

2 Corinthians 5:1-10 Study Questions

Dig Deep: Read chapters 1 through 4 to more accurately understand the context of our verses.

Paul says in verse 6 that he “is of good courage.” What do we see in verses 1-5 for the basis for that attitude?

What other foundational beliefs from chapters 1-4 give him courage?

How does “an attitude of courage” change the way we view each day?

Verse 9, Paul says he “makes it his aim to please” God. Other than being a fantastic slogan or idea we could hang on our wall, what does it practically look like in our lives?

How can we make it our aim to please God: At work? At home? In our neighborhoods? Out to eat? In our free time? At church?

Last week, we read in chapter 4 how Paul wanted to see God’s grace extend to more and more people. What are one or two ways you can intentionally extend the grace of God this week?

Remember: Jesus is the founder and perfecter of our faith (Hebrews 12). Even as we “have courage” and “aim to please Him” we do so with the strength and direction we get through daily spending time with Him.
