

Role Playing

Participants will participate in the scenarios taking on the role assigned in them in order to improve their speaking and comprehension skills

1. You are visiting a new country and have no idea about what to eat so you find someone that can give you some tips on local dishes you might try
2. You have decided to apply for a visa to travel but have not decided on what country to visit yet. Go have lunch with a friend and discuss with them the types of things you like to do, and see if they can give you some ideas about the best country to visit based on your interest
3. Your friend has decided to start a new career, but his/her educational background is different than his/her interest. He/she wants to meet with you to find some alternatives to get the training necessary for this new career
4. Your brother/sister has decided they want to move out of your family's home, but you know that this will have a hard impact on your parents. Talk to your brother or sister about the pros and cons of moving out and getting their own place
