BAGUIO CITY – Expect a heightened campaign against lewd video materials in the city in the coming days.

The city council last Monday asked the city police and other concerned agencies here to implement the penal provisions of the law banning the display and sale of sex videos in the city.

The move initiated by Councilor Betty Lourdes Tabanda was an offshoot of the celebrated Hayden Kho-Katrina Halili sex video scandal which has resulted to enhanced operations against video piracy and pornographic video articles in Metro Manila as of late.

“With the onset of the

digital age, the proliferation of videos and presentations/shows in the market poses a threat to the morality of the general public which include the youth and children,” Tabanda noted in the resolution approved by the city council.

Tabanda said the sex videos project women in general as “sex objects and degrades then thus dehumanize them.”

“The display and sale of sex videos in public places for commercial purposes is detrimental to the development of the young and destroys the very fiber

Lawmaker Pushes For Bill Penalizing Enforced, Involuntary Disappearances

Citing the abduction and subsequent release of a Fil-American activist and his companion, opposition Sen. Chiz Escudero yesterday pushed for the approval of Senate Bill 1307 that would penalize enforced and involuntary disappearance and jail perpetrators for life.

"No less than our Constitution says that no person shall be deprived of life, liberty or property without due process of law. We should not allow this to proliferate or be used even against perceived enemies of

the State," Escudero, chair of the Senate committee on justice and human rights, said.

Filipino-American activist Melissa Roxas and her two companions were taken by unidentified armed men in Tarlac last week. She and one companion were later released, but the third is still missing.

Details of the abduction have yet to be known but the militant group Bagong Alyansang Makabayan (Bayan) has accused the government of perpetrating the abduction.

"Every now and

then our society bears witness to cases of involuntary and forced disappearances. Cases that have placed our country under the tight watch of human rights groups both local and international, and even foreign governments," he said.

He also cited the case of Jonas Burgos, which has been reported and confirmed as a case of involuntary disappearance.

The human rights group Karapatan says that from January 2001 to December 2008, it re-

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Weakest link in anti-flu drive, Strengthen barangay health centers

Opposition Sen. Chiz Escudero yesterday said the government should pour more funds to strengthen barangay health centers which could be the weakest link in the anti-flu (AHINI) prevention and containment drive.

"We all know that our barangay health centers have been neglected. If an outbreak occurs, particularly in our urban poor communities, we would be hard press in containing the spread of this dreaded virus," he said in a statement.

"The barangay health center is our last line of defense in the health care system. We should have a capability check so we will know exactly in which area we are most vulnerable," Escudero added.

He made the call following the disclosure of Health Secretary Francisco Duque that AHINI flu cases in the country have risen to 14 while 21 people are being monitored for the presence of the virus.

Escudero said the problems of many barangays with health centers

usually have to do with the unavailability of medical staff, inadequate facilities, and insufficient supply of medicines.

A recent report by VERA Files shows that health spending has sharply declined during the administration of President Gloria Macapagal Arroyo, "forcing Filipinos to spend more for badly needed health services."

It said that last year, total national government spending dropped by 27.5 percent to P253.00 per Filipino.

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Lift moratorium on PUJ extension lines, DOTC asked

BAGUIO CITY – The city council wants the Department of Transportation and Communication (DOTC) to lift the moratorium on applications for extension of lines that would allow existing public utility jeepneys to ply the unserved routes in the city.

In a resolution authored by Councilor Richard Carino, the body requested the DOTC "to amend

or make an addendum to Memorandum dated June 8 2007 to include the approval of line extensions among those franchising functions for which the moratorium was lifted.

Carino recalled that the city council made the same request through Resolution No. 262 series of 2000.

However, the same was not addressed even when the DOTC

Secretary issued the June 8, 2007 memorandum.

The Land Transportation Franchising Regulatory Board (LTFRB) imposed a moratorium on applications for new PUJ franchises through Memorandum Circular No. 98-026. Before that, the city council in Resolution No. 292 series of 1998 asked for said moratorium to stem the proliferation of PUJs and prevent

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Lawmaker calls for 5 more Deped reps in gsis board

Opposition Sen. Chiz Escudero yesterday pushed for the passage of a bill amending the GSIS charter to increase to five the number of seats for the Department of Education (DepEd) in the board of trustees of the Government Service Insurance System (GSIS).

"Our teachers must be given a greater representation in the GSIS. This will give them more power in formulating policies in the use of the financial resources of the GSIS," he said.

"They work for very little pay, their benefits are always delayed, and they

work under very horrible conditions. Let us not delay this any longer," said Escudero, who authored Senate Bill 3172.

He pointed out that more than half a million teachers and DepEd personnel represent about 40 percent of the 1.4 million total membership of state-run GSIS.

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Bwd asked to report on water contamination incident, measures taken City to stick to own market reconstruction plan

BAGUIO CITY – The city council wants the Baguio Water District to submit a complete report on the water source contamination incident involving the water source at the Navy Base pumping station along with the measures undertaken to prevent a repeat of the incident.

The body last Monday approved a resolution authored by Councilor Betty Lourdes Tabanda for said purpose.

The incident, according to Tabanda, started last May 3 when several cases of diarrhea were reported in several barangays in the city.

At present, a total of 342 cases were recorded in five

barangays distributed as follows: 78 in St. Joseph; 145 in M. Roxas; 62 in Imelda Village; 34 in Brookside and 23 in East Modernsite.

Although there was no death, 14 patients with age range of two months to 81 years were admitted in various hospitals.

Tabanda said an investigation and rapid health assessment conducted by the city health department showed that the cause of the affliction was the water supplied by the BWD through the Navy Base pumping station which subsequent analysis showed contamination with fecal

coliform organism.

“While the (BWD) took action to shut down the water line and to order the public to discard the tap water which was collected, there is a need to take all necessary processes to contain any further cases of gastroenteritis not only in the barangays mentioned but all other barangays in the city,” Tabanda said.

She said because of this, the BWD should submit a complete report on the contamination incident and to inform the city council of what measures should be taken to prevent similar incidents. /aileen p. refuerzo

BAGUIO CITY – The city government will stick to its own city market restoration plan and will not allow unauthorized improvement by the vendors who have been clamoring to undertake the repair job by themselves.

Acting mayor Daniel Farinas affirmed this last Monday in reaction to reports that the vendors

have begun reconstructing their stalls that were burned last March despite the city government's rejection of their proposal to undertake the repair work by themselves and at their own expense.

Farinas warned that the city will order the demolition of any unauthorized improvements if the vendors will continue to insist on

what they want.

He said that after the fire incidents that gutted the vegetable proper building 1 and 2 and sari-sari and tobacco sections and affect 238 stalls, city officials led by Mayor Reinaldo Bautista Jr. decided to pursue the restoration project acknowledging that it is the city government's re-

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Extra care vs. h1n1 advised as 1st flu case posted in cordi

BAGUIO CITY – City officials advised residents to be extra cautious but to remain calm now that the first case of Human Influenza A (H1N1) affliction has been confirmed in the Cordillera Administrative Region.

Acting Mayor Daniel Farinas said that as advised by health officials, there is no cause for alarm as the situation is under control but the public needs extra vigilance in caring for their health as a safeguard against the disease.

City health officer Dr. Florence Reyes

said the first H1N1 case was confirmed by the Department of Health Cordillera director Myrna Cabotaje but no details on the identity of the patient and the circumstances of the affliction were divulged.

The patient is said to have recuperated but remained confined at home and monitored daily.

The DOH-CAR had been monitoring the first four sus-

pected cases called cases under observation (CUOs), three of which had been cleared albeit eight new cases had been added to the observation list as of Friday even as intensive contact tracing and surveillance operations continue.

Reyes said the city is maintaining its advice for travelers from abroad – with or without symptoms – to observe a ten-day self-quarantine

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City all set for class opening

BAGUIO CITY – The city government is all set for the opening of classes tomorrow, Monday.

Acting Mayor Daniel Farinas assured that concerned agencies have prepared contingency measures to ensure that the opening of classes will run smoothly and peacefully.

Only public schools are set to open classes tomorrow as private schools will begin classes a week later. The city expects around 70,000 students in the various public and private kindergarten, elementary and secondary institutions this year.

The city police under city director Enrico Salapong mounted the

usual traffic and anti-crime measures to contain the road crisis and peace and order problems expected to be encountered during the day.

It will employ the deployment of police personnel, aides and volunteers in critical areas such as major thoroughfares, school premises, market, bus terminals, malls and other places to prevent

petty crimes that normally increase during school days.

To bolster the crime prevention campaign, the police again strengthened the “I-text mo si Hepe” by which constituents could directly report crime situations or complaints to police chief Salapong through cell number: 09204222861. This is

The President “ain’t” deaf. Press Secretary Cerge Remonde gave that spin to Ms Arroyo’s sensible order to Finance Secretary Margarito Teves: scrap taxes, clamped by Bureau of Customs, on imported books and reading material.

“Books give light to my eyes,” the Ibanag proverb says. Thus, “President Arroyo wants books to be within reach of the common man,” spinmeister Remonde explained. “She believes reading as an important value for intellectual formation, which is the foundation of a healthy public opinion necessary for a vibrant democracy.”

Manuel Quezon III opened protest sluiceways by showing, in Inquirer columns, that Finance Department Order 17-09 fractured the Florence Agreement. The Philippines is party to this 1950 treaty. It would spur “free exchange of ideas and

knowledge”, Quezon wrote. Tax collectors instead clamped on a

premium for ignorance.

Customs claimed that the word—“only”—in Republic Act 8047 authorized taxes by way of exception. Nonsense. “The word seems to be a Customs intercalation,” constitutional scholar Joaquin Bernas, SJ noted.

“I don’t believe Congress would attempt to repeal a treaty commitment by the mere insertion of one word,” he added. “Neither may Customs attempt to insert for whatever purpose what Congress did not insert”.

This book levy uproar resembles the firestorm that earlier engulfed Cebu City officials. Vice-mayor Michael Rama and Councilor Joy August Young tried to padlock the 69-year old Rizal Memorial Library. Like our taxmen, they cited “reasons of economy”.

But citizens, who built the library in 1939, beat them back. Today, the library is undergoing a million-peso renovation. That’s a significant victory too. This is, after all, a country where half of those between 7 and 21 don’t read anything—not even comics. And by grade four, many students still can’t read.

Illegal book taxes interlock with flawed textbooks. Antonio Calipjo Go, for example, documented, for over a decade, errors that studded science and English textbooks. Some columnists pounced on Go. They didn’t question his findings or concern over miseducating students. Rather, they fretted over publishing moguls’ balance sheets. A Senate probe fizzled.

Twelve years after the Lower House documented textbook errors, German national Helmut Haas—who lodged the complaint—found flaws yet again. His Grade 5 son’s copy of “The Wonderful World of Science” textbook claims “algae as a fish,” and “dust as a minute organism”.

“The Department of Education’s committee on instructional material has not done a single thing since the 1997 inquiry,” Haas told Sun.Star “How will the Philippines come out of this economic situation when they teach this in schools?”

Led by Rep. Raul del Mar, the inquiry found error-filled textbooks proliferate nationwide. The problem stems from negligence and apparent graft. Then Education secretary Ricardo Gloria promised reforms.

Nothing came of that too. So, is it any surprise why our kids landed in the cellar of the last three International Mathematics and Science tests?

“The best way of gauging enlightenment of a nation is to examine the attitude of it’s officials towards books,” Manila Chronicle’s I.P. Soliongco wrote in 1957. “If this test were applied to the Philippines, it would be found we’re one of the most backwards in the world,” the late “Yeyeng” wrote. Quezon provided this overdue test. Amor propio, however, prodded customs bureaucrats to stonewall, noted Rep. Teodoro Locsin, Jr. Tha underscored the bureaucratic mindset.

We have no monopoly on narrow-minds. The paranoid Burmese junta bans even travel books like “Lonely Planet”. Malaysia’s Internal Security Ministry uses the draconian

on influenza-A H1N1*

We have confirmed cases of Influenza-A H1N1 in the country, as schools are about to open.

Our enemy is both the disease and the unnecessarily panic that may arise as the disease spread for sometime.

We note the most important things on how we should manage the disease. The key is to educate the public on how on they can avoid getting and transmitting the disease. Those who have flu—whether or not the flu is from influenza-A H1N1 have an important role in preventing transmission. Here are the key points.

First, not all of those infected die from the disease. As of 29 May 2009, there are 15,110 of infection from the disease in 53 countries. In the 53 countries, there were 99 deaths in 3 countries (85 in Mexico out of 4,910 cases, 11 in the US, 2 in Canada, and 1 in Costa Rica). Many of those infected were reported to have spontaneously recovered from the disease.

Second, according to health authorities, the disease is not airborne. The use of masks is not generally prescribed except for those who have direct contact with the sick.

Third, health authorities say that transmission of the disease is via tiny droplets from a sneeze or coughs and phlegm from coughs. The droplets can spread through infected hands. Thus, health authorities strongly recommend the frequent disinfection of hands through proper washing and use of disinfectants.

Fourth, while symptoms of associated with flu (fever, colds, cough, sore throat, headaches, and general feeling of being unwell) are something to watch for, not all who got the disease manifested symptoms of fever. 38% of the outpatients display gastrointestinal symptoms: nausea, vomiting, and/or diarrhea.

Fifth, those with flu symptoms have a great responsibility to stay home and impose a self-quarantine—whether or not the flu is a confirmed case of influenza-A H1N1. It is useful to recognize that every flu is a possible case of influenza-A H1N1, provided we do not panic: although this is possible, it is not a probable possibility.

.....Six, if one BELIEVES that what may be ailing him or her is influenza-A H1N1, then he or she must seek medical help. The advise of authorities is to inform the hospital in advance of his or her suspicions prior to getting to the hospital.

Seven, we must follow the advise of health authorities on how we should take care of those with flu at home: 1) Separate the ill person from others, keeping the person at least 1 meter from the others; 2) Cover mouth and nose when caring for the ill; 3) Wash hands with soap and water thorough after each contact with the ill; 4) Improve the air flow where the ill person stays (use doors and windows to take advantage of breezes); and 5) Keep the environment clean with readily available household cleaning agents)

Eight, the healthy must keep themselves healthy: eat nutritious food, enough sleep, exercise, love the sun, and take vitamins that can boost immunity. These are the times when it is neither patriotic nor heroic to overwork oneself or suffer from lack of sleep. If one can afford it, it is useful to have oneself be vaccinated against flu because we exclude ourselves as one possible source of panic.

Nine, we must grasp that in Mexico as well as in the United States, the country with the second highest of fatality from H1N1, almost half of the fatalities have other conditions.

Ten, healthy people should remain careful and never let down their guard. In Mexico, 54% of the fatalities were healthy before they got the disease.

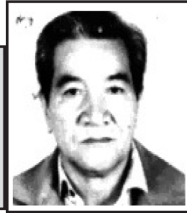
It is a crime, if you ask me, to be paying officers of SCUs with “profit participation” when they are not doing anything anyway to entice students to study in

*The Papal Letter on Sunday
(First of a Series)*

Because the third commandment depends upon the remembrance of God's saving works and because Christians saw the definitive time inaugurated by Christ as a new beginning, they made the first day after the Sabbath a festive day, for that was the day on which the Lord rose from the dead. The Paschal Mystery of Christ is the full revelation of the mystery of the world's origin, the climax of the history of salvation and the anticipation of the eschatological fulfillment of the world... This is why the joy with which God, on humanity's first Sabbath, contemplates all that was created from nothing, is now expressed in the joy with which Christ, on Easter Sunday, appeared to his disciples, bringing the gift of peace and the gift of the Spirit (John 20:19-23). It was in the Paschal Mystery, that humanity and with it the whole creation, 'groaning in birthpangs until now' (Romans 8:22), came to know its new 'exodus' into the freedom of God's children who can cry out with Christ, 'Abba, Father!'

TIMES AND LAWS

Notice how Sunday worship is referred to as the "third commandment." The Bible records the Ten Commandments, written by God's own finger on two tables of stone, in Exodus 20 and Deuteronomy 5. Nowhere in the Ten Commandments does the word "Sunday" appear or the term "first day of the week." Only the fourth commandment explicitly commands us to "remember the Sabbath day to keep it holy" and defines the Sabbath as the "seventh day," not the first. "Six days shalt thou labour, and do all thy work" relegates Sunday to workday status.

Anything we may do that lifts up the spurious to take the place of the true and genuine

Sabbath, is disloyal to God, and we must move very carefully, lest we exalt the decisions of the man of sin. We are not to be found in a neutral position on this matter of so great consequence."

Section 18 proves that Daniel prophesied regarding the Roman papal power, the little horn with eyes and a mouth. This horn would "speak out the saints of the most high, and think to change the times and laws." Daniel 7:25

The pages of history reveal that the papacy is responsible for changing the "times and laws." Specifically, it changed the time of worship and rest from Sabbath to Sunday. Of the Ten Commandments, only the fourth deals with time.

The Roman Church changed the law of God by deleting the second commandment (which prohibits idolatry), changing the order and the message of the Sabbath commandment, and dividing the tenth commandment in two. The Sabbath commandment, actually the fourth commandment, became the "third commandment" in the Roman Church's catechism. The command now reads thus: "Remember to keep holy the Lord's day," as attested by the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

Although the Bible does not specifically number the commandments in Exodus 20 and Deuteronomy 5, the Jews have historically considered the Sabbath as the fourth commandment. Paul says that from the Jews we have inherited the law and thus the proper manner of numbering the commandments.

THE MYSTERY OF INIQUITY

Section 18 also repeats the word "mystery" several times. Worshiping on Sunday is called the "Paschal Mystery," meaning a weekly Easter. John the Apostle warns us that the power symbolized by a harlot riding a beast is obsessed with "mysteries". She even bears "Mystery" as part of her title and dress. "And upon her forehead was a name written, Mystery, Babylon the Great, The Mother of Harlots and Abominations of the Earth." Revelation 17:5. John's description of spiritual Babylon perfectly captures the essence of Roman Catholicism.

When Jerome (A.D. 340-420) translated the New Testa-

ment from Greek into the Latin Vulgate, he used the Latin word "sacramentum" (sacrament) in place of the Greek word "mysterium", meaning mystery (Strong's no. 3466). Thus, Jerome, one of the doctors of the Roman Catholic church, considered sacraments and mysteries as synonyms, having the same meaning.

Roman Catholicism above all other denominations has stressed the seven sacraments, or mysteries. The Catechism of the Catholic Church lists the seven sacraments in the chapter "The Paschal Mystery in the Church's Sacraments" as follows:

1. The baptism of infants
2. Mass, or the recrucifixion of Christ
3. Confession to a priest
4. Absolution by a priest
5. Marriage with the possibility of annulment
6. Ordination of a celibate clergy
7. Extreme unction by praying to Virgin Mary

Other catechisms cite the items and order of the sacraments differently:

1. Baptism (including that of infants)
2. Confirmation or chrismation (conferring the gift of the Holy Spirit or anointing)
3. Eucharist (Holy Communion-the mass, or the recrucifixion of Christ)
4. Penance (remedial works to obtain forgiveness)
5. Anointing of the sick (by praying to the Virgin Mary)
6. Holy orders (ordination of a celibate clergy)
7. Matrimony (with the possibility of annulment)

Each sacrament, either in original form or through subsequent changes over time, is directly opposed to the teaching of Scripture. These seven mysteries, or sacraments, could possibly be the seven names of blasphemies which appear on the seven heads of the beast of Revelation 13:1.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, as well as Dies Domini, further states that the Paschal Mystery is to be celebrated every Sunday. "The mystery of Christ, his Incarnation and Passover, which we celebrate in the Eucharist [Mass] especially at the Sunday assembly, permeates and transfigures the time of each day."

The Apostle Paul, like the Apostle John, foretold the development of Roman Catholicism as part of the "great falling away," or apostasy, of the church. In his letter to the believers in Thessalonica, Paul referred to the coming apostasy as the "mystery of iniquity" and to the papacy as the "man of sin"

"Let no man deceive you by any means: for that day shall not come, except there come a falling away first, and that man of sin be revealed, the son of perdition; who opposeth and exalteth himself above all that is called God, or that is worshipped; so that he as God sitteth in the temple as God, shewing himself that he is God."

"For the mystery of iniquity doth already work; only he who know letteth will let, until he be taken out of the way." II Thessalonians 2:3,4,7.

Even Paul's time, elements were at work to push forward the spirit and teachings of what became Roman Catholicism and the institution of the papacy.

Why did Paul refer to the papacy as the "man of sin"? The apostle did so because that organization would legalize sin-transgression of the law of God by changing the Ten Commandments. The pope would declare that Sunday worship is commanded by God and that Easter Sunday is to be celebrated by all faithful Christians. These two beliefs contradict God's fourth commandment.

Why did Paul refer to Roman Catholicism, born after his time, as the "mystery of iniquity"? He did for two reasons. First, the institution would emphasize the term "mystery" in its theology and liturgy, or ceremonies. Second, Roman Catholic teachings and traditions would promulgate iniquity by replacing God's law with the traditions of men.

"In the phrase 'mystery of iniquity' in II Thessalonians, the greek word 'anomias' (Strong's no. 458) was translated 'iniquity', but the literal rendering is 'lawlessness'-without law, or working against law. Lawlessness is a type of anarchy, a diabolical opposition to the inherent fibers of this universe. Our God is a God of law and order, not lawlessness, and disorder. Is not the papacy's lawlessness, its seeking 'to change the times and the laws,' what Daniel foretold in Daniel 7:25?

of decent standards which the city propagates," the resolution noted.

"Thus there is a need to immediately ban all these sex videos which exhibit lewd and obscene scenes that are unacceptable and against the moral teachings and doctrines."

Tabanda said the law governing the display and sale of these pornographic articles contains a penal provision that can be implemented by lawmen.

The drive against lewd videos is in line with the provisions of the Local Government Code which authorizes local government units to implement measures to improve public morals.

"Thirteen years ago, they were the same politicians who were in mad scramble to have souvenir photos with Onyok when Onyok was invited to the House of Representatives," former House chief of staff Florentino Escudero said. "They are now afraid to come near Onyok probably because they made promises that were never fulfilled."

Some of the alleged unfulfilled promises of politicians who were mostly legislators were a lifetime pension and a house and lot for the Bago City-native Velasco, now 35, who nar-

rowly lost to Bulgarian Daniel Petrov Bojilov in the light flyweight finals.

Velasco for this part admitted his popularity has waned now that Pacquiao has become a global sports icon. Only his former coach, 1976 Montreal Olympics quarterfinalist Reynaldo Fortaleza, gave him special attention during the Pacquiao-Hatton 12-round fisticuff.

Fortaleza said Velasco was among the best amateur boxers ever produced by the Amateur Boxing Association of the Philippines (ABAP) under the tutelage of the Lopez father son, Gemeliano and Manny, who both served as presidents, respectively.

Velasco, whose elder brother Roel earlier copped the bronze medal in the

1992 Barcelona Olympics, was treated as national hero as many government and sports officials in the country believed he was cheated of the gold medal in losing a controversial 19-6 decision.

Due to his frustration over the politicians' empty promises, Velasco rejected an offer to turn professional and became a TV sitcom comedian.

His Olympic batchmate, Floyd Mayweather Jr. of the United States also lost a controversial decision in the featherweight finals to another Bulgarian Serafim Teodorov. Mayweather turned professional and became a world welterweight champion./ By Alex P. Vidal/ PNS

corded a total of 201 incidence of involuntary disappearances, eight of which occurred last year alone.

During the Marcos era, Karapatan also recorded some 759 cases of involuntary disappearances, many of the victims were never found.

Escudero's bill defines the crime of enforced or involuntary disappearance as the arrest, detention, abduction or any other form of deprivation of liberty committed by agents of the State or by persons or groups of persons acting with the authorization, support or acquiescence of the State, followed by a refusal to acknowledge the deprivation of liberty or by concealment of the fate or whereabouts of the disappeared person, which places such person outside the protection of the law.

It provides a maximum penalty the penalty of reclusion perpetua, equivalent to 20 years and one day to 40 years of imprisonment, without prejudice to civil and administrative liabilities.

The bill also says that an "Order of Battle," official or otherwise, issued by the military, police or any law enforcement agency of the government, shall not justify an enforced or involuntary disappearance and shall subject the perpetrators to the same corresponding penalties./Office Of Senator Chiz Escudero

sponsibility to restore the area.

He said that to make sure that the project is implemented properly and equitably, the plan that was prepared by the city building and architecture office has to be followed.

The restoration project is now being readied for bidding to qualified construction contractors.

Affected stallholders were questioning the stall allocation plan as the spaces were accordingly reduced and thus will not be commensurate to what they are paying.

But CBAO head Engr. Oscar Flores said space reduction cannot be avoided as the plan was made based on the original area allotted for said sections.

Extensions made by the vendors themselves have been removed thus the area will now be reduced.

Flores however assured that the spaces allotted to the vendors are of equal size and that the number of stalls in the plan corresponds to the number of legitimate vendors affected by the fire thus nobody will be displaced.

Farinas said the plan as prepared will be followed that the schedule of rental payments will later be adjusted to correspond to the spaces rented.

Mayor Bautista earlier assured that the structures to be built will all be temporary or collapsible so these can be easily dismantled should the full-blown market development project be implemented. in deference to the contract with the Uniwide Sales Realty and Resources Corporation (Uniwide) which had been declared binding by the courts.

Pursuant to the mayor's plan, the city council approved the reallocation of P16.5 million from the Annual Investment Plan for 2008 to finance the restoration project.

Police information officer SPO3 Virgilio Hidalgo said they will also conduct dialogues with schools to guide news students on peace and order concerns.

and social distancing of six feet or two meters upon arrival to observe for signs and symptoms.

She said that with the opening of classes, the advice is especially directed to students, school faculty and staff, local or foreign, who will come home from travel abroad for the opening of classes.

This is to prevent the possible spread of the disease since these travelers especially those from countries with H1N1 cases can be carriers of the disease.

She reiterated that those who would experience while in isolation any symptom such as fever, chills and fatigue; muscle and joint pain; sore throat; headache and body pains; coughing and sneezing; nausea vomiting and diarrhea are advised to immediately seek medical attention while those who would not develop any symptom after the ten-day period will be considered out of danger.

Reyes said continuous surveillance, contact-tracing and massive information drive are being conducted in the city in coordination with the DOH-CAR.

The disease response flow is still in effect with the Baguio General Hospital designated as referral hospital for suspect cases for the city.

The health advisory distributed by the health office said the disease is spread through close personal contact and respiratory secretions propelled by sneezing or coughing.

It stressed that the virus is not transmitted by eating pork.

Residents with symptoms are advised to consult their doctors or go to the nearest health facility immediately and to refrain from self-medicating./aileen p. refuerzo

of numerous members of the working media and that allegedly other members of media would have wanted to file similar complaints against the respondent due to his alleged despotic, arrogant, high handed, and humiliating treatment of members of the working press/media. According to this paper's OIC who had experienced the unfortunate incident of harassment in the hands of the respondent "the Panagbenga Flower festival is for all to be enjoyed and appreciated and therefore there should not be unreasonable rules for coverage that tend to only harass, curtail and subdue members of media while in the performance of their official functions, in fact when even the President of the Philippines or other high government officials come to Baguio City, we the members of media are given enough liberty to take photos and do our related coverage, unlike in the case with the respondent. However, on the contrary, members of media should even be encouraged and assisted by the Baguio Flower Festival Organizers and its staff to be able to come up with substantial coverage at the most convenient and efficient way possible". Mr. Aquino further stated that "in all the years and various coverages I have worked on, it is on very few occasions that I have come across staff member(s) of the organizer(s) of an event who is as arrogant and high handed as the respondent and instead of making our work easier as the case is usually done, but on the contrary no less than the respondent, he being the Chief Of The Staff of the flower festival, was acting like a goon and bully and throwing his weight around without any justification whatsoever on various members of media who were just doing their routine media coverage".

In a related interview with Freddie Farres, the Executive Director of The Linis Gobyerno Inc., an anti graft and corrupt practices NGO-Civil Society Group (an affiliate of this paper) with regards to this unfortunate incident between members of media and Amboy Guevarra, "I hope the media can do a little more investigative jour-

nalism and look more into the detailed activities of the Baguio Flower Festival and not delve so much on what is seen and heard on the surface or the actions of some of its trying hard staff members, whether positive or negative. The bigger picture here is, if the media will recall from recent past events, are the revenues (both declared, undeclared and under the table) that previous administrations have made from organizing and running the activities of the Panagbenga which has been proven to be a huge money earner that had benefited the personal pockets of some officials. This for me is the more important news that the media should report on, and if the media happens to report and hopefully expose what we have seen in the past to be acts of graft and related anomalies, the Linis Gobyerno will not hesitate for one second to file the corresponding complaint(s) against those involved".

The respondent, Mr. Dangal "Amboy" Guevarra who is connected with the Baguio Country Club allegedly as the acting food and beverage manager, could not be reached for comment as of press time./GP Binwagan

indigenous Cultural Communities through the recognition, protection and promotion of the Rights to Ancestral Domains and Lands, Self-governance and Empowerment, Social Justice, Human Rights and Cultural Integrity.

When she became President, Mrs. Arroyo signed Executive Order 1, series of 2001 which institutionalized her meaningful legacy for the indigenous people.

The ancestral domain in Bamban and Mabalacat is within the Clark Freeport Zone.

For more than a decade, there was a conflict between the Aetas and the Clark Development Authority, making the land unproductive.

The Aetas started their struggle when former President Ferdinand Marcos established the Sacobia Development Authority in their area without consulting them. They continued their advocacy when their land was transferred to the CDC.

The NCIP said several mechanisms were instituted to settle the controversy, but all in vain until President Arroyo ordered Agrarian Reform Secretary Nasser Pangandaman to settle the issue.

A Joint Memorandum of Agreement was signed on December 6, 2007 between the CDC and the Aetas.

The document provides for the respect of the ancestral domain rights of IPs and the mandate of the CDC, with sharing of benefits at 80-20 in favor of CDC and priority employment to IPs for locators within their ancestral domain./PIA

Centeno, Baguio City Prosecutor she stated the following "From the evidence submitted by the complainant, it would appear that the crime of Unjust Vexation was committed by the respondent when he uttered the following words *"Putang ina mo ano ba talaga gusto mo mangyari, walang media media sa akin"*, which the respondent uttered just after he tried to

grab the complainant's video camera, and which words unjustly vexed or annoyed the complainant. The incident was witnessed by Romy Gonzales, another member of the media who was covering the Panagbenga Festival proceedings who also submitted his affidavit to bolster this complaint". "Wherefore, premises considered, the undersigned recommends for the prosecution of the crime of UNJUST VEXATION under the attached criminal information."

Other sources had intimated to this writer that respondent Dungal Amboy Guevara had earned the ire

Pacquiao Dwarfs Onyok Velasco's Olympic Stardom

SAN DIEGO, California - Filipino Olympian Manny Pacquiao Jr. joined the Team Pacquiao as guest during "The Battle of the East and West" in Las Vegas, Nevada for two weeks but his presence hardly made any impact compared 13 years ago when he was the toast of Philippine sports for bringing home the silver medal in boxing in the 1996 Atlanta Olympics after 32 years.

ten Onyok and the glory he has brought to the country)," observed another former Filipino Olympian who is now based in Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada.

The Vancouver-based former Olympian said he sensed that nobody was interested to even say hello to the diminutive Velasco who was seen most of the time wandering in the casino hall alone in Mandalay Bay Resort and Casino where Team Pacquiao was billed from April 27 until May 3.

Some Philippine politicians

who came to watch Manny Pacquiao shoot for Ricky Hatton's International Boxing Organization (IBO) light welterweight on May 2 at the MGM Grand reportedly ignored Velasco deliberately as they were all enmeshed on Pacquiao.

PGMA fulfills IP's long cherished dream

President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo awarded certificates of Ancestral Domain Titles (CADTs) to some 798 Aeta and Dumagat families involving 3,526 individuals during her visit to Mabalacat, Pampanga.

The Aetas and Dumagats are among the country's indigenous people (IPs).

The President awarded the CADTs covering 5,648 hectares to the Dumagats of Dibut, Aurora Province, and 10,323 hectares to Aetas of Bamban, Tarlac, and Mabalacat,

Pampanga. "Now you can start developing your land. No one will disrupt you now. If anyone wants to invest in your land, then they have to pay rental," the President said in the Pampango dialect.

"It's a dream come true. We waited for four Presidents to award us the CADTs but only you Madam President made that come true," Anita Manalad, an IP widow told the President.

National Commission on Indigenous People

(NCIP) Commissioner Felicitio Mansagnay said all the CADTs awarded by the President today are "all clean titles."

The awarding of CADTs, a symbol of land security for the IPs, is a commitment of the President even when she was still a senator when she co-authored the Ancestral Domain Bill.

The Senate Bill led to the enactment of R.A. No. 8371, otherwise known as the "Indigenous Peoples Rights Act (IPRA) of 1997."

The law addressed the aspirations of the IPs and the In-
