What it is ?

A vlc extension that allows you to find a meaning of a word

- 1) That is either shown on the currently running subtitles
- 2) or to search for your own word

Directions to use

1. download the file here

2. Put the downloaded file in the following location

windows → "c:\programfiles\VideoLAN\VLC\lua\extensions\"

linux → "/usr/lib/vlc/lua/extensions/"

***if extensions folder does not exists, create one in that location.**

PROXY NETWORK USERS

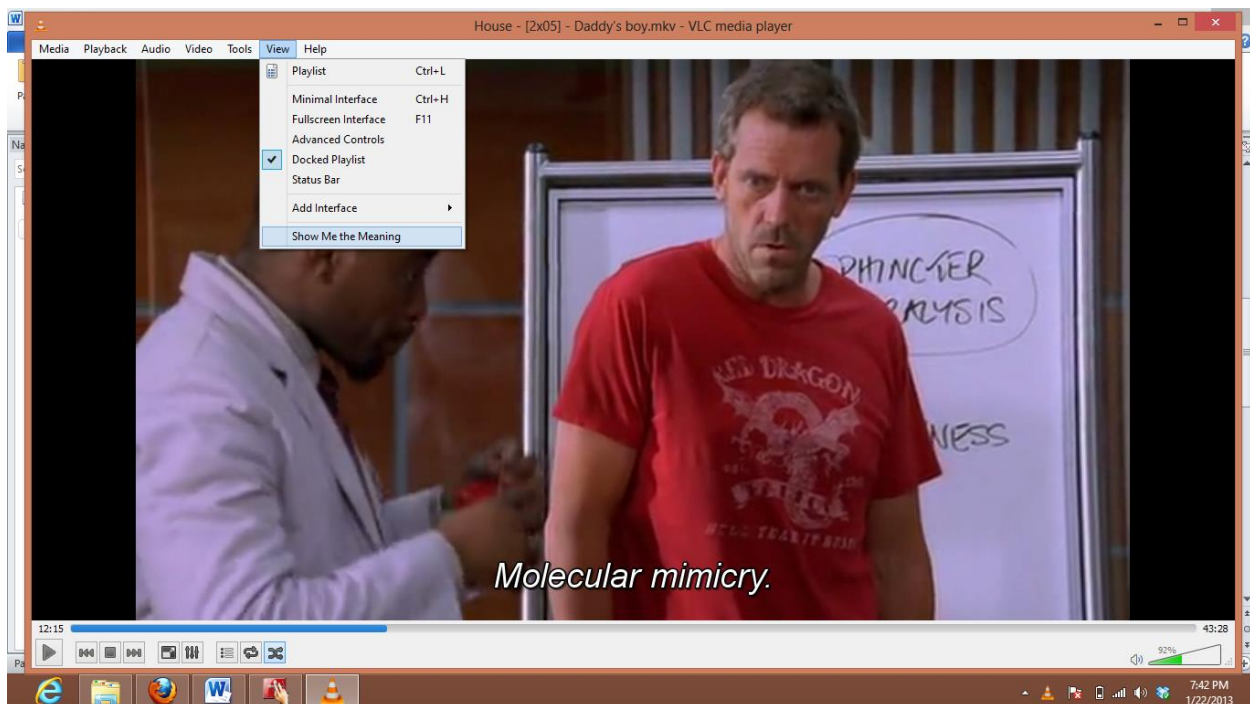
→ Set the Proxy in Vlc player

In vlc , click Tools --> Preferences --> input&codecs tab --> Http proxy url

eg proxy.ssn.net:8080

3. How to open it while watching a video ?

Click view → “show me the meaning”



IMPORTANT ISSUES :

- Extension does not open when vlc player is just started and no media is played.
- only .srt subtitles is readable by the app
- Make sure the subtitle file is in same folder containing the media.

- **Older versions of vlc not supported. Please download the latest.**

- **the name of the subtitles should be exactly same as the media name followed by ".srt"**
as if media name is "House - [1x01] - Pilot"
then subtitle should be "House - [1x01] - Pilot.srt"
