Title: Elijah part 3: Pressing Pause.

Bible Reference: 1 Kings 17:3-4

Overview

The story of Elijah is pretty action packed. Elijah has just told King Ahab that it will not rain until he says so (Elijah that is). In a few verses time there will be miraculous multiplicity of food, resurrection and fire from heaven. Right now, however, God seems to press the pause button and sends Elijah to hide himself in a rock by a stream.

Questions

- 1) Have you ever experienced a time when your life seemed "hidden". For example A time when it was less filled with all the normal "stuff of life"?
- 2) How does this passage point us to God's protection provision, presence and power and how are these things fulfilled in Jesus?
- 3) Gordon MacDonald writes in his book "Ordering your Private World":

"It would not be hard to believe that the archenemy of God has conspired to surround us at every conceivable point in our lives with the interfering noises of civilization that, when left unmuffled, usually drown out the voice of God."

How could you get some time away from the noise of everyday life to hear God for yourself?
