Introduction to Heaven

To win heaven, the mind must become heavenly; and to be heavenly, it must habituate itself to heavenly things and heavenly pursuits. — Octavius Winslow

Ever since he who is our head ascended to heaven, it is befitting in us to withdraw our affections from the earth, and with our whole soul aspire to heaven. — John Calvin

Heaven can only be known from the Bible. (1 Cor 2:6-13)

Heaven defined:

- 1. The sky (Matt 8:20)
- 2. Space (Heb 11:12)
- 3. A metonymy of God Himself (Luke 15:21)
- 4. ***The essential and immediate dwelling place of God and the *eternal* home of His people (Matt 5:16, 2 Thess 1:7, 2 Pet 3:13)

Why study heaven?

- There is a current ignorance and indifference of this doctrine.
- It is commanded to do so. (Col 3:1-2) We tend to be unduly preoccupied with this world, and as prosperity generally breeds worldliness (Prov 30:9), it takes spiritual labor and God's grace to raise our affections to things above.
- An eternal perspective changes our entire view of life; a theological recovery of time is needed. We need to see the brevity and fragility of our lives in light of eternity and the goal of heaven. (Phil 3:13-14)
- We are not studying heaven necessarily for practical benefits heaven is an end in and of itself; however, many practical benefits flow from an eternal, heavenly mindset.
