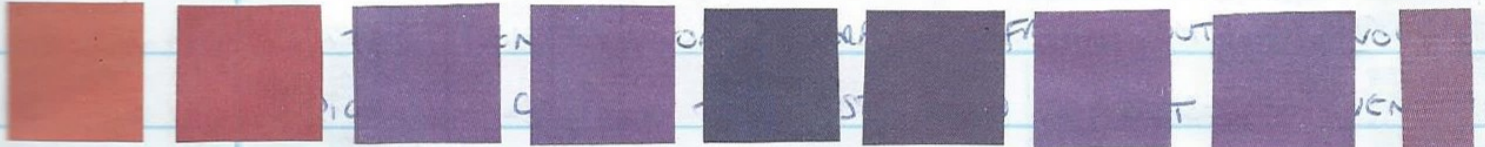
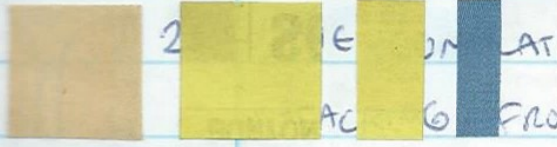
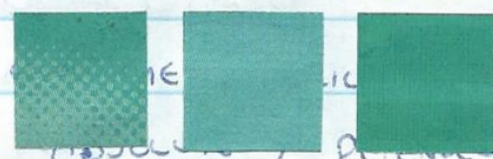
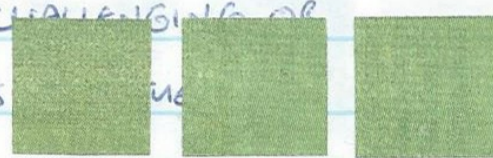
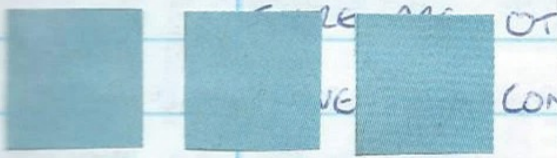
Teen called girl 62 times

A 17-YEAR-OLD youth from Swadlincote has admitted harassing a female victim.

The teenager, whose identity is protected by law, pleaded guilty when he appeared in front of magistrates at Derby Youth Court.

Between November 3 and 4, the teenager sent the girl 19 text messages, 38 Facebook messages and made 62 phone calls.

The youth was made the subject of a restraining order not to contact the victim for a year. He was ordered to pay £50 compensation, £85 costs and £15 victim surcharge.
