



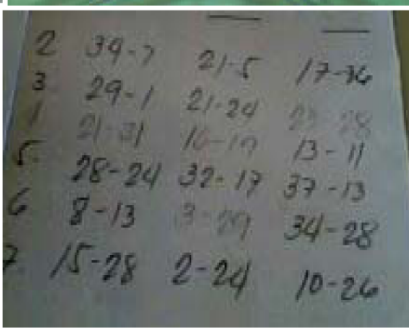
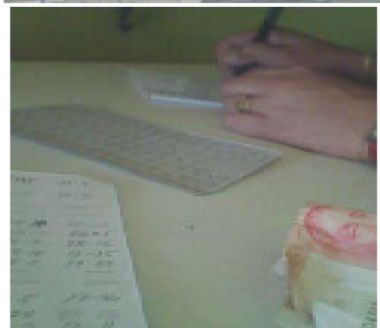
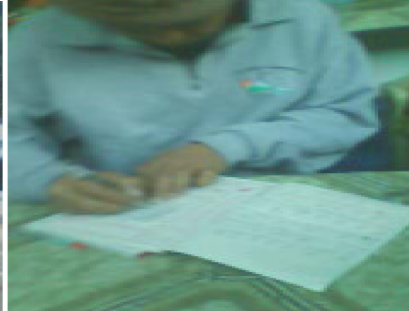

HPG Warns Public on New Modus Operandi of Carnappers



BAGUIO CITY – Regional Highway Patrol Unit – Cordillera Head Police Senior Superintendent Vladimir Kahulugan warned the public on a new ‘modus operandi’ being employed by carjackers.

According to Kahulugan, as a new scheme, carjackers are using stolen cars as leverage to dupe car dealers or sellers of letting them test drive the vehicle they want to steal. ‘Iiwan nila kunyari ang nakaw na sasakyan para pumayag ang nagbebenta na ipa-test drive ang sasakyan tapos ay hindi na ito babalik,’ he said.

The HPG-Cordillera confirmed this modus operandi in its recent operation that resulted to the recovery of a stolen car which was used as a lever- **Cont. on page 6**

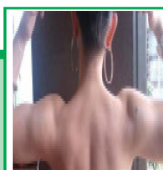

Lawmaker Says Vagrancy not a Crime

Senator Chiz Escudero wants to strike out vagrancy from the country's code of crimes, saying this provision only targets the poor and the disadvantaged.

Escudero proposed the decriminalization of vagrancy under Senate Bill No. 2367 because homelessness and lack of opportunities to earn a living is a minor infraction, if at all, and thus should not be lumped together with criminal acts.

He said vagrancy was often used to take advantage of people who could not really stand up for themselves.

"Take the case of that woman who was arrested by a policeman for vagrancy. She was not even loitering, yet she was arrested. Now she's crying rape by her captor," Escudero said.

Escudero was referring to the rape case filed against PO3 Antonio Bautista by a woman he nabbed for alleged vagrancy.

The female victim said she was arrested by Bautista while she was waiting for her husband on their way to mass. At the Manila Police District where she was taken, the cop took her money amounting to P4,000 and subsequently molested her.

"This is a clear case of using the anti-vagrancy law as an opportunity for erring authorities to mulct money from and take advantage of people," Escudero said. "Strike this provision out and we will be rid of ugly incidence such as this one brought by that abusive policeman."

"I challenge the Philippine National Police to immediately effect the arrest of Bautista. This is an opportunity for them to prove that they can and will arrest even one of their own," he added.

Escudero said police authorities and other law enforcement officers should be focusing on graver offenses that pose threats to peace and security of individuals rather than busying themselves with petty offenses.

"Our society and our law should be restorative and rehabilitative rather than punitive to those who simply were not given fair and equal opportunities in life" the senator said./Office of Senator Chiz Escudero

PNP Calls on Active Participation of Citizens in Reducing Crime

BAGUIO CITY- Even as the crime rate in the city decreased by about 50 percent in 2010 compared to 2009, the Baguio City Police is calling on the active participation of the citizenry in preventing crime and in maintaining peace and order in this mountain resort.

Baguio City Police Office (BCPO) Information Officer P/Supt Engelbert Soriano said the primary focus of the BCPO this 2011 as ordered by Police City Director David Lacdan, is to decrease robbery cases to a minimal level, if not to totally eradicate it. a

Soriano pointed out the big gap in the police to citizen ratio in the city which during daytime even reaches one policeman to 1,500 people. The ideal ratio is to have one policeman for every 500 people but BCPO has only about 430 person-

nel. About 800 policemen are needed for Baguio to meet the ideal number.

Thus, Soriano appealed to the citizenry to play an active role particularly in reporting crime incidence and in doing their part as a witness in filing criminal charges against captured suspects.

DA, Gov say no Need for Vegetable Importation

LA TRINIDAD, Benguet - Despite the frost damages of vegetable farms in Benguet, officials here say that vegetable importation is not needed.

The Department of Agriculture and Benguet Provincial Government are unanimous in saying that the damage of frost on vegetables in Atok, Benguet does not generally affect the supply of vegetables.

In a recent inspection of DA officials in areas usually damaged by frost, only a two hectare farm is damaged in Atok, Benguet. Other vegetable farms vulnerable to frost in Madaymen, Buguias and Kada, Bauko, Mt. Province have been negative from frost as reported.

According to

Atok Municipal Agriculturist Fred Rufino, damage on the two hectare frost affected crops is estimated at P65,000. Crops affected by the "andap" or frost in Atok are cabbage, potato and carrots.

Rufino said the high demand for upland vegetables last Christmas and New Year celebrations drove the farmers to harvest their vegetables early, thus the minimal crops damaged by frost.

DA information officer Robert Domoguen said that DA has sent power sprayer machines to be used by the farmers to prevent the total frost damage on vegetables.

The DA also said that the effect of frost will be minimal since farmers are now practicing crop programming that entails the better and timely production of

vegetable produce.

Benguet Governor Nestor Fongwan advises consumers not to be alarmed with the situation of vegetable frost because it does not affect the supply of vegetables. He assures that the province has enough vegetable supply for consumers even in Manila markets until June this year and therefore there is no need for importation.

Fongwan explains that there are bulk of vegetables in the market now because there is high supply but less demand from consumers or buyers in the La Trinidad Trading Post and even in Manila after the holiday season.

The provincial government is also guarding the illegal importation of vegetables from other countries as the problem of frost arises in Benguet./Redjie Cawis/PIA

DOH Reports Increase in Fireworks-Related Injuries

BAGUIO CITY - The Department of Health recorded a six percent increase of firecracker-related injuries in the Cordillera Region, but there is no death reported.

DOH Regional Director Myrna Cabotaje said that the entire region recorded a total of 89 fireworks related cases and one stray bullet incident from

December 21, 2010 to January 4, 2011.

In the 89 cases, Abra recorded the highest with 37 cases this year compared to 31 in 2009. 22 of the cases came from the capital town of Bangued.

Baguio City has 24 cases, higher by one than last year. Benguet recorded 11 cases this year while only three 3 2009. Kalinga had 8 this

year and 6 in 2009. Ifugao also increased from two in 2009 and five cases this year.

Apayao and Mountain Province recorded decrease of cases. From 14 cases in 2009, there are only three cases this year in Apayao. Mt. Province reported only one case this year, down from the five last year.

Cabotaje said that of the 89 cases, 65 are below 15

P-Noy Asked to help City Reclaim Forbes Lot

BAGUIO CITY – Mayor Mauricio Domogan got his wish to bring the city's desire to recover the lots within the Forbes Park forest reservation to the attention of President Benigno Aquino III.

The mayor last Monday bared that the Forbes Park issue was one of the two concerns he took up with the President during his brief visit at the city mayor's office last Dec. 31 where he expressed to the

President the city's desire to have the Solicitor General file for the reversion of the Certificates of Ancestral Land Title (CALTs) issued by the National Commission on Indigenous Peoples (NCIP) over the lots to enable the city to reclaim the supposedly inalienable lots.

The mayor said the President asked him to put the request in writing so he could act on it.

The mayor

expressed hopes that something concrete will result from his encounter with the President especially since the Forbes Park issue is an immediate concern of the city government.

"We need to handle this properly because losing Forbes Park to these private individuals would mean the eventual destruction of Baguio considering that it is one of the only few remaining pinestands in our city," the

mayor be-

moaned.

The mayor during the Ugnayan press briefing last Thursday bared that the draft petition for the Solicitor General to initiate proceedings for the CALTs' cancellation has been finished and will be pushed but the support

RDC Committee set Pace on the Drafting of the Third Autonomy Act

BAGUIO CITY – The Regional Development Council (RDC) Third Autonomy Act Drafting Committee (TAADC) has set the pace for the drafting of a new organic act for the region's pursuit for regional autonomy.

In a meeting at the City Hall Multipurpose Hall, Wednesday,

TAADC Chairman and Baguio City Mayor Mauricio Domogan stressed the importance of following a timetable – that is to

forward a draft organic act to the Cordillera congressmen by June so that they can file it in Congress within the year and work for its approval by the end of 2011, for a target referendum by March of 2012.

According to Domogan, it is for the best that the new autonomy act be passed in Congress while it is still far away from the political exercise in 2013 so as to avoid being politicized.

In order to

meet the target, it was agreed upon that each provincial and sectoral, IEC/consultation output and recommendations be submitted on March 31. The committee would then start an initial draft of the autonomy organic act.

Domogan also assured all the committee members and the other participants in the meeting that even if they are already doing the initial draft, consultations and IECs for

Autonomy issues heat up in Mountain Province

The fresh push for Cordillera autonomy has stirred discussions on how this mountain region can finally take stock and control of its dwindling natural and mineral resources for its own development instead of these being continuously exploited for national progress.

The "development-for-whom" issue anchored initial dialogues especially in Mountain Province where its task force on regional development and autonomy conducted

initial consultations in the 10 towns.

At the meeting Wednesday of the regional committee tasked to get inputs for the drafting of a new autonomy charter, provincial task force chair Franklin Odsey reported the questions raised included the following:

Will the people of the region be able to have titles to their lands vis-à-vis restrictive national government policies and laws proclaiming wide areas as parks, watersheds or claims of mining firms? Will the regional government

have the power to issue mining and other permits for the exploitation of Cordillera's resources and directly collect taxes from their operations?

Among the issues raised on Sagada, Sabangan and Tadian towns were: What should be done with national laws that prevent us from utilizing our forest resources like trees planted by our forefathers? What about the tapping of our water resources for dams which are now in private hands?

The hearing will be facilitated by the council committee on human rights, public protection and peace and order chaired by Councilor Nicasio Alipin Jr.

raised were the preservation of the region's culture and identity, security of tenure of national government officials and employees and what happens should autonomy be rejected for the third time. The focus of discussions was triggered by five "core principles" prepared by a special committee tasked by the Regional Development Council to draft a working document on Cordillera autonomy.

Committee chair and Baguio city mayor Mauricio Domogan said the following principles

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Bilog, the proposed measure seeks to acknowledge the rights of taxi passengers and penalize acts violating such.

As spelled out in the proposed ordinance, the rights of taxi passengers are as follows:

*Right to be picked up and transported to their stated destination by any available on duty taxi driver, subject to applicable traffic regulations;

*Right to a fare meter duly calibrated and sealed by proper authorities;

*Right to a properly dressed and courteous driver who provides assistance, if requested;

*Right to a taxi that is clean, smoke-free and in good repair;

*Right to direct the route, to suggest the destination on the most economical route;

*Right to see the taxi meter;

*Right to see the driver's identification card;

*Right to a quiet atmosphere upon request;

*Right to pay the rate exactly as posted in the meter;

*Right to be assisted by the drivers in loading

and unloading of goods; and

*Right to be returned of any property left in the taxi cab.

Bilog said the city needs to enact said ordinance "to protect our community, public citizens and tourists alike from predatory practices of some taxi drivers and operators and raise their service standards."

While it is a fact that taxi drivers in the city are acknowledged as among the most courteous and honest in the country, there are drivers who take advantage of passengers.

As proposed, the passengers' rights list should be displayed prominently in taxi cabs along with a brief description of the procedure on how to file a complaint for violation of any rights enumerated.

Proposed penalties are reprimand for the first offense; and fines ranging from P1,000 to P5,000 and imprisonment for the succeeding offenses.

The proposed ordinance is currently under study for second reading by the city council./A Refuerzo

The Right Questions

"Does conventional economics ask the right questions?", two brilliant students asked on a chilly 1953 autumn evening at Cambridge University. "Can it offer something for poor countries, like Pakistan or India?" (Or the Philippines?)

In 2011, we know that this Cambridge chat led to crafting of the "Human Development Index". Today, HDI yardstick tracks human development across 169 countries. This gauge underpins UNDP's annual "Human Development Report."

HDI goes beyond the old one-dimensional "Gross National Product.". GNPs divide national wealth by population. This crude yardstick was useful. But it also smudged stark disparities. GNP bracketed Imelda Marcos with diamond tiara with the beggar in rubber flip-flops.

GNP doesn't capture human options or freedoms either. So,

young Pakistani student Mahbub ul Haq said. "Who wants to know what sets the price of toothpaste? But it helps answer the right questions."

Right questions were on education, health, security, aspirations even, agreed the equally- young Indian student Amartya Sen. "We need a measure that is not as blind to social aspects as GNP is."

There was something of Human Development Report already then, Sen recalled at the New York 1998 memorial rites for Huq. Sen won the Nobel Prize in Economic Sciences that year. After leaving Yale University, Haq amplified his "human development theory" at the World Bank and UN.

Sen and Haq, at UNDP, led a team of scientists to produce the maiden Human Development Report in 1990. "People are the real wealth of a nation", their lead sentence read. Today's 20th anniversary issue of HDR reiterates that theme.

Annual reports now factor into HDI tables life expectancy, literacy and incomes. This measurement innovation continues. Three new gauges - extreme deprivation, gender disparities and inequalities - are tacked into this year's edition.

Tables have been buttressed. Aside from standard demographic statistics, one finds, in this new report, yardsticks on: sustainability and vulnerability; access to information technology; human security, civic and community well being, even perceptions on individual well being.

Each report continue to marshal data on key issues. HDR in 1998 analyzed "Globalization With A Human Face." In 2002, the focus was on "Deepening Democracy in a Fragmented World". A year later, Millennium Development Goals were centerpiece in "A Compact Among Nations to End Human Poverty." The global water crisis and international migration came under scrutiny in 2008 and 2009.

The in-between years also span off more than 600 national HDRs. All were researched, written and published in individual countries. A biennial publication, Philippine Human Development Report first came off the press in 1994.

Spearheaded by economists like Solita Monsod and Arsenio Balisacan, Filipino scientists have churned out seven biennial HDRs since. At a Rio de Janeiro conference, Philippine HDRs were cited for excellence in design, innovative use of human development measurement tools, as well as participation and policy impact.

From its initial computation of HDIs for each of the Philippine regions, PHDRs have covered festering national concerns.

The 1997 report on gender documented significant gains, by women, in education, jobs and elections. At century's turn, the report zeroed in on the sharp decline in quality of Philippine education and outlined reforms. "Work and Well Being" and "Human Security" were themes for 2002 and 2005.

The report before 2010's "In Search for a Human Face" concentrated on how institutions and politics impact on human development. "The Ombudsman's record in disposition of cases and conviction is far from sterling," the 2009 study said. "(It) has been described as an agency where cases 'just lie there and they die there...It's credibility dropped to a low level'".

PHDR breaks down lumps of data. Analysis by provinces revealed, for example, that La Union now has the longest life expectancy at 74.6 years. Life is "nasty, brutish and short" in Tawi-Tawi at 53.4 years.

They also compare HDIs between countries and provinces. Azerbaijan on one end and Paraguay on the other, for instance, sandwich Batanes, Laguna, Bataan, Batangas, La Union and Pampanga.

Economic forecasts for 2011

NEDA Director-General Cayetano Paderanga estimated that renewed investor confidence in the economy could lead to Philippine economic growth of as much as 8 percent in 2011.

However, the benchmark estimate is around 5 to 6 percent growth in the gross domestic product. If translated to actual figures, the forecasts are much better against the 4.4% average economic growth of the Philippines in the last 10 years under the Gloria Arroyo government. Paderanga attributed the expected surge in economic growth to renewed investor confidence in the Philippine economy. A number of economists believe that economic growth must be at least 7 percent per annum to reduce Philippine poverty.

Earlier, the World Bank estimated that Philippine economic growth would only be 3.8 per cent this 2011. Growth figures for 2010 are still not available. However, the World Bank has also estimated that Philippine growth from 2010 will be about 3.5 percent. Thus, the estimates of President Aquino's team are really off the expected.

Hopefully, the estimates of President Aquino's economic team are more reliable than the President's legal team that committed a blunder when they miscalculated the legality of a presidential directive forming the Truth Commission only to be declared by the Supreme Court as unconstitutional. We need not say, of course, that the President should have anticipated the matter being a lawyer himself, although a non-practicing one.

It was really embarrassing for the first directive of a Philippine President to be declared illegal. Its competence for governance is suspect. Of course, it is easy to dismiss the matter as a machination of the Supreme Court against the Philippine President because earlier Aquino was insinuating that the Supreme Court justice was not properly appointed. Aquino had been asserting earlier that it would only be proper if it would be him who be appointing the current Supreme Court Chief Justice.

Philippine economic growth was on the uptrend. RP economic growth was 4.2 percent annually during the period 1995-20005. It grew 5.3 percent in 2006 and the peak was 7.1 percent in 2007. However, in 2008, RP economic growth nose-dived to 3.8% amidst a world crisis. According to World Bank estimates, economic growth in the industrial world including the OECD countries was 3.3 percent, 3.9 percent in the Euro Area, 5.4 percent in Japan, and 2.5 percent in the United States.

Is a better forecast for the Philippine economy justified? Unfortunately, there seems to be scanty data supporting the optimistic forecasts. For one, US economy remains bad with unemployment at round 10 percent (actually more than 12 percent unemployment rate according to other estimates versus the usual of 4 to 6 percent per annum).

We are also not sure if Aquino's amnesty to coup plotters would lead to good results as Aquino's display of poor competence to lead the nation could lead to a backfire: coup plotters could be emboldened to topple Aquino in the

age to steal another car being sold by a dealer.

According to Kahulugan, a stolen Honda Civic owned by one Kathryn B. Anes, was recovered abandoned along Magsaysay Avenue last December 28. This was reportedly used by a certain Rolan Ropal as a leverage to test drive then steal another Honda Civic being sold by a certain Mr. Jaime Bulong.

Bulong narrated that about 9:00 am of Dec. 28, Roncal posed as a buyer of his Honda Civic displayed in front of his business establishment in Magsaysay Ave. After some negotiation, Ropal got Bulong’s car for a test drive leaving Anes vehicle as a leverage. Ropal never came back.

Investigation showed that the stolen car bears a plate number registered to another motor vehicle. Also recovered inside the car are various plate numbers including red plates.

A manhunt operation for Ropal is now being done while a case of violation of Republic Act 6539 (An Act Preventing and Penalizing Carnapping) is being prepared against the suspect.

Meanwhile, Kahulugan also warned the public of a similar ‘modus operandi’ wherein carjackers would bring children while transacting with car dealers or sellers. They would leave the child/children who supposedly are their own kids to the dealers while having a test drive and then they would not also return as they have already stolen the car. The children are only hired by the carnappers./Lito Dar/PIA

Trillanes, et. al. must renounce uprisings

Moves to set aside the Garcia deal by the government through the OSG will only give rise to a serious Constitutional crisis, because it is the Constitution itself which provides for the rule on double jeopardy, and any mangling of this rule will also mangle the Constitution.

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SKYROCKETING PRICES DAMPEN OPTIMISM OF PINOYS: Now that prices of almost everything in this country are going up, I wonder if the optimism of many Filipinos before Christmas will remain, in view of a looming more hard-up life.
