The Origins of Easter

In recent Pastor's Corners I have discussed how the Church was slow in incorporating Advent, Christmas and Lent into its calendar. The same is true of Easter. That seems astonishing since Easter is the biggest proclamation of the Christian faith. So, here is the story in brief.



The introduction of Easter Sunday seems to have been nonexistent until around AD 135. When it did appear as a day it was not in Rome or Western Europe, it began in Palestine. It likely occurred to the early Church to make a separation between the Jewish celebration of Passover and Easter to make Easter something that was distinctly Christian. Around AD 155 the Church leader Father Polycarp went to Rome in part to persuade the Bishop of Rome, not yet the Pope, not to switch Passover to Easter Sunday. It should be no surprise that early Christians celebrated Passover since many early Christians were Jewish. What is interesting is that over time those who claimed to keep the Passover on Sunday switched it to a resurrection holiday, commonly called Easter.

In AD 325 the Council of Nicæa (remember we declare our faith by using the Nicene Creed on the first Sunday of every month) ruled that Easter Sunday would be celebrated on the Sunday immediately following the full moon which came after the vernal equinox. For this reason Easter is a moveable feast day in the Church occurring anywhere from March 22 to April 25 every year.

How we got the name Easter is unclear but interesting theories abound. One of these theories is that Easter is derived from Eostre, a Teutonic goddess of spring and fertility. This would also account for the early Church's need to baptize spring fertility celebrations making the spring season a Christian event.

What we know for sure is that Easter is an entire season in the Christian church year; it is not a single day observance. The Lenten season is the 40 days minus Sundays leading up to Easter. The week preceding Easter is called Holy Week and includes Maundy Thursday which commemorates Jesus' last supper with his disciples. Maundy is an Anglo French word meaning commandment. This is when Jesus

gave the new command, "to love one another even as I have loved you." Good Friday honors the day of Jesus's crucifixion, and Holy Saturday focuses on the transition from death to resurrection. Then we have Easter Sunday and following that Eastertide which includes Jesus's ascension into heaven.

Why all of this? As Protestants we tend to not see the big picture and the beauty of the whole season like the drama of radical hospitality on Maundy Thursday where Jesus feeds even his betrayer, the crucifixion reminding us that suffering is the cost of love and death the price of living, and the resurrection where we remember that just when we think all is lost, hope comes leaving the tomb empty.

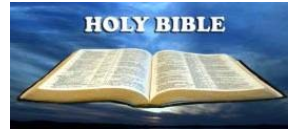

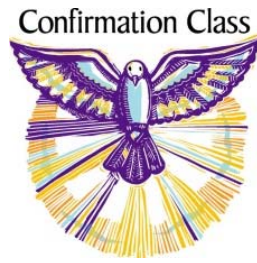

- In February we collected a total of \$488.15 for our Outreach offering which was divided between Long Beach Outreach, Rebekah's House, and the Women's Circle Homeless Outreach project.
- Ken Pell is back in Memorial Hospital. Please pray for him and his family.
- We have signed the lease with Kelly Corbin, a photographer who operates as Madd Hatter Photography. Kelly will be using Room 10 as a studio for her business.
- The Christian Education Committee reported that new Sunday School materials have been ordered for the Youth Sunday School Class. They are also looking into the possibility of sponsoring an "outside" activity for the young people in our congregation.
- The decision was made to re-key the exterior doors to the church and fellowship hall since we had no idea how many keys were out there. New keys will be given out on an as-needed basis and must be signed for.
- On February 8th we discovered a blocked sewer line serving the rear part of the building. A section of the terracotta sewer line had to be removed and was replaced with new PVC pipe. The total cost was \$1,149.71.
- We are starting to notice several small new roof leaks around the building and a few existing leaks that are growing. The Property Committee is looking into our possible options for repair.
- The church mission statement was updated and set to: "Reaching up to God, Reaching out to others."
- The next Stated Session meeting will be on Sunday March 18, 2018.
