## TechNet Applauds House Passage of the Email Privacy Act

Washington—TechNet, the national, bipartisan network of innovation economy CEOs and senior executives, today applauded the House of Representatives for passing the *Email Privacy Act* (H.R. 699), a critical legislative update to the *Electronic Communications Privacy Act* (ECPA).

"Today, the House took a major step forward in bringing our nation's electronic communications privacy laws into the 21<sup>st</sup> century," said Linda Moore, president and CEO of TechNet. "These laws haven't been updated since 1986, and modernization is badly needed. TechNet commends the House for sending a clear message that the U.S. Constitution applies to private digital information just as it applies to physical property."

TechNet has been working with a broad coalition of companies, organizations, and individuals to support reform of the *Electronic Communications Privacy Act*. Previously, this coalition <u>wrote</u> to Senate and House leadership and urged them to pass ECPA reform legislation.
