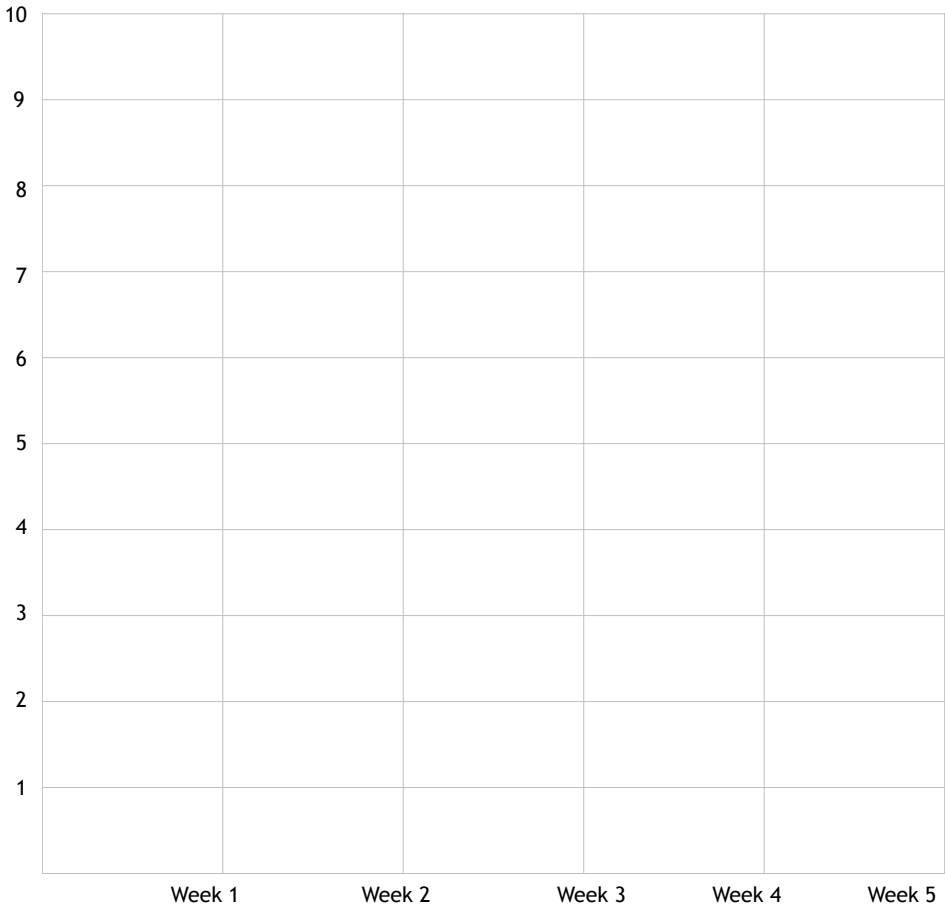

Monthly Patterns



Use this page to analyse the graph opposite and consider which allergens may be causing reactions. Once you've plotted all symptoms from the previous week and drawn in corresponding lines, you can then plot when a specific allergen/s has/may have been introduced and begin looking for patterns.

Keep in mind the difference between IgE and non-IgE reactions, and whether exposure may have been direct or through breastmilk. Remember:

- IgE reactions are immediate or within a few hours of exposure
- Non-IgE reactions take place within ~72 hours of exposure
- As a guide, allergens can take around 4 - 6 hours to reach breastmilk.
