The Birth of Christmas

Has it ever struck your attention that there was a time when the Church did not celebrate Christmas and wasn't even concerned about the date that Jesus was born?



It's true. In fact, it was the fourth century before the Church got around to celebrating Christmas at all. Before Christmas there was a church season that ran from November 11th (the feast day of St. Martin) to January 6th (Epiphany, which is a feast day celebrating Christ's manifestation to us Gentiles). This season was a "Winter Lent." It was forty days (from November 11 to January 6) of prayer, fasting, penitence and self-denial in preparation for baptisms that would take place on Epiphany.

Then in 336 the Roman Emperor Constantine (the first Christian Roman Emperor) declared that Jesus' birth would be celebrated on December 25th. There are a few theories about why that date was selected. It seems to me the most logical is to have a big event to counter-balance the pagan observance of the winter solstice. Then in 350 Pope Julius declared that the birth of Christ would be observed on December 25th. And that is how we got Christmas. By the sixth century the Church had begun to reorganize its calendar for the celebration of Christmas; the season of Winter Lent was shortened to four weeks and the season was called Advent which means "the coming."

During the Advent season we are to "prepare the way of the Lord" and "make straight his path." A major part of this preparation, according to John the Baptist, is repentance. The clearest picture of repentance that I know is to picture a person walking on the wrong side of the road. They may be walking on the side of anger, resentment, greed, dishonesty, etc. Suddenly (or not so suddenly) they turn around and begin walking on the correct side of the road. Now they are walking in the path of forgiveness, generosity, letting resentments go and a new way of life.

Maybe this is not as exciting as "decking the halls" or singing our favorite Christmas songs but it is essential if we are to participate in the real meaning of Christmas. So while you are enjoying all the festivities of the holiday season at least daily slow down and notice what God is doing in your life. In so doing you and I receive with open and ready hearts the real meaning of Christmas – the Christ Child.

- We are currently looking into needed work on the Bell Tower including repairing the eaves, replacing the ladder, inspecting the bell and repainting the cross on the front of the tower.
- A motion was approved regarding our monthly outreach offering. Going forward we will alternate the recipient of our monthly outreach collection (first Sunday of the month) between Long Beach Outreach one month and then Rebekah's House the next.
