
Reports and Discussion items

1. Fundraising Ideas

- a. Concessions:
 - i. Barbie created a signup sheet for concession fundraiser dates.
- b. Barn Dance:

- c. 100 year service idea- 100 kids, for 100 years of Extension

 - ii. It was suggested that there should be a flyer to raise awareness in the clubs.

2. Committees
