'mis' is a prefix meaning 'bad', or 'badly'. It also

means 'wrongly' when used with some nouns or verbs.

Word: sub

Meaning: 'sub' is a prefix meaning 'under' or 'below'.

Word: micro or mini

Meaning: 'micro' and 'mini' are prefixes meaning 'small'.

Examples:

minibus minimum microscope miniskirt miniature microchip minibeast minimal microphone
