Section Two Role Playing

➤ Students will be asked to participate in a role-playing exercise. Each scenario will last approximately 5 minutes. All scenarios will be recorded and made available to the students, should they wish to receive them.

1. You come from a close-knit family and have decided to move abroad. Your parents do not support this. Tell them why it's important for you to make this move
2. You come from a more conservative family that does not agree with you dating outside your religion and culture. Talk to your parents about why you believe that this should be your choice
3. You have recently decided to move in with someone but have no plans to get married. Your parents are concerned about this and want to have a discussion with you and your significant other. Meet with them to talk
4. You have finished school, and are thinking about moving out on your own, but due to economic challenges, are also considering staying at home for now to save money. Meet with a friend to talk about the advantages/disadvantages of moving out
5. You have a brother/sister and your parents are getting older. One of you needs to stay close to your parents to take care of them. Talk to your brother/sister about the best way to handle this
6. You are a single parent and have a full-time job. It's been very difficult to raise your child on your own. Talk to a friend about the best way to handle this
7. You will give a brief presentation at a university about the importance of family values. Be prepared to answer questions at the end of your presentation
8. You have a friend that is gay and lives in a country where gay marriage is legal. Your friend and his/her partner are talking about adopting a child. Talk to a close friend about your feelings about this
9. You have decided to become part of the Big Brother organization in the USA, that promotes adult men sponsoring younger boys and providing positive male role models. This will take a lot of your time, and you have a very busy job, but you believe it's important because you were raised by a single mom without your dad around, and you know the impact. Talk to a friend about this decision and why it's so important to you.
