## Dog Walk Update

Calling all the dog walkers and users of the Recreation Field & Dog Walk areas. **PLEASE PLEASE PLEASE** can we all be responsible at all times and keep dogs on leads and pick up any mess. Please do not allow your dogs to walk across the field and the sports pitches as this is part of the dog exclusion area. Only Dogs (and their owners) can use the dog walk area and dog recreational area. This isn't to be used to get a good view of the match!

If you allow children to walk the dogs then please make sure they are aware of the areas dogs are not allowed on the recreation area, please make sure they have bags to pick up any mess, several children have been reported not picking up after their pets and when approached have responded with comments "**mum says I don't have to pick it up as it's dirty**"

If anyone is unsure on the areas dogs are allowed on the recreation area then please see the signs all around the park. Remember the dog walk and recreation area was only a temporary arrangement and this will be reviewed again in March 2015. Let's all work together to ensure that both dogs and sports can share the recreation area.

## Village Issues & Updates

**The Barograph** – The barograph work has started and unfortunately won't be completed until w/c 19 December, due to a delay with the bollards delivery. It is starting to take shape and we have received some really positive comments already. Please use the road responsibly and park sensibly. This is a busy blind junction which makes visibility very difficult. Please respect home owners and do not park in front of gates or dropped kerbs at any time.

**Village Benches** – Repairs and maintenance to several benches in the village have improved both the appearance and safety of these and will extend their life span.

**Park** – A new seat has brought new life back into the rocket and new step treads and hand rail on the climbing frame ensure the robustness and safety of our children.

**Your Parish Council has tight budgets** and lots of expenditure to manage throughout the year. So far this year we have spent £53,708 which is 59% of our parish budget and our village hall income is £31,500 which is 86% of our total target. Financial information is always displayed on the notice boards and published on the website. Payments over £500 are detailed on the website too.

**Dog Walk** – Changes have been made to the recreational area of the dog walk to enable the Blasters football club to accommodate larger football pitches. The Parish Council would like to thank the patience of the dog walkers and remind all users of the recreational area that it is a dog exclusion zone. Dogs are only permitted on the dog walk and dog recreational area. If you see anyone misusing the recreational area then please point them to the signs which clearly display the areas which can be used by dogs and their owners.

## Police update

All areas are going to be encouraged to roll out a cycle-lit scheme. What this means in effect is that anyone found cycling without lights on their cycle in the hours of darkness are issued with a ticket. If the recipient of the ticket subsequently attends an Enquiry Office showing proof of purchase of cycle lights then the ticket is void. No proof of purchase of lights means that the ticket is processed.

There continues to be delays in answering 101 calls and this is being addressed but please don't let this stop you from reporting non urgent crimes and incidents.

## Autumn News from the Hanson - RSPB Wetland Project

At Ouse Fen we're passionate about creating a home for nature and the partnership project with Hanson is doing just that by transforming Needingworth Quarry into a vast wetland nature reserve.

### A bumper summer for wildlife

With the breeding season coming to an end it is time to review the birdlife successes and failures on the reserve this year. Well, bitterns, our top target species did very well with 6 booming males, double last year's figure and in July it seemed that young were on the wing across the reserve. This is above all expectations and bodes well for the future years as gravel extraction continues and new habitats are created. All the work done by our sterling volunteers - from pre-dawn monitoring of boomers, to sowing and planting reed plugs, pays dividends when a young bittern flies from the reeds right over your head.

We've also had a large increase in bearded reedlings with at least 24 pairs, up from nine last year, their ping-pong calls echoing across the reeds accompanied by the chatter of reed and sedge warblers. Overhead, sky-dancing marsh harriers had a reasonable year, six pairs raised at least 14 young, while barn owls had a great year with all four boxes holding three well grown chicks in the first brood - with more to come. On a sunny day it was a great place to watch hobbies hunting dragonflies over the reedbeds too.

The black-headed gull colony did very well at Barleycroft Lake with 274 pairs and eight pairs of common terns. Breeding wader numbers were also plentiful with 23 lapwing pairs and 12 redshank, duck numbers and variety were good including a pair of garganey present through the period. At Hanson's Needingworth settlement lagoons up to 4 turtle dove could be heard 'on-territory', welcome news alongside shocking declines nationally.

It has been a good year for butterflies, the nettles and thistles have provided caterpillar food and nectar for hundreds of small tortoiseshells, peacocks and the more occasional painted ladies and clouded yellows. On the mammal front we have seen Chinese water deer, water shrew and lots of water voles so the new wetlands are providing secure habitats on a large scale. There have been occasional otter sightings too.

### Get set for Winter

Autumn wildfowl numbers have been building through October and November when thousands of ducks and geese will join us to spend the winter here. The bird flocks attract raptors, particularly peregrines. One of the best ways to spot one is to look for lapwing and plover flocks rising from the fields and margins. There are rarities too from time to time - great white egrets seem to be making a home here, with one or two around the reedbeds throughout the autumn.

## ENVAR COMPOSTING LTD

We have recently completed a redevelopment of the Bluntisham site at The Heath, expanding our In Vessel Composting (IVC) tunnels from 6 to 11. As an environmentally conscious company, accredited with both ISO 14001 and 9001, we always keep in mind the impact we are having on the area around us and happily meet with local Councillors at our Liaison Committee Meetings once a year. Recently we have completed a litter net fence on top of the earth bund around the Eastern edge of the site and also along the Heath Road.

Below is a brief outline of how Envar Composting treats the kerb-side collected green and food waste that we receive. This waste would have to go to landfill at a huge cost to both the environment and the public purse if places like Envar Composting did not exist.

### ENVAR IVC FACILITY

The design capacity of the current technology at the Envar Facility is 135,000 tonnes per annum. The assumed blending ratio for the incoming waste is 90% green (garden) waste and 10% food waste.

The principle of the Envar IVC technology is aerobic treatment of waste via market leading GiCom air handling equipment. This equipment forces air through the material from underfloor pipes, giving optimum conditions for microbes to naturally heat up the material, which remains above 60 Celsius for 48 hours, thereby pasteurising it. These tunnels have been validated for a 'single-pass' meaning that the material is pasteurised in one pass through the tunnels. The outlet air is exhausted through a biofilter, minimising odour and bioaerosol emissions from the site.

The IVC process is 1 week duration from loading through to emptying ready for the next batch. This is followed by 8-10 weeks of stabilisation on the maturation area (windrows), followed by screening into a product for storage before release off site. The product we now produce is BSI PAS 100 accredited and therefore is no longer classified as a waste. This is a 0-10mm compost/soil improver which contains phosphate and potash suitable for a wide range of agricultural and horticultural crops. It is available for sale to local farmers and businesses.


**Timebanking – caring about our community. Cllr Steve Criswell.**

Time banks are springing up all around Cambridgeshire. Three years ago I introduced the concept to Somersham, the first in our district. It takes time to grow, but is proving popular and successful. It's free to register and is based on the simple principle that I spend an hour helping someone (at my convenience) and another member spends an hour helping me. A co-ordinator matches needs to offers and you are under no pressure to be involved more than you want to. Time can be banked and reciprocated at any time.

The scheme helps to build community spirit and social interaction. It can also help support the elderly and vulnerable by running errands and reducing isolation. Everyone has something they can contribute, even though they may not recognise it at first. It also helps with those little tasks that you cannot do, but hardly warrants calling a professional.

Common exchanges range from giving a lift, shopping, tidying the garden, sharing tips on computers, cooking or decorating, to calling in for a coffee a chat and changing a light bulb. Community groups can also join and this is proving helpful with holding events and fundraising activities.

At a time when public services are stretched, villages are starting to recognise that the more self sufficient we become the stronger our communities will be and the more our residents will benefit. The Parish Council supports the idea of starting a Timebank in Bluntisham.
