Cayetano to House: Restore Filipino People's Faith in Government - Pass FOI Bill

Let us pass the FOI bill now! Para matakot ang mga kurakot!"

Senate Majority Leader Alan Peter "Companero" S. Cayetano strongly and respectfully urged his colleagues in the House of Representatives to follow the lead of the Senate and respond to the Filipino public's clamor for the immediate enactment into law of the Freedom of Information (FOI) bill.

"The House, the Senate, and Malacanang should be partners in promoting transparency in the country. Enacting the FOI measure into law is a good first step in regaining the people's trust in the three branches of the government," Cayetano noted.

Cayetano said now that the Senate has passed FOI measure for the third time, the last two instances in less than a year, it is now up to the lower house

Lawmaker Urges Political Parties to Sign Pledge vs. Corrupt Members

Senate Majority Leader Alan Peter "Companero" S. Cayetano is urging all political parties to assure the Filipino people that they will prioritize justice over patronage politics by publicly pledging to expel members involved in corruption scandals.

Cayetano said his call is similar to what election watchdogs demand from candidates during elections, which is to refrain from engaging in fraud and violence. In this case, he is asking political parties to sign an anti-corruption covenant against corrupt partymates.

"Bakit hindi tayo pwedeng magkaroon ng pirmahan na kahit kapartido, hahabulin niyo kapag may anomalya. Kapag hindi katanggap-

tanggap ang sagot nila, aalisin natin sa partido," the senator said.

Cayetano said in the US, those involved in scandals either resign or are removed from the political party even before any declaration of guilt from the courts.

"Pero sa atin, huling-huli na, pagtatakan pa ng kasama. Kaya ang justice system natin, pag guilty ka, pagtatakan ka. Kaya sa atin, ang last layer ng protection ay eleksyon. Pag nanalo kakampi mo, absuelto ka. Yun ang gusto kong alisin," he explained.

Cayetano again challenged Vice President Jejomar Binay to issue a strong statement against his allies implicated in the P10-billion pork barrel scam or

at least ask them to explain their innocence to the Filipino people.

"Kung private citizen ka, pwede mo sabihin na sa korte na lang magpapaliwanag. Pero kung ikaw ay public official, kailangan mong harapin ang sambayanan. Utang mo sa tao na sumagot ka sa tao. Kapag hindi ka sumagot, dapat kang parusahan ng partido mo," Cayetano said.

Binay's previous statements on the pork barrel probe of the Department of Justice (DOJ) have raised fears among state witnesses that if he wins in the 2016 elections, the case will not be pursued. / *Office of Senator Alan Peter Cayetano*

Grace Binay-an, a 23-year old former Sangguniang Kabataan chair of Irian Barangay here who has been on dialysis for five years now.

Mayor Urges Mines View Vendors to Utilize Multi-Purpose Building

BAGUIO CITY - The request of Mines View vendors occupying the multi purpose building to be allowed to go back and sell at the Mines View Park was denied by the Baguio City Market Authority (BCMA). This was revealed by Mayor Mauricio Domogan during his weekly forum last Wednesday.

The city stands firm to

make use of the Mines View multi purpose building to serve its purpose for the vendors.

"We understand the apprehensions of the vendors of a declined profit, but I hope the vendors will cooperate with the city," said the mayor.

With regards the concern of the vendors of introducing repairs of the

door of the multi purpose building, mayor Domogan directed the City Buildings and Architecture Office to immediately look into the possibility of changing the door in such a way that it should be exposed to the people at Mines View.

"We (city) have to help the vendors entice the public to utilize the multi-purpose building," he added. / *Jho Arranz*

Vehicular Accident Victim Seeks Help

A victim of a vehicular accident has appealed for fund support from Samaritans to sustain his medication and settle what he owed that enabled him to pay his hospital bills amounting to about P500,000.

The appeal was made by Peter Manganip, a 35-year old maintenance man at the Benguet State University who is still recuperating from injuries he sustained when the motorcycle he was driving was dragged by a passenger jeepney last Feb. 4 along Lower Magsaysay Avenue here.

In his report, police Supt. Evelio Degay, chief of the traffic management unit of the city police, said

from the PCSO branch established at the Post Office Loop here, another was also opened at the municipal hall in Bontoc, Mt. Province, "specifically to address the needs of patients from Baguio City and nearby areas and the Cordillera Administrative Region, respectively".

The Sanggunian resolution authored by city councilor Peter Fianza pointed out that as per the PCSO website, the Cordillera and the Autonomous Region of Muslim Mindanao did not have a single district or regional office to serve patients within the said regions.

Following the decentralization of PCSO services, patients from the Cordillera who used to line up for fund support at the PCSO main office in Quezon City had to go down to the branch office in Urdaneta, Pangasinan which is basically for patients in Region 1. / *Ramon Dacawi*

Manganip was on his way to La Trinidad, Benguet when "the left side of the motorcycle allegedly hooked into the right rear railing of (a) jitney that dragged him, together with his motorcycle in a distance of more or less twenty feet..."

The jeepney driver, identified as Edward Cupido, 37, brought his vehicle to a halt when he noticed the workers of a tire shop shouting and pointing to the motorcycle behind being dragged, the police report said.

"When the jitney slowed down to stop, the motorcycle was detached from the said jitney then fell down in front of the rear right tire (of the jeepney)." As a result, the motorcycle rider's head was ran over by the jitney.

The jeepney driver and some passengers rushed the victim to the Pines City Doctors Hospital where he was con-

fined and operated on. The diagnosis of the attending physician was "traumatic brain injury, epidural hemorrhage, temporarily with massive brain edema, pneumocephalus, pneumothorax, multiple rib fracture, left posterior, with pulmonary contusion".

To be able to raise funds for his recovery, Manganip's wife, Karen, obtained a city permit to solicit support and asked that her appeal be published in the local papers so Samaritans can respond.

Manganip has been discharged from the hospital but does not recall when he was released from confinement.

Women's Group: Stop Blaming VAW Victims

BAGUIO CITY - A recent report by the Baguio City Police Office Women and Children Protection unit shows an increase in the number of reported cases of violence against women in Baguio. From 2012's 363 recorded cases, the number rose to 403.

Panelists at a recent press forum on the celebration of Women's Month agreed that the increase in the number of recorded cases hints at a raised awareness of women and their rights against violence and abuse.

But other than women raising their awareness for their rights, Save Our Women, Inc. Founder and

Executive Director Patricia Gallardo believes that men and women in general should also be aware of the stigma caused by victim blaming. Gallardo said there is a need to conduct forums which educate people about violence against women.

Victim blaming occurs when a victim of a crime or any wrongful act is held responsible for the wrong done against them and the trauma they feel because of it. It often occurs in cases of rape or domestic violence.

Gallardo cited rape victim being blamed where a woman in skimpy clothing is asking to be a

PCSO Restores Fund Assistance to BGHMC Patients

To the deep relief of kidney patients at the Baguio General Hospital and Medical Center, the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office here has resumed processing of applications for fund support from those undergoing treatment at the top regional health facility here.

The branch office staff headed by Dr. Ernieli Dancel worked out the resumption of the issuance of fund support, through guarantee letters, to BGHMC patients in coordination with the PCSO main office in Quezon City, given the urgent need of close to 200 undergoing twice or thrice-a-week hemodialysis treatment at the regional hospital.

Processing was suspended in the last quarter of last year pending sub-

mission of reports from the hospital on previous grants and setting in place of an endowment fund for the BGHMC. PCSO officials earlier explained in response to a letter from city mayor Mauricio Domogan on behalf of about 180 kidney patients being served by BGHMC.

In his letter, the mayor noted that the BHMC draws the most number of dialysis patients among health facilities hereabouts including those coming from Region 1, because it charges the lowest rate of P2,200 per treatment session.

"The PCSO-Baguio branch has been approving an average of five applications for fund support a day for BGHMC patients since it resumed processing our requests," noted Mary

CAAP Shoots Down Bid to Rehabilitate Loakan Airport

BAGUIO CITY – The Civil Aviation Authority of the Philippines (CAAP) under director-general William Hotchkiss III has turned down the city's proposal for the complete rehabilitation of the Loakan Airport saying it is no longer feasible to operate as a commercial airfield.

This was gathered from Councilor Elmer Datuin who joined the CAAP meeting on the airport held last Wednesday at the CAAP office in Manila also attended by Rep. Nicasio Aliping Jr. and officials of key line agencies in the region.

Datuin said they were told that Loakan airport can not serve anymore as a commercial airport because it is no longer financially viable to operate.

"Based on a pilot's point of view, it will be very hard to invite interested airline companies to include the airport in their regular flight routes as it will not be financially viable. The principal complaints in the

airport are air safety due to the precarious terrain and the continued presence of clouds in the route to the city posing danger to commercial planes during inclement weather and late afternoons," Datuin related.

Another point to consider, according to Datuin, was the lack of airline franchise to operate routes from Manila as the slots have been filled. He said the franchises available cover the routes from Sangley Point in Cavite and Clark International Airport in Pampanga.

"So even if we proceed with the rehabilitation of the airport, it will still be the airline companies who will have the final say if it can be operated as a commercial airport but as they said it will be hard to convince one as they don't like to take the risk because of Baguio's air route conditions and they now have many choices in the routes to serve," Datuin said.

He said CAAP thinks the airport can better serve now as an aviation airfield hosting only ordinary aircrafts and emergency and military planes.

The city government and the Regional Development Council (RDC) last year appealed to the CAAP and the Department of Transportation and Communication (DOTC) to modernize the airport facilities to boost the tourism industry in the region.

Mayor Mauricio Domogan said the estimated cost for the fencing and the establishment of an alternate route was P115 million and this was taken up recently with Senator Ramon Revilla Jr. who he said committed to convince the Senate committee in charge to help the city government raise the needed funds for the project.

Datuin said the airport needs a total of P375 million for the complete modernization including the upgrading of the navigational equipment and construction of a new terminal. */A Refuerzo*

Mayor to Nerez: What's Done is Done but Fulfill Your Promise

BAGUIO CITY – Mayor Mauricio Domogan on Wednesday said he is counting on Police Regional Office Cordillera (PRO-COR) acting regional director Chief Supt. Isagani Nerez to fulfill his commitment to follow the legal procedure in the selection of the next full-fledged city police director.

"What's done is done. (City police director Jesus Jr.) Cambay has been replaced. In the end, we still have to support one another. To us, we can work with anybody and now the PRO-COR committed 101 percent support to our

city. I just hope that they will comply with their commitment to follow the rules in the selection of the next police chief," the mayor told his Ugnayang Panlungsod press briefing.

The mayor said he is counting on Nerez' commitment despite the improbability of completing the process in time for the lapse of the 30-day tenure given to police heads who assume their post in an acting capacity.

Sr. Supt. Rolando Miranda, who replaced former city police director

Jesus Cambay Jr. assumed directorship of the city police in an acting capacity effective last March 5.

"They committed to follow the procedure particularly to submit a list of five nominees for us to choose from. The nominees will be screened from Camp Crame and I don't know when that can be done. I doubt they can do it within 30 days and that is now the problem," the mayor lamented.

Despite the issues, the mayor again welcomed Miranda during the department heads' meeting last Monday reiterating that his displeasure was not directed on Miranda's person but on the manner the turn-over of the police leadership was done.

Nerez appeared before the city council last Monday and explained Cambay's pull-out despite the opposition from city government and other sectors.

He said Cambay's relief was purely management pre-

City to Pursue Demolition of Busol Illegal Structures

BAGUIO CITY – With the legal barriers cleared, the city government can now pursue the demolition of illegal structures at the Busol watershed.

Mayor Mauricio Domogan on Wednesday said he will convene the City Anti-squatting Committee and the Busol Forest Reservation Task Force to discuss the plan of action to pursue the dismantling of the illegal structures in the watershed.

"Our direction is to pursue the demolition and we will act in accordance with this direction now that we see no legal impediments in implementing this long-delayed program to clear out watershed of squatters," the mayor

told his Ugnayang Panlungsod media briefing.

The mayor said the city in coordination with the Baguio Regreening Movement and the Busol task force will also pursue the fencing of the watershed perimeter to guard it against further intrusion.

The project was revived upon clearing of the court case that barred it in 2002 and upon the pledge of the Baguio Water District to put up P3-4 million for the fencing.

The mayor said a survey of the watershed perimeter is being conducted preparatory to the construction of the fence.

The mayor said that based on the monitoring and data gathered, no

additional structures have been built within the watershed.

In 2009 during the administration of former mayor Reinaldo Bautista Jr., the city anti-squatting team then headed by former city administrator (now councilor) Peter Fianza recorded around 900 illegal structures in the watershed, some of which are large houses reaching even three floors.

A total of 33 structures located in three sections of the watershed were set for demolition in July, 2009 but the operation was not totally carried out when National Commission on Indigenous Peoples Cordillera (NCIP-CAR) hearing officer Brain Masweng issued a temporary restraining order and the writ of preliminary injunction.

However in a Feb. 19, 2014 decision, the Supreme Court lifted Masweng's order and cited the hearing officer for contempt.

"Respondent's (Masweng's) willful disregard and defiance of this Court's ruling on a matter submitted for the second time before his office cannot be countenanced. By acting in opposition to this Court's authority and disregarding its final determination of the legal issue before him, respondent failed in his duty not to impede the due administration of justice and consistently adhere to existing laws and principles as interpreted in the decisions of the Court," the court said. */A Refuerzo*

'Perfect storm'?

"Filipinos share one common item in our everyday existence: rice," National Scientist Gelia Castillo wrote in her book on a cereal that makes or breaks presidents. "Rice In Our Life" reviewed three decades of studies into rice that was sown between 6,000 BC and 400 AD, in the Philippines—from Ifugao to Lucena.

Rice self-sufficiency has been an upward moving target, "always out of reach, even as we calculate we are only three percent short," she wrote. "Seared deep in the psyche of Filipino politicians are crises when we could not find rice, even if we had the money to buy it."

Unseasonal storms, meanwhile, ripped up the old rice calculus. Tropical Storm "Sendong" tore into Cagayan de Oro and Iligan in 2011, leaving 1,080 corpses. Typhoon "Pablo" later clobbered Compostela Valley and Davao Oriental.

This shattered the historical pattern of one typhoon cutting through Mindanao's breadbasket every 18 years. Then, the Bohol earthquake in October and Supertyphoon "Yolanda" in November last year savaged farms.

"Only 97 percent sufficiency was attainable for 2013," the Department of Agriculture conceded. National Food Authority opened the applications for imports—for use and as buffer stock. Ayaw magsaligan ring tian, sa ana't ibang taegsan, an Aklan proverb says. "Don't count on someone else's rice bin for what you eat."

The immediate, however, can blur the long-term threats. The number of crop species that now feed more people than half a century ago is shrinking. Rice, wheat, sugar and potatoes form a new "globalized diet."

"Over the past 50 years, diets around the world have become more similar," notes Colombia-based International Center for Tropical Agriculture's Colin Khoury. Today's diet includes staples that were not important half a century ago, particularly oil crops like soybean.

Other crops however declined, including sweet potatoes, cassava, yams and millets. "This narrowing base raises concerns about the global food system's resilience."

Another danger is, "a more homogeneous global food basket makes agriculture more vulnerable to drought, insect pests and diseases," Luigi Guarino, from Global Crop Diversity, told BBC's environment reporter Mark Kinver. Diversity of cultivated crops, in fact, declined by 75% during the 20th century, UN Food and Agriculture Organization estimates. If this slide persists, "a third of today's diversity could disappear by 2050."

Seepage of crop diversity also jacks up the number of people exposed to harvest failures. And climate change compounds the risk.

"Warmer temperatures are causing malaria to spread to higher altitudes and once disease-free regions in Asia, South America and Africa," says the Science journal. "A one-degree Celsius rise in temperature could lead to an additional three million cases" in a year, cautions University of Michigan's Mercedes Pascual.

The Philippines targets nationwide malaria elimination by 2020. But it still lacks a long-term domestic program even as international funding dwindles.

"A perfect storm of growing populations, climate change and diminishing resources for food production" confronts the world, warns the new "Foresight Report on Food and Farming Futures." Commissioned by the U.K., the 2-year study involved 400 experts from 35 countries.

Do "we have 20 years to arguably deliver 40 percent more food; 30 percent more fresh water and double energy output?" asks UK's chief scientific adviser, Sir John Beddington. "The current system must be radically redesigned to produce more food sustainably. We can't wait..."

"There is an urgency in taking what may be very difficult policy decisions," he adds. "The food system is working for the better-off... But those at risk of hunger have least influence on decision-making." The UK recommends that the most resource-intensive types of food be curbed. Waste in food production has to be radically curbed.

Yearly, the Philippines loses a million metric tons of already-harvested rice for various reasons—from slipshod processing to shabby storage. Cabbage spoilage mars a third of harvests, UP Los Baños studies found. Fish losses crest at 40 percent.

Consumers in rich countries junk as much food as sub-Saharan Africa produces. Wasting food is "stealing from the tables of the poor," Pope Francis told a UN World Environment Day audience, noting that a culture of waste is despicable when many suffer from hunger. "Our grandparents were very careful not to throw leftover food."

"Our so-called food surpluses are a mirage."

Controversy Over Healing Priest, Fr. Suarez

I was reading with interest the series of articles (at the Philippine Daily Inquirer) about the popular healing priest, Fr. Suarez. It seemed the spreading myth surrounding his healing powers, including raising the dead back to life, is now being questioned. This all came about because of the issue about money. San Miguel Corporation is already taking back the 33-hectare land donation in Cavite for a proposed Mother Mary shrine that, after 5-years, never got off the ground while millions allegedly had poured in to him and his foundation. He is even described now as a "changed man". There are unsavory reports about his "profligacy" as a man of God like joining big-time tournaments as a golfer. Nowadays, he is not known only as an avid tennis player. He was even touted as the big-time financial sponsor of a big Tennis Open recently.

In fairness to Fr. Suarez, his side must first be heard before we conclude against him. He is still abroad in a pilgrimage and it is best that we await his story. But he must not just wave away this negative story about him with nonchalance.

He should not only generally say that "truth and God are on my side". He must explain. Otherwise the stories will stick. And this could be the start of his public nose-dive just like the many others before him. His followers deserve hearing from him.

"Gifted" persons with some "extraordinary powers" like healing, specially those belonging to the religious sector are a special breed of sorts. Usually they are ostracized by the mainstream Church. Parish priests usually secretly view them unkindly, not so much because they tend to get more than the pittance the parish church alms box gets — which they definitely do. More so because they are unconventional or unorthodox and they somehow tend to promote, knowingly or unknowingly, hysteria, superstition, fanaticism and the like. The Church is not too keen to immediately recognize those "supernatural" occurrences or "miracles" because it has very strict procedures for verifications and validations before it acknowledges them officially. That is not to say that the Church refuses to recognize them at all. In fact it rejoices at God's manifestations on humankind, especially on ordinary folks. It is just that it does not easily give its "imprimatur" unless certain church protocols are observed. Those so-called "gifted" persons must be careful, discerning and sensitive. If they belong to a religious order, like priests, they must observe the rules and not act as if they have a world of their own. Otherwise, they have to unsaddle from their religious congregations and go on their own way. As a matter of fact, this was precisely what happened to Fr. Suarez in his early years with a congregation in Canada. I was told he was expelled from his "order" while in Canada and came back home to the Philippines and set up his own congregation. He is still under the wings of the Catholic church because he was able to get away with it by getting himself a "protector bishop" to give him legitimacy under the church rules. (Should the church authorities also look into this aspect of being "protector bishop"?)

What is worrisome is that some bishops, who are known to be strict on their own clergy, somehow tolerate or at the least, are hesitant to make a big fuss about those "gifted" but non-compliant, "visiting" religious healers. Take the simple case of getting the local bishop's permission before holding a mass. Usually, these are not complied with. And bishops usually just remain quiet. My guess is that because those healers have generated tremendous following, a bishop is a bit careful to do a little squeak that may turn off fanatical parishioners. Also, a discerning bishop may just be being careful lest he be unduly

BFP Plans Another Fire Sub-Station

BAGUIO CITY – the Bureau of Fire Protection (BFP) Monday revealed plans of constructing another fire sub-station in this mountain resort.

This comes as a way for the BFP to shorten the response time for its personnel to respond in case of fire incidents.

F/Insp. Mary Grace Mang-osan said, "the BFP has plans of putting-up the third sub-station in the city which will be located at Barangay Gibraltar here."

The BFP currently has 2 sub-stations located in Barangay Irisan and Aurora Hill and a main station located near City Hall.

With limited personnel, the BFP seeks to shorten the time element in responding to fires and minimize damage to property and loss of life.

The bureau presently has 79 personnel composed of 5 commissioned officers, 71 non-commissioned officers and 3 non-uniformed personnel (NUP).

According to Mang-osan, at least 31 fire incidents have been acted upon in the first quarter of this year alone with 8 structural fires, 18 forest fires, 2 vehicular fires and 1 electrical fire and 2 other fires causing over P940K in damages.

The BFP has also intensified its campaign in advocating fire safety starting in residential homes and strengthened barangay and school based partnership thru fire safety trainings, seminars and first aid.

Other programs of the bureau include inspection of business establishments with 2,329 inspected, review of building plans and issuance of fire safety inspection certificates now reaching 2,378 with collections of P444,313.00 as fire code fees and two times a month flushing of the city public market among others./paul rillorta

CEPMO urges hog raisers to use alternative technology to prevent water pollution

BAGUIO CITY - The City Environment and Parks Management Office (CEPMO) thru Wastewater, Waters and Ambient Air Management Division (WAMD) is encouraging adoption of alternative technology to protect the city's inland waterways.

One of the problems among residents in the City is the lack of discipline wherein they throw solid waste in the creeks. Some households along the waterways also connect sewage into the water bodies.

The waste water that converge at the city's water ways drains into the

Balili River greatly affecting the quality of water.

In efforts to address the problems of water pollution, City Environment and Parks Management Officer Cordelia Lacsamana said they are promoting particularly to hog raisers in the city to apply vermicomposting and use portable biogas digester technology for pig manure.

The CEPMO through the help of the Baguio Vermi Growers, recently conducted actual demonstration of vermicomposting to the first batch of hog raisers this year at barangay Sanitary Camp.

BCDA Tells CJHDEVCO: Pay Baguio City's Share of P850-M

The state-owned Bases Conversion and Development Authority (BCDA) challenged the Sobrepeña-led Camp John Hay Development Corporation (CJHDevCo) to pay Baguio City its share of P850-M from the P3.4-B lease payment arrears CJHDevCo owes the BCDA.

"We challenge the CJHDevCo to pay Baguio City its long overdue share of P850-M so that the Baguio local government can use the money to improve its services to the people," BCDA President Arnel Paciano D. Casanova said.

Casanova said what is important is for the P850-M Baguio City share to be translated into improved services and more development for the people of Baguio.

"For every single day that CJHDevCo has not given the share of Baguio City, the people of Baguio are deprived of better classrooms, better roads, and better health services, and more," he said.

Casanova said that it is about time for the people of Baguio to realize the seriousness of what they are being deprived of by the Sobrepeña-led CJHDevCo.

Casanova's challenge came on the heels of the statement of CJHDevCo executive vice president and chief operating officer Alfredo Yñiguez challenging BCDA to account to the City all rental payments made for the lease of the former US recreation camp.

Said Casanova: "BCDA has nothing to hide. We can account for every centavo of Baguio City's share."

The "walang plastikan" in Lamut was launched on November 1, 2013 in compliance to Municipal Ordinance no. 03-2012, otherwise known as the Comprehensive and Integrated Solid Waste Management Program.

It prohibits business establishments and/or individuals from using, selling and providing plastic bags to customers as packaging material for dry goods and as secondary packaging materials on wet goods and the use of styrofoam as containers.

The program targets to reduce the volume of plastic waste that is harmful to the environment. A violator is issued a citation ticket and is required to pay the corresponding penalty for his violation.

First offense is a fine not to exceed P500.00 and/or community service for four hours; second offense - P1,000.00 and/or community service for eight hours and for the third offense, fine of P1,500.00 or render community service of 36 hours along environmental concerns. For third offenses committed by industrial, commercial and agricultural establishments, the penalty shall be P3,000.00./JDP/MBL-PIA CAR, Ifugao

CJHDevCo is just meddling the real issue by coming up with petty stories to side track and divert the attention from the real issue.

Casanova said the real issue is that CJHDevCo has accumulated lease payment arrears to the tune of a staggering P3.4-B, of which, 25 percent or P850-M belongs to the people of Baguio "Perhaps it's CJHDevCo strategy to come up with petty issues to divert the attention on them but I don't think it will work as the truth will always prevail," he said.

He said Baguio City is very fortunate to have for the first time a champion in Baguio Rep. Nicasio Aliping Jr. who has made it his personal crusade to collect the P850-M for the people of Baguio.

Casanova also urged the people of Baguio to join the BCDA in making the group of CJHDevCo Chairman and CEO Robert John Sobrepeña accountable and give what is due the people of Baguio. "It is about time that the people of Baguio rally behind Congressman Aliping and the BCDA in making CJHDevCo accountable and give Baguio City its P850-M share," he said.

to do its part and pass the landmark bill that will empower the fight against graft and corruption.

"Aminin na natin na mahalaga na maibalik ang pagtitiwala ng mga tao sa gobyerno. Magagawa natin ito kung maipapasa natin ang mahahalagang batas katulad ng FOI bill. "But now reality has changed this optimism into exigency as numerous scandals already threaten to destroy the people's trust in government that the administration has been trying to rebuild," he said.

"In a time when our citizenry is already so sick of corruption, abuse of power, and deception, we need to pass a measure that would ensure our people of a government that is truly for the people," Cayetano stressed.

With an FOI law in place, Cayetano assured that every Filipino would have the capacity to be "a graft-buster, a reformist, and a crucial building block of an empowered citizenry united in aiming for national development." /Office of Senator Alan Peter Cayetano

and unfairly accused of just whining because local parishioners dig into their pockets only for loose change during Sunday mass collection time while they give bulging cash envelopes "pabaon" to those visiting healers.

Consider also those so-called "handlers." (They are derisively also called "dicers" for obvious reasons.) They are the close-in aides of the healer who generate donations by whispering to well-to-do followers about this or that project that needs support while the healer appears to remain coy. Of course, they are most often the culprits in short-circuiting local bishopry rules when they do "advance party" work. They are over solicitous and over protective of their "ward". Some are haughty, like that fly feeling big upon alighting on the carabao. They even provide the "human shield" and cordone off their "boss" from the crowd whenever necessary, to the consternation of the eager believer who just wants to touch or stay close hoping perhaps for some magical results.

In our day and age of problems, poverty and want, many of our people who are desperate, destitute, hopeless, seeking deliverance or waiting for miracles to happen or those who are just naive and gullible, usually end up being fascinated and awed at some supernatural "happenings" like healing of the sick. Rumors, especially about "miracles" move fast and we swallow them. But are we to blame?

One late afternoon in Davao City, my wife Beth and I squeezed ourselves with an overflowing crowd at Maa Church just to hear a healing mass with Fr. Suarez. Traffic in the diversion road was usually light but not that day. Hours before Fr. Suarez' convoy arrived with host Mayor Rody

Duterte personally escorting him, thousands of Dabawenyos were already waiting. Traffic was paralyzed. He was literally mobbed wherever he went that police escorts had to be fielded to control the crowd. All the ailing, the sick and the "hopeless" — including just the curious — were there hoping for the best. Of course, I was told the well-heeled ones had reserved front row seats courtesy of some friends or contacts on the organizers side. You know, the usual courtesies.

When I was a young barrio boy in the south, I knew of certain healers ("mananambal" or "arbularyo") who allegedly cured almost any ailment — including painless extraction of a decayed tooth, dentists then being rare. They were known for refusing to receive money or cash to the adulation of all. Unable to control a fever, my mother one time brought me to a "hilot" who used coconut oil, with a little of his saliva to spike. I saw donations in kind were accepted on the ground floor and quickly hauled into a room. When I went to the "palengke" in the afternoon, I spotted the same bundles of rice or bagful of fish offerings, the live chicken and pig in the market stalls being sold for conversion to cash! I lost faith on my favorite "mananambal" after that.

Healers must be extra careful about money matters. It can cause their downfall. Let's all admit this. A grateful person of means who may have benefited from his healing powers will definitely hand over some cash or issue a check to support his project, unsolicited or not. I was told of a Davaoeno businessman who suddenly regained his lost ability to write and move his arms after a healing session with Fr. Suarez. And you guessed it. His first act to show that he could already write was to write a check payable to Fr. Suarez. I am not surprised to learn that aides or "handlers" would invariably mention to some avid believers and followers, especially the rich, about some projects of the priest that needed some help.

How much of that given amount is personal and how much of it goes to the foundation he represents must be reckoned internally by his group or foundation whose officials are usually noted names known for their integrity and circumspection. Of course we heard Cardinal Tagle saying that he left Fr. Suarez' foundation but he was not too clear about his reasons although there were nuancings about his not being happy with what was going on inside. How Fr. Suarez (and this must include all others similarly situated) handles those funds as donations for worthy projects must be dealt with accordingly with transparency or sensitivity. Otherwise, accusations about money matters that are now surfacing will be inevitable.

Fr. Suarez himself now needs some healing of his own. He needs to mend his ways and practices. Failing in this, it will be a sad day if he becomes the total opposite of how he is regarded today: from a well-loved healer to a pariah — an outcast or one despised. Let's all pray for him that he will overcome all this in God's own time. For all we know, he may indeed be God's gift to mankind.

Establishments who do not give who vio-

and P1,500.00 for the third offense.

The ordinance is to strengthen the imple-
mentation of R.A. 9257 or an Act granting ad-
ditional benefits and privileges to senior citi-
zens as they play an important role in nation
building.

As per reports, the ordinance needs

amendment to include the grant of 20%
discount to seniors who avail of pay park-
ing in government owned properties and
