Herman Bavinck: Earthly marriage images the heavenly, and serves to prepare for this heavenly marriage; for the ultimate goal of history is that a humanity may emerge of which Christ is the Head and in which God is all in all (Eph. 5: 32). Marriage is therefore not a Christian institution in the sense that it owes its origin and its arrangement to Christianity.

Beth Felker Jones: One of the strangest things about Christian sexual ethics—if you were an ancient Roman—was the idea that we are all free. Our bodies aren't for the state anymore. Our bodies aren't for the big men with the power. They're not for the porn industry or the beauty industry. Our bodies are for the Lord. We're free to witness and to love. Free to marry or not marry, to have babies or to not have babies, because the future of the world depends on Jesus, not on the size of the Roman army.

Family: A Creational Good
