
## GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO WORSHIP

#### Scripture Reading—Galatians 1:11-16, 23-24

For I would have you know, brothers, that the gospel that was preached by me is not man's gospel. For I did not receive it from any man, nor was I taught it, but I received it through a revelation of Jesus Christ. For you have heard of my former life in Judaism, how I persecuted the church of God violently and tried to destroy it. And I was advancing in Judaism beyond many of my own age among my people, so extremely zealous was I for the traditions of my fathers. But... He who had set me apart before I was born, and who called me by His grace, was pleased to reveal His Son to me, in order that I might preach Him among the Gentiles... They only were hearing it said, "He who used to persecute us is now preaching the faith he once tried to destroy." And they glorified God because of me.

## Reading of the Word—Acts 9:19b-31

For some days [Saul] was with the disciples at Damascus. <sup>20</sup> And immediately he proclaimed Jesus in the synagogues, saying, "He is the Son of God." <sup>21</sup> And all who heard him were amazed and said, "Is not this the man who made havoc in Jerusalem of those who called upon this name? And has he not come here for this purpose, to bring them bound before the chief priests?" <sup>22</sup> But Saul increased all the more in strength, and confounded the Jews who lived in Damascus by proving that Jesus was the Christ.

<sup>23</sup> When many days had passed, the Jews plotted to kill him, <sup>24</sup> but their plot became known to Saul. They were watching the gates day and night in order to kill him, <sup>25</sup> but his disciples took him by night and let him down through an opening in the wall, lowering him in a basket.


<sup>26</sup> And when he had come to Jerusalem, he attempted to join the disciples. And they were all afraid of him, for they did not believe that he was a disciple. <sup>27</sup> But Barnabas took him and brought him to the apostles and declared to them how on the road he had seen the Lord, who spoke to him, and how at Damascus he had preached boldly in the name of Jesus. <sup>28</sup> So he went in and out among them at Jerusalem, preaching boldly in the name of the Lord. <sup>29</sup> And he spoke and disputed against the Hellenists. But they were seeking to kill him. <sup>30</sup> And when the brothers learned this, they brought him down to Caesarea and sent him off to Tarsus.

<sup>31</sup>So the church throughout all Judea and Galilee and Samaria had peace and was being built up. And walking in the fear of the Lord and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit, it multiplied.

## GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO CONFESSION, REPENTANCE, AND RECONCILIATION

### Confession of Sin—based on Galatians 1:6-10

Pastor: Lord, we come confessing. We are so quick to desert You who called us in the grace of Christ. We are so quick to turn to a different gospel— not that there is another one, but there are some who trouble us and want to distort the gospel of Christ.


All: But if we should follow a gospel contrary to the one the apostles preached, let us be accursed.


## Assurance of Pardon—Galatians 2:19-21; Mark 12:30

People: We lift them up to the Lord.


Pastor: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, on Earth as it is in Heaven.


Give us this day our daily bread.

#### Worship Notes:

Continuing Saul's story from Acts 9 that we began last week, in today's sermon text we find that Saul's entire character has been turned upside down by his encounter with Jesus. This former persecutor of the church cannot help declaring the name of his Savior—as Luke writes, "immediately he proclaimed Jesus in the synagogues" (Acts 9:20). Like Saul, our lives have also been radically transformed by Jesus. So like Saul, let's declare this morning that we stand on the solid rock of Christ, and all other ground is sinking sand (My Hope Is Built On Nothing Less). Let's confess our love for Him, and our desire to resign all the follies of sin because of His sacrificial love for us (My Jesus, I Love Thee). Let's proclaim to a world lost in sin our desire to labor for His glory throughout our lives (To Live Is Christ). Let's remember to "cling alone to Jesus as did the saints of yore" in the face of hardships and trials (From Babel To Zion). Jesus is our one foundation, and He promises to guide, sustain, and cherish us until the end (The Church's One Foundation). May this "loud refrain," inherited from the prophets and apostles and continuing to this very day (Holy God, We Praise Your Name), be found in our church and all believing churches, "from morn to set of sun." —Henry C.
