7. Delegations

7.1 Campbell, Girardi, and Keleher re: Concerns about Safety in Light of Proposed Quarry Blasting.

Roy Girardi expressed concerns about the impact of the proposed Hidden Quarry blasting on his family's safety and the enjoyment of the property. Mr. Girardi asked Council to establish a by-law that prohibits blasting to 300m from property lines.

Leanne Girardi spoke on behalf of Dennis Campbell, who mentioned he is the property owner at 8573 Highway 7. Ms. Girardi discussed Mr. Campbell's concerns that his well water may become unusable and the potential injuries or damage to property that may result from the proposed Hidden Quarry blasting. Leanne Girardi on behalf of Dennis Campbell also requested that Council establish a by-law that prohibits blasting to 300m from the property line.

Be it resolved that the Council of the Township of Guelph/Eramosa has received Director of Finance Report 2017-01 regarding the 2016 Statement of Council Remuneration and Expenses and Attendance Records for Regular and Special Meetings of Council, as amended.

8.4 Resolution of Authorization re: County of Wellington to act on Townships Behalf for the Aggregate Property Assessment Appeals

Mayor Chris White discussed the issues with the taxation reduction as a result of the new method of assessment for gravel pits. He noted that the total taxation impact for the 7 gravel pits located in the County of Wellington is significant. Mayor White noted that there will be no legal ramifications to the Township of Guelph/Eramosa but that the Township is providing support to the Township of Puslinch and Wellington County in getting the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) to reassess gravel pits.

AND WHEREAS municipal Council of The Corporation of the Township of Guelph/Eramosa wishes to confirm the appointment of the County of Wellington as their agent for the purposes of handling the Aggregate Property Appeals and authorize them to retain legal counsel for the Aggregate Property Appeals;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT Council of The Corporation of the Township of Guelph/Eramosa hereby:

1. Appoints the County of Wellington to act as their agent for the purposes of the Aggregate Property Appeals and the County of Wellington shall have full authority to take all steps necessary to prosecute the Aggregate Property Appeals.
