

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE INDIGENT DRIVERS INTERLOCK AND ALCOHOL MONITORING FUND, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the State of Ohio's Indigent Driver Alcohol Treatment (IDAT) Fund allows courts in Ohio to utilize necessary treatment services for offenders convicted of operating a vehicle under the influence of alcohol or drugs (OVI) that the offenders would not otherwise be able to afford; and

WHEREAS, the State's IDAT Fund is funded by a portion of each drivers license reinstatement fee paid by offenders convicted of an OVI offense; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Amended Substitute Senate Bill 17 (127th General Assembly), the IDAT funds are to be used for "an immobilizing or disabling device, including a certified ignition interlock device, or an alcohol monitoring device used by an offender or juvenile offender who is ordered to use the device by a county juvenile or municipal court judge and who is determined by the county juvenile or municipal court judge not to have the means to pay for the person's use of the device"; and

WHEREAS, IDAT funds are transferred from the State's IDAT fund to a local fund; and

WHEREAS, the Director of Finance has received funds from the Ohio Department of Public Safety representing the Village's current portion of the IDAT funds; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 4511.191(I), the Village is required to establish a local indigent drivers interlock and alcohol monitoring fund for the deposit and accounting of the funds received from the State; and

WHEREAS, this Council believes it is in the best interest of the Village to create a local indigent drivers interlock and alcohol monitoring fund for the deposit and accounting of the funds received from the State.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF CHAGRIN FALLS, CUYAHOGA COUNTY, STATE OF OHIO:

SECTION 1. There is hereby established "The Indigent Drivers Interlock and Alcohol Monitoring Fund" for the deposit and accounting of funds received from the State of Ohio's Indigent Drivers Interlock and Alcohol Monitoring Fund.

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SECTION 2. That actions of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this legislation were adopted in lawful meetings of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in compliance with all legal requirements, including Chapter 114 of the Codified Ordinances of the Village of Chagrin Falls.

SECTION 3. That this Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, property, health and safety of this Village and for the further reason that the Village must deposit funds received from the State into The Indigent Drivers Interlock and Alcohol Monitoring Fund at the earliest time possible; wherefore, provided it receives the requisite number of affirmative votes of all members elected to Council, this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and immediately upon its passage by this Council and approval by the Mayor; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force after the earliest period allowed by law.
