City Seeks Cooperation in ESL Site

BAGUIO CITY – Mayor Mauricio Domogan Wednesday personally met with residents and barangay officials of Apugan, Santo Tomas here to personally talk with affected residents of the proposed site for city's Integrated Solid Waste Management System (ISWMS).

The city seeks to conduct an Identification Survey of the area consisting of 130 hectares which is presently owned by city government but initial attempts of the private surveyor proved unsuccessful due to resistance from some residents.

Domogan explained, "the purpose of the survey is to identify a 50 hectare area as possible site of the ISWMS Facility from the total area covered by the 130 hectares owned by the city Government and to ascertain how many residents are inside the identified lot."

The mayor said the area is alienable and disposable public land.

The case of retired General Jovito Palparan who had recently been arrested on charges of grave human rights abuses against activists is an interesting one. On one hand, here is a highly-decorated officer admired

by his comrades in the Philippine military for his consistent zeal in the battlefield and singular focus on crushing the enemy — the New People's Army (NPA), the terrorist arm of the Communist Party of the Philippines (CPP). On the other hand, he is regarded as the "Butcher" and the *Berdugo* ("executioner") — a man who allegedly oversaw the torture and killing of activists as a means to the ends of his marching orders.

Left without US military assistance, the Philippines is a largely helpless and defenseless nation.

Even in the corporate world, ambitious employees aspire to be seen by their superiors as *the guy who gets shit done*. Corporate culture rewards executives who are able to inspire their staff with glibly militaristic directives like "go over there and kick ass" or, when referring to "issues", to "make it go away". Corporate executives, cubicle warriors are incessantly told, don't want to hear *excuses*, only *results*.

Interestingly, this sort of prevalent corporate culture models itself on the typical military organisation. Military command is arguably the most efficient results-oriented approach to organising people. When a military organisation fails, people die. Lots of people. Thus, military organisations have evolved over the centuries into what they are today — no-nonsense organisations whose mission is to kill *and* survive while doing that.

Similarly when corporations fail, people lose their jobs and economies take hits in their growth targets. More importantly, executives don't get their bonuses and get chewed out by their wives for failing to bring home the diamonds. And that is why corporations, taking on board the wisdom of management consulting firms, have adopted the ethos of military organisations and sport teams — so they could tap the primal impulses of their young guns to *deliver results*. To the bottom line, in this case.

Most corporate types will attest to the effectiveness with which corporations are able to "motivate" them to nail the sale and *kill the competition*. So effective and systematically-applied is this "motivation" that generations of brilliantly-small-

BENECO Assures Steady Electricity Supply

BAGUIO CITY - With the looming power crisis in the country, the Benguet Electric Cooperative (BENECO) assured that scheduled power interruptions in Baguio and Benguet are for maintenance works only and that its existing power supply agreement with Team Energy ensure steady supply of electricity for its consumers.

BENECO Corporate Legal Counsel Atty. Delmar Cariño bared this in an energy distribution seminar for media practitioners and campus journalists at the Hotel Supreme here on Monday.

Cariño explained that should there be unscheduled blackouts, it is due to power distribution or the entire Luzon Power Grid would be lacking in power supply compared to the total demand.

BENECO Engineering

Department Manager Melchor Licoben affirmed that their existing contracts with their supplier is in accordance with the Electric Power Industry Reform Act or EPIRA and ensure 24/7 (24 hours a day and seven days a week) supply of electricity.

He explained two conditions in which BENECO will fail to supply electricity - if the transmission lines fail to deliver and when there is a technical constraint on the power distribution system such as there is a shortage in supply compared to the demand or there will be a tripping in the system that will affect the Luzon Grid.

Meantime, in sharing the Power Situation Outlook (July 31, 2014) of the National Grid Corpora-

COA Bares P229.6-M DAP Milk Feeding Scam

The Commission on Audit (COA) has uncovered numerous irregularities in the implementation of a P229.6-million milk feeding program under the Disbursement Acceleration Program (DAP) that benefitted 46 congressmen who supported the impeachment of former Supreme Court Chief Justice Renato Corona in 2011.

COA, in its 2013 annual audit report for the National Dairy Authority (NDA), disclosed that Malacanang released the P229.6-million funding for the project on Dec. 22, 2011, exactly 10 days after the House of Representatives impeached Corona.

Among the 46 House members who implemented the milk feeding project were representatives of the ACT Party-list and Gabriela Party-list groups who are currently supporting the impeachment of President Aquino on account of his approval of the DAP, basic components of which were declared unconstitutional by the Supreme Court.

COA auditors said the government issued the Special Allotment Release Order (SARO) and the Notice of Cash Allocation in the amount of P229.6 million on Dec. 22, 2011 to finance the milk feeding program of 46 legislators.

"Records showed that the 46 proponents were endorsed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives to the DBM for fund allocation," the state audit agency reported.

The program, entitled "The Community/School Milk Feeding Program," called for the distribution of 200 ml pack of pasteurized/sterilized choco flavored milk to every pregnant or lactating mother, elderly citizen and pupil in early learning classes in areas identified by the congressmen.

In its audit of the program, COA ordered the NDA to return the unutilized funds to the Bureau of Treasury as ordered by the Supreme Court.

The auditors were referring to the remainder of P80 million that the NDA failed to spend for the project.

"The DAP is a stimulus package designed to fast-track public spending and push economic growth," the state auditors stressed.

COA doubted that all 6,684,644 packs of milk that were procured for P87 million "were completely delivered" as audit examiners noted discrepancies in the specimen signatures of representatives of lawmakers authorized to receive the supply to those of signatures affixed in documents claiming receipt of the milk packs.

"We recommended the conduct of initial investigation into differing signatures of recipients of deliveries," COA said.

According to the audit report, several disbursement vouchers lacked supporting documents for payment. Among these are disbursement for supplies delivered to the second district of Cavite, Kalinga, Cavite, San Juan, third district of Quezon City, first district of Maguindanao, Act Teachers, General Santos City, second district of Cotabato, and first district of Misamis Occidental.

"Review of supporting documents in Misamis Occidental revealed that milk feeding was shortened from 120 to 60 days since delivery was doubled in quantity without first amending the Memorandum of Agreement," COA said.

The audit examiners said the NDA may have violated the law for getting their milk supplies from sources, other than small farmers. They said no public bidding was also conducted.

Auditors referred to the milk feeding projects implemented by congressmen who represented the 1st District of Bataan; 1st District of Antipolo; Butil, Gabriela, 6th district of Cavite; Kalinga and Lone District of Aklan.

Reacting to the audit observation, NDA explained that no cooperative or local processor of fresh milk would have passed the rigid requirements for public bidding in Aklan.

Auditors noted that the P1.624-million worth of milk was purchased from the daughter of the proponent legislator in Aklan. /MB News

Police Center Established to Protect Mt. Pulag

KABAYAN, Benguet - The establishment of a Community Police Assistance Center (COMPAC) in barangay Bashoy, this town, is seen to help in the protection of Mt. Pulag from illegal loggers and encroachers.

Governor Nestor Fongwan led the turnover of the COMPAC in sitio Babadak along barangay Bashoy to the Philippine National Police on Tuesday, August 19.

According to Fongwan, this is not really a big project but the purpose is big. It will not only be for the security and safety of the commu-

nity and tourists but will help the preservation of the environment particularly Mt. Pulag, a favorite trekking destination endowed with rich biodiversity.

Mt. Pulag, the highest mountain in Luzon straddling Kabayan, Bokod and Buguias in Benguet and parts of Ifugao, is designated as a national park. It is home to some rare and endangered species of flora like the dwarf bamboo, and fauna such as the cloud rat and serpent eagle. But there are destructions due to agricultural land conversion coupled with logging operations on

Pnoy Asked to Reconsider Decision on South Drive Barangay Hall Site

BAGUIO CITY - The city council last Monday appealed to President Benigno Aquino III to reconsider his decision practically ceding a lot occupied by the South Drive barangay hall to a private individual.

The President in a decision dated July 14, 2014 on OP Case No. 11-8-057, affirmed in toto the decision of then Dept. of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) Secretary Jose Atienza Jr. issued in 2004 which denied the appeal filed by the South Drive barangay officials against Alonzo Lumacas over the lot where the barangay hall is located.

The barangay officials filed the appeal to retain the lot occupied by their barangay hall for the need of the locality pursuant to Resolution No. 172-87 and the City Land Needs Identification Committee report dated Sept. 6, 1989 identifying said lot for city or barangay need.

In Resolution No. 216 series of 2014, the city council asked the President to reconsider the decision to protect the interest of the city, more particularly South Drive Barangay and its constituents.

"It is a clear-cut policy that public interest is sovereign over any private interest. In Baguio, parcels of public lands have been reserved for city/ barangay needs to be used for the various land needs of the city as well as the different barangays in furtherance of delivery of better service to the public. It is also an established policy that public lands within the City of Baguio that have been reserved by the City Government of Baguio for public purpose as city/ barangay needs shall be respected by the DENR," the body noted.

The council committee on lands lamented that the interest of the barangay over the subject lot was jeopardized when the DENR-CAR, "in wanton disregard of City Resolution No. 172-87 as well as the provisions of DENR Administrative Order No. 01 series of 1990, blatantly gave due course to the protest lodged by Petitioner Lumacas and ordered that the claim of the barangay be dismissed/dropped from the records for lack of merit."

DOST Pushes for MSME Competitiveness for ASEAN Integration

BAGUIO CITY - The Department of Science and Technology (DOST) continues to work in boosting competitiveness of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs) here in Cordillera in preparation for ASEAN Integration 2015 where there will be free movement of goods, services, skilled workers, investment and capital among ASEAN member countries.

DOST - CAR Assistant Regional Director for Technical Services Dr. Nancy Bantog, in a kapihan media forum on Tuesday, disclosed that their department has been investing on technology transfer and commercialization program through the help of their attached research and technology institutes.

For one, DOST has the SETUP or Small Enterprise Technology Upgrading Program wherein technology transfer assistance such as equipment, facility or production process upgrading are given to MSMEs to boost their products or services.

This second quarter of 2014 alone, DOST's SETUP provided around P12.31 million worth of assistance to 28 MSMEs in the different parts of Cordillera. Bantog also reported that DOST will intensify implementation of packaging and labelling assistance program.

To complement the Technology Transfer and Commercialization Program, DOST also provides technical consultancy services for MSMEs as well as those investing on agriculture or farming.

For the first semester of 2014, DOST-CAR has awarded free consultancy services to 30 clusters of farm beneficiaries in the region under the Consultancy on Agricultural Productivity Enhancement (CAPE) program as well as to 30 MSMEs under the Manufacturing Productivity Extension (MPLEX) program.

This third quarter, DOST - CAR targets to provide assistance to 10 more clusters of coffee farms in Apayao and 10 firms on metals in Ifugao under the CAPE and MPLEX programs, respectively.

Bantog encouraged MSMEs and those in farming to avail of their programs. They can visit the DOST Regional Office at Km.6, La Trinidad, Benguet or any DOST Provincial S&T office in their locality. /JDP/CCD - PIA CAR

"If this is now the direction of the DENR in treating similar cases pending before their office as well as future cases of similar nature, then the sacred and vital role of the City Government of Baguio in the acceptance, recommendation and approval of TSA's will not only be compromised but considered futile as well."

Dads Back Bid to Increase Elementary School Districts in City

BAGUIO CITY - The city council last Monday supported the proposed increase of elementary school districts in the city from three to six as endorsed by the city schools division and local school board.

In a resolution proposed by the council committee on education chaired by Councilor Peter Fianza, the body considered the result of the feasibility study on the need to add more districts submitted by acting schools superintendent Francis Cesar Bringas and administrative officer Augustine Laban III which showed that increasing the number of districts would benefit 45 public elementary schools, their school heads, teachers and pupils.

Bringas strongly proposed for the increase and this was supplemented by the Local School Board which approved Board Resolution No. 4 series of 2014 unanimously approving the recommendation.

Among the reasons cited was "that the increase in the number of districts is to decrease the number of public elementary schools in each district to make them more manageable in terms of supervision and administration of instruction."

The resolution said that education regional directors may establish additional school districts within a schools division upon the recommendation of the division superintendents based on section 7 paragraph D of Republic Act No. 9155 or the Governance of basic Education Act of 2001 and section 5.2 of its implementing rules./ A Refuerzo

Amnesia Antidote

"National amnesia causes us to forget who and what we are." Is that the fix we're in when the country marks, this Thursday, the 31st anniversary of Sen. Benigno Aquino Jr.'s airport tarmac murder?

The most concise summary of that assassination is perhaps found in the tape recorder of then Time magazine's Sandra Burton. She propped it against a window of China Airlines Flight 811 jet, when it parked at what is today's Ninoy Aquino International Airport.

Three soldiers escort Aquino out. The tape catches the gangway exchange. "Eto na, eto na! Ako na, ako na! Pusila, pusila (This is it, this is it! Let me, let me! Shoot, shoot)!" Gunfire erupts and Ninoy's bloodied body crumples on the tarmac.

"What happened?" a woman passenger screams, Burton's tape continues. More gunshots. The wailing becomes louder. "Inside, inside, inside!" several men scream.

"The soldiers... shot Ninoy. He's dead out there," the woman cries out. "They shot Ninoy?" asks a passenger. Burton: "Yeah." Man: "Where?" Burton: "Right at the bottom of the stairs." Man: "When Ninoy was still on it or when?" Burton: "No, when he got off. I'm sure he's dead."

Man: "What did you see? Who did it?" Burton: "Soldiers." Man: "How many of them?" Burton: "I don't know. I think we'd better wait." Man: "Did you recognize Aquino?" Burton: "Yeah."

Man: "What's your name?" Burton: "No, I'm not gonna... this is not the place to talk. We had just seen two assassinations take place right outside our window."

As Time bureau chief, Burton flew with those covering Ninoy Aquino. She was later called to testify at the Agrava Fact-Finding Board and she turned her tape over to prosecutors.

Then Justice Manuel Pamaran acquitted all respondents, including

Marcos' ally, AFP chief of staff Gen. Fabian Ver.

After People Power, the Supreme Court ordered a retrial. Constable Rogelio Moreno (tagged by the Sandiganbayan as the one who shot Aquino) and 15 others were convicted. But the mastermind(s) were never held to account until now.

Burton was 62 when she died in Bali in May 2004. "She was a female rarity in the sometimes aggressively gung-ho masculine world of foreign correspondents: courteous, fair-minded and intellectually honest," Philip Bowring wrote then in the South China Morning Post.

These traits stood Burton in good stead when she led Time's Beijing bureau during the drama of Tiananmen Square and the horrors of the June 4 killing. "She was never a combat journalist, but when firing began around Tiananmen she showed resolve to stay and find the facts."

The journalist-to-the-bone is also seen in the work she did, as Time bureau chief in Hong Kong, from 1990 through the wrenching handover of the British colony in March 1997.

In the Philippines, "everyone got a little carried away by the euphoria of the 'People Power' revolution against Ferdinand Marcos." But she did not let it divert her from covering Philippine events as dispassionately as circumstances allowed.

Her search for hard facts anchored sources for her 483-page book "The Impossible Dream." Published by Warner Books, it is one of the more, if not the most accurate—and spellbinding—accounts of the Philippines' turmoil of the 1980s.

Burton had intimate access to the Aquinos and Marcoses, during the crucial four years when their roles reversed to recast society, wrote journalist Stanley Karnow in his book "In Our Image" (Random House). Her insights do not portray "the Marcoses as unredeemable villains or the Aquinos as sinless saints."

"For the first time, I could imagine what the Filipino voters, who had elected him twice and then tolerated his takeover, must have seen in him," Burton writes of her first meeting with Marcos in September 1983 at Malacañang. "He was the kind of lawyer you would hire to get you off if you were really in trouble—particularly if you were guilty. He was the kind of maverick you would elect president when you deemed the system to be beyond the power of conventional leaders and remedies to repair."

Imelda is trounced in the Burton reports as an insatiably grasping woman who fabricated her family history, then scrambled to make it reality.

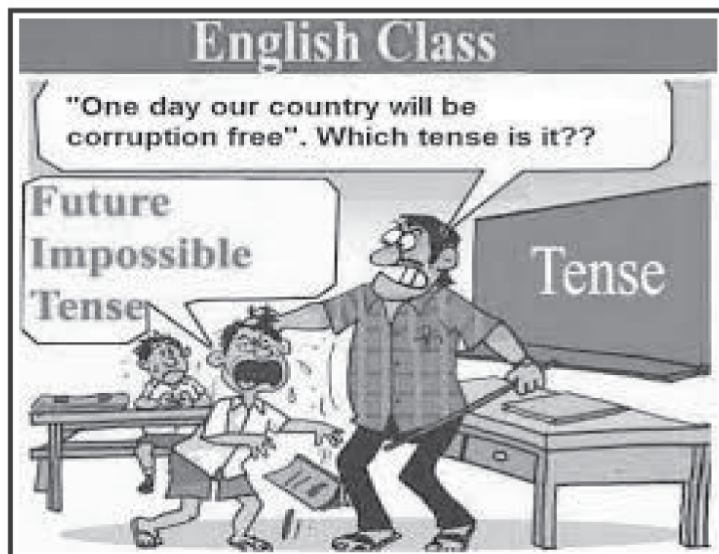
She recalls a night-long interview with Imelda: "People said awful things.... But they were describing a rational woman, full of malice aforethought. The woman I was listening to could not be judged by normal standards. She was manic. Mad, perhaps. Touches of brilliance and insight here and there. But how was one to judge them in this tidal wave, this glut of diagrams, equations and pop geostrategy?"

Burton reports the transformation of Corazon Aquino from a self-effacing housewife into the quiet, determined president. Her friendship with the bereaved widow "enabled her to witness the change and to hear from Cory herself how it came about." She takes readers from the moment Cory returns to the Philippines, overseeing her husband's funeral, to the day she spends 10 hours in a Carmelite convent, meditating whether to run for president.

The courage of Cory Aquino comes through, and so do her "weaknesses." Burton describes a world leader who takes time out to watch "Dallas" and "Falcon Crest," but who never makes important decisions—no matter how urgent—without pausing to pray.

Journalists are often regarded as abrasive. Skepticism is a necessary tool of a good journalist, Bowring wrote. Like idealism, it can easily turn into cynicism at the sight, up-close, of dishonesty, avarice and vacuousness of celebrities.

The 17-year-old Manila Times correspondent who covered the Korean war, Benigno "Ninoy" Aquino Jr., would have agreed. The 31st anniversary of Ninoy's murder also shows Journalism 101 can provide an antidote to national amnesia./Juan L. Mercado/E-mail:juanlmercado@gmail.com

PIA, DENR Hold Luzon-Wide Conference on Climate Change

BAGUIO CITY – The Philippine Information Agency in partnership with the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR) conducted a Luzon-wide conference on Climate Change Advocacy campaign at the Forest View Leisure Residences, Subic Bay Freeport Zone last week.

With the theme "Nagbabago na ang Panahon, Panahon na Para Magbago", the conference on "Knowing the Hazards and Communicating Climate Change Adaptation and Mitigation Measures" was participated in by government information officers, members of the tri-media and representatives from the local government units of regions 1, 2, 3, Cordillera Administrative Region and National Capital Region.

The participants were welcomed by Chairman and Administrator of Subic Bay Metropolitan Authority (SBMA) Roberto Garcia.

The conference was opened by Presidential Communications Operations Office Secretary Sonny Coloma who mentioned some notable disasters happened in the country and some mitigation to be done.

Resource speakers include Climate Change Commissioner Naderev Sano of the Climate Change Commission who talked about the science and impacts of Climate Change; Mines and Geosciences Bureau's Senior Science Research Specialist Mariane Eve Ordonez discussed the various hazards caused by geological or hydrometeorological factors; Capacities and Responses discussed by the Consultant of Department of Public Order and Safety Disaster Control Division, Quezon City PSSupt. Jesse Sto. Domingo; and the Chief Medical Professional Staff and Health Emergency Service Coordinator of Baguio General Hospital and Medical Center Dr. Manuel Quirino;

The President of Population Health (PH) Network of Environmental Journalists, Inc. Imelda Abano also engaged the participants to consistently communicate climate change adaptation and mitigation. She mentioned some difficulties media are encountering in communicating CC such as lack of training or little background, reporting takes a backseat, lack of space or resources for covering.

PIA Director General Jose Mari Oquinena capped the first day of the conference with encouraging words about being a Filipino by saying that every Filipino has what it takes to move forward; to inform people and inspire them to be somebody whom they believe they are not. He said organizations need a chief inspiration officer.

Other speakers include Renato U. Solidum of the Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology who discussed local geologic and hydro meteorological hazards and warning system; and Allan Capulong, the Chief Executive Officer of Research and Technology Lab, who talked about adapting to media climate change. He stressed the importance of adapting new media and infotainment innovations that uses info graphics in order to catch everyone's attention.

The second day of the conference was highlighted by an eco-walk by the participants to the El Kabayo Falls, a part of the Freeport Zone's forest. The participants planted tree saplings along the way and left the forest pledging to visit the trees that they planted./MAWC – PIA CAR

NCCA Urges Communities, Elders to Help Pass on Traditional Arts to Younger Generation

BAGUIO CITY - Safeguarding of cultures and traditional arts by passing on from one generation to another is among the thrusts of the National Commission for Culture and the Arts (NCCA).

NCCA sub-commission on Cultural Communities and Traditional Arts sector head Renee Talavera, in a media forum here, affirmed that even in this modern time, traditional culture and arts are very much safeguarded and alive especially in the North.

Benguet, he said, is the most active in safeguarding culture and arts particularly of the Ibaloi and Kankana-ey. There are already more than 10 Schools of Living Tradition established in the different parts of the province.

NCCA provides support for the establishment of School of Living Traditions wherein a living master or culture bearer/specialist teaches skills and techniques of doing a traditional art or craft.

With the rich and diversified culture of the country, Talavera pointed out the need to exert more efforts and for the communities, civil society groups, local government units and barangay officials to also help in safeguarding traditional arts and crafts.

"This is really a challenge for us as the masters of art are getting

older. We hope that they are willing and still have the physical capability not only to pass the knowledge but to train new masters, as once the master dies the culture will also die", Talavera stressed.

She encouraged local communities, civic organizations like performing groups and women's groups, LGUS and even barangay units to help in safeguarding the traditional arts in their locality as NCCA is ready to provide the support given that there are local groups that would initiate the project.

Talavera, along with NCCA Public Affairs Office Head Rene Napeñas and Committee on Dance member Rebecca Nulud sat as panelists in the forum held at the Veniz Hotel here to promote NCCA's call for project proposals for the Commission's competitive grants 2015.

Napeñas disclosed that they have P300 million budget for next year, with P95M set to fund qualified proposals in line with the defined priority projects of the 19 national committees of NCCA.

Deadline for the submission of competitive project proposals will be on August 31. Proposals must capture the aspiration of the arts and culture community as depicted in NCCA's 21st century vision of "Filipino culture as the wellspring

of national and global wellbeing". Aside from the forum, NCCA also spearheaded a pro-

This was pointed-out by Anak TV Secretary-general Mag Cruz Hatol, in his interactive talk during the Responsible TV seminar conducted in partnership with PTV4 at the University of the Cordilleras here last week.

Hatol said Anak TV was created through the initiatives of local all TV networks bonding together to look into responsible TV programming. They look on how the people view local TV programs and personalities so that adjustments can be made to make programming more responsive and have positive effect to the viewing public.

"We visit schools and barangays. We go from town to town, province to province for TV literacy and education campaign. We consult parents as well as young people like you, to get feedback about your views on TV programs and TV personalities", he said.

Hatol explained that watching television is more than just a past time as people can also get information. There are good and bad so not all programs are advisable to watch especially to children, which is why there is a need to look carefully on the possible effects of each TV program or show to the young.

Thus he reiterated the importance of TV literacy and media (broadcast and social media) education since in this era of modern technology, media can be a big influence.

During the Anak TV seminar, Hatol engaged the participants in answering survey questions revolving around the challenges that now confront Filipino parents in the face of media, the messages television programs convey; who are the TV personalities who can be role models for children/young adults and on who give negative impact to the same viewers.

Anak TV also engaged the participants to judge pre-determined programs as to which do they think is the most family-friendly and child-sensitive. Winners from the collated votes from the provincial visits will be adjudged with the Anak TV Seal by the end of the year./JDP/CCD - PIA CAR

On the other hand, a number of stall owners at the Slaughter flea market are operating without the necessary business permits. Thus, mayor Domogan directed the BCMA to give notices to the concerned stall owners to secure their business permits at City Hall.

The city is expecting Php394,479.18 collections from delinquent stall owners at the said flea market.

The city government was only authorized to administer the operation of the slaughterhouse, thus, Domogan appealed to the stall occupants to pay their rentals.

Since you've been using the area, it is just fair to pay your obligations to the city," added the mayor./Jho Arranz

Diana De Guzman was single-handedly rearing her two daughters Giandra Kyle, 11 and Phomela Kyra, 10 through her P300 daily earning as a barbecue vendor at Purok 9 Bakakeng Norte but in 2010 she was diagnosed with obstructive uropathy and other complications which sidelined her from her livelihood forcing her to totally depend on her father for her and her children's daily subsistence.

The family made do with the old man's meager pension which was barely enough for their food, school needs of his grandchildren and Diana's maintenance medicines. And now that Diana's

minded university-educated career folk have sacrificed health, family, friends, and spouses at the altar of corporate success.

What does this have to do with Jovito "the (alleged) Butcher" Palparan?

Well, everything. Many of us can never know what soldiers go through in the battlefield. The "enemy" to a typical soldier is a mere abstraction, more a *target to kill* than the human being it usually is. It is the same whatever end of a gun barrel one might happen to be situated. When you are behind it, finger twitching on the trigger, the *other* guy is a *kill* that must happen. When you are on the other end being shot at, the other guy is a *bogey* that you desperately *also* need to kill. If your man on the ground is in the habit of launching into existential debates in his head everytime he is faced with a kill-or-be-killed situation, well, you really wouldn't want that sort of soldier in your team. And that is why that kind of mental habit is systematically beaten out of the average cadet in basic training.

In short, soldiers are trained to *kill* on orders.

Make no illusions about what military training is all about. It is all geared towards training killers and getting them to work well amongst fellow trained killers to form a *collective* that works *cohesively* to crush the enemy. So there is really no mystery behind why Filipino soldiers continue to admire Palparan and why their gentryfied "officers" are under pressure to order them to keep that sentiment to themselves — because civilians will *never* understand what soldiers go through.

People will balk at that simple but confronting truth. Soldiers, the average emo civilian will insist, are "defenders". Of course they are. Japan's Imperial Army is now known as its "Defense Force" precisely to pander to that sentiment. But that doesn't change what its soldiers are. And by no means should that sort of peace time sentiment change the Filipino soldier either. Because to be able to defend a territory and keep its citizens happily tapping on their iPads while sipping their lattes at the local Starbucks, there are enemies to *kill*.

If you find yourself in a dark street corner with a shadowy figure coming at you with a knife, you'd ideally want a big black shiny attack dog on your side — not a yip-yip lap dog. You'd want that shadowy figure sprawled on the ground with that dog's jaws clamped around his neck *first* before you come around to the task of figuring out who he was and what he planned to do to you.

Jovito Palparan was that attack dog. Did he take his mission to crush Filipino communists seriously? By all accounts he did. Did the means with which he sought to fulfill that mission justify that end? That is what is *debatable* today. What position you take in that debate will, of course, depend on what side of the kill equation you happen to be in./ by Benigno/Benigno is the Webmaster of GetRealPhilippines.com.

tion of the Philippines (NGCP), Cariño reported that Luzon has an available capacity of 8,505 megawatts(MW) and with the existing peak (load/demand) of 7,280 MW, there is still a gross reserve of 1,225 MW. Visayas and Mindanao have already posted negative reserves as power (peak) demand in both regions are already bigger than the available capacity.

Despite the available reserve, Cariño shared that NGCP foresees six months of tight power situation wherein with the increasing demand and with committed power projects still to be finished, power reserves will play from 1,604 MW to as low as 230 MW.

As the energy sector is currently working to address the power situation concern of the country, Cariño stressed that electricity consumers can also help in power management by conserving energy during peak hours (usually within the working day – Monday to Friday and between 8am to 5pm) or to move energy use to off-peak time (night time and weekends).

Also tackled during the seminar include power generation and transmission, a briefer on the BENECO's electricity bill and an overview on how the electricity is being delivered from the electric coop's sub-stations down to the consumers./JDP/CCD – PIA CAR

lic land reserved for City Land Needs which is also part and parcel of the land bought by the De Guia's which they donated to the city government.

"We are conducting the initial site survey in order to know how many people will be affected and if we can segregate a 50 hectare area for the planned waste facility," he said.

The site for the ISWMS will still undergo clearance from the Environmental Management Bureau (EMB) of the Department of Environment and Natural Resources (DENR).

Domogan said, "after the conduct of the perimeter identification survey, the city will have to continuously conduct dialogues with barangay officials and residents in the area."

"We are very open to settlement with those who will be affected but they should understand that we cannot do that unless we conduct the initial site survey," he said.

Domogan said the survey is only the initial stages of the identification for the planned establishment of the waste facility that will include a waste-to-energy plant, a central materials recovery facility, health care waste treatment plant, an engineered sanitary landfill if needed.

"Barangay officials and residents will be part in all aspects of the project and we will sit down with them to settle issues and concerns," Domogan said.

He said the Environmental Recycling System (ERS) which the city acquired in 2010 to process biodegradable wastes into compost fertilizer will be a component part of the ISWMS.

As of the moment, the current rate of wastes generated daily already reaches 366 tons with an average daily collection of 194 tons.

This comprise 30 tons of bio-degradable waste, 214 tons of recyclable wastes while the remaining residual waste which covers at least 122 tons is hauled-out to an Engineered Sanitary Landfill in Uraneta City.

Domogan said, "the integrated system will aggressively address this concern as the working system in the USA which they visited can process a minimum of 200 tons per day."

"The manufacturer can adjust how many tons can be processed in a day depending on our needs," Domogan said. /paul rillorta

and my daughter and Head Executive Assistant, **Ning** had a well written prepared prayer text for me to read. At the strike of 10 a.m., all cabinet secretaries, including the President were already on their feet with bowed heads and eyes closed ready for my prayer. For one reason or another, I could not find the text from my folder. I was frantic coz I had not done, ever, impromptu prayers before, unlike many I know who had memorized by heart the usual incantations. So, I had to improvise on the spot. I went by instinct uttering

light-hearted words as they spontaneously came. I started off by asking God to forgive my forgetfulness in losing my copy, "perhaps this can be due to my age"; then I recall saying some words of welcome for the assumption of "ageing" Senate President Johnny Enrile, that he was already so old for that position and if God could help him out, or words to that effect. Then I asked for God's blessings for birthday celebrant Sec. Art Yap but wished and prayed that he would serve "lechon baka" over lunch (a relief from the usual meager sandwiches during cabinet meetings). I went on like this and I was already noticing some of my colleagues like Sec. Bebot Bello raising their bowed heads and trying to suppress laughter. Finally, I came to the end part. And this was where I got into trouble. I recall fervently saying: "And finally Lord, we pray that our President be given the good health, wisdom and fortitude to serve this country until 2010" (Ahem, I paused...) then I remember adding naughtily.. "and perhaps beyond" (and seeing GMA already negatively reacting), I hurriedly added my planned final punch line: "in her private and personal capacity", although this was less audible due to the chatter of reactions. But hell hath broken loose by then. The cameras were whirling and clicking and recording for posterity something that was later called as a clear admission by no less the president's own alter-ego and spokesman, that "aha" there were indeed plans of serving "beyond 2010". Of course, that took national center stage because at that precise time, we in Malacanang were trying hard to deny or downplay speculations that GMA had sinister plans of staying in office for another term by amending the Constitution. The cabinet was abuzz and amused. But not GMA. Instinctively, she told me to go talk to the camera men and ask them to keep the whole episode "off the record" and not air their film clips. Of course, I knew this was a valuable scoop and no medianman would agree.

NO INTENTIONS — Sure enough, within less than an hour, the airplanes were choking with the news. Some blared: **THE CAT IS OUT OF THE BAG ; PALACE CAUGHT RED-HANDED; PRESIDENT'S MAN ADMITS CHACHA PLANS**, etc.. Still trying to downplay and explain my seeming "pauz pas" and somehow to assuage an angry "Boss", I invited the President to listen to a re-play of the video where I could be heard saying in the end, although less audible due to the chatter of reactions, the phrase "in her private or personal capacity" which would preclude intentions of my imploring divine intervention for her staying beyond her official term. No matter the explanation however, that did me in. Worse, when I listened to the news that same evening in my house while licking my wounds, some TV channels either did not run the whole tape or had spliced my ending punch line that would have lightened my misery. Nonetheless. The president was so angry that she did not speak to me for sometime. I remember one well-

meaning colleague in the cabinet asking me later about talks that I would resign. I felt though that dismounting at the height of the controversy would hurt the presidency more.

COUNTING MY DAYS — Truth to tell, from the time that prayer was said, I was myself starting to count my own days in Malacanang. I abandoned my natural self of being self-confident, loose, informal, at times irreverent. I was already cautious. The presidency had so much troubles to attend to at that time and here I was, whose job was to precisely help protect, explain and cushion things, unnecessarily starting another bush fire, at the expense of the presidency. That was in November 2008. Three months later, in February 2009, I voluntarily resigned, although primarily because of my wife Beth's developing health issues at that time. Env'tl Code Summit on Sept. 12

BAGUIO CITY - Results of the two-day environmental code brainstorming attended by city officials, constituents and concerned citizens shall be presented during the summit on Sept. 12 at city hall.

Accordingly, there was a clamor for a more in-depth information and education campaign for the provisions of the code, specially in the barangay level. The request for the IEC however is not limited to the city, as admittedly, the city shares water and airshed with the adjoining Benguet municipalities; namely the La Trinidad, Itogon, Sablan, Tuba and Tublay.

The environmental code, as proposed by the Committee on Health and Sanitation, Ecology and Environmental Protection, headed by Councilor Fred Bagbagen, dealt with issues on pollution of land, air, water and water resources, biosolids, ecological solid waste management and urban ecosystems.

The preservation of Baguio's pine forests and species, climate change, disaster risk reduction, noise pollution, renewable energy sources and alternative technology, global and local environment events, ecotourism management, community and stakeholders were among the issues discussed.

There were however exemptions to the provisions; including activities sanctioned by the city government.

Fees for the use of several resources, buildings and areas is embodied in the proposed code.

Committees, task forces and technical working groups assigned as to resources monitoring and preservation were also created in the code.

Health issues, as to the no smoking ordinance in public places were discussed.

As to solid waste matters, there were specifications as to residential, commercial, market, industrial, agricultural areas.

Queries were fielded as to legalities on penalties imposed on violators of the code; or whether it would be the barangay or city to implement the code, if approved.

Sources and use of funds were also questioned, which would form part of the discussion on Sept. 12.

The public hearings were conducted August 13 and 20 at the Sangguniang Panlungsod hall./juliegfianza
