DOH records 9 firecracker related injuries in CAR

BAGUIO CITY-- Despite the call of the Health Department for the total ban of firecrackers to prevent injuries during the celebration of the Yuletide season, nine firecracker-related injuries were already recorded in the Cordillera Region.

Department of Health Emergency Management Coordinator Clark Dizon reported that as of December 29, five cases were reported in Baguio City and four cases in the province of Abra. Almost all the cases were due to the illegal firecracker 'piccolo and at least three of the victims are aged 8-12 years old.

"Wala pa yung January 5 na deadline ng reporting pero umaarangkada na ang bilang ng napuputukan dito sa Cordillera," Dizon said.

Last year, the Cordillera region recorded at least 54 firecracker-related cases the New Year revelry. All hospitals are on Code White.

Earlier this month, the DOH launched the "Iwas Paputok" campaign with the theme, "Sa Ingay Walang Sablay, sa Paputok Goodbye Kamay Kaya Wag Pasaway", which calls for public support anew in doing away with firecrackers as these may harm; instead use other safer means of noise and merry making this holiday season.

The DOH and other authorities continue to call for the ban on the use of firecrackers and fireworks and the use of guns in celebrating the New Year and welcoming 2016 to avoid more injuries and even deaths. (JDP/RMC- PIA CAR)

The PNP and the Provincial Government will handle CLIP information with confidentiality and follow information dissemination protocol in order to protect the safety of all

We need managers, not saviors

We are paying the price for over-personalizing what should have been systems building, professional management and meritocratic hiring and promotion

Last November, I was honored to speak at an integrity forum organized by Xavier University, the Brotherhood of Christian Businessmen and Professionals and the AIM alumni of Cagayan de Oro City, commemorating the life of Vice President Emmanuel Pelaez.

For those too young to remember him, "Maning" Pelaez was an Atenean and a bar topnotcher hailing from Mindanao (Misamis Oriental). He started as a clerk in the Senate and worked his way up the ranks to eventually become a professor of law in University of Manila, and later an aide to President Ramon Magsaysay. Sr.

Once his skill and integrity was noticed by Magsaysay, his ascent in politics was nothing short of astronomical – first serving as congressman of Misamis Oriental, then senator on Magsaysay's 1953 ticket, then as vice president on Diosdado Macapagal's 1961 ticket.

From there, he opposed Marcos as the presidential nominee of the Nacionalista Party. On the night of July 21, 1982, he was ambushed and narrowly escaped an assassination attempt.

He believed it was Marcos and his cronies who plotted this, and he decried Macros' effort to cover up the crime by blaming

it on Muslim separatists.

On the night he was ambushed, Pelaez famously asked General Karingal: "What's happening to our country?" – referring to the deterioration of the rule of law, the unfairness and cronvism in the economy, and the growing poverty and inequality. Now many years later, and despite marked progress in growing the Philippine economy, it seems that the country has nevertheless stagnated on a number of fronts having to do with the quality of its leadership and public sector managers.

There are 3 governance patterns that bring us farther away from the ideals of professional leadership and management that Maning Pelaez stood for. And while the focus of this article is on the Philippines, it would be relatively easy to see that the question posed - Where are our leaders and managers? - applies more broadly and is quite relevant in less. Certainly, that is a blessing coming from God, although there have many countries today.

Politicians instead of technocrats?

In most modern democracies, key government functions are led and managed by area experts – technocrats – who know how to run and regulate an increasingly sophisticated bureaucracy. Politicians like Pelaez appear to be an exception, since he started out as a technocrat and later ventured successfully into politics.

Pure politicians, on the other hand, may not necessarily bring the requisite expertise to certain positions in the government bureaucracy—and this could be detrimental to public

Politicians may also shy from tackling the more difficult but often necessary reforms that could eventually make them unpopular in the polls. Witness, for example, the many violations of local government regulations that remain unchecked, largely because politicians don't want to anger potential voters.

This is no different from politicians in other countries avoiding especially difficult reforms - like debt reduction, climate change and healthcare and pensions reforms - because they know the difficult solutions to these issues will likely reduce their political support, even as decisive action may benefit future generations who have no vote yet.

In recent years, the balance between technocrats and politicians in top government office seems to have tilted in favor of the latter.

For comparison, the Ramos and Aquino cabinets provide much food for thought. One can see an increase in the percentage of officials who at some point in their career were elected into public office. A mere 5% of top officials under the 1998 Ramos administration possessed a political background.

Compare this with over 40% of top officials in the 2015 Aquino administration who occupied elected office in the past.

To be sure, politicians might possess special leadership skills that could – when applied properly – forge consensus and get countries to move forward.

In the case of the Philippines, one wonders whether the disadvantages (i.e. avoidance of any deep reforms for fear of political backlash) outweigh the advantages (i.e. ability to build political consensus).

Perhaps highlighting this point, in a recent article about the traffic management problem in the metropolis written by former NEDA Secretary General Cielito Habito, he reiterated

Separation does not annul a marriage

OLD: Wow. I can't believe this column is now being written in 2016, with the kind permission and grace of God. This means that "Kakampi Mo Ang Batas", the column is now around fifteen years old, more or been many times that writing the column meant legal as well as personal troubles for me.

Initially, this column was meant only for answering legal queries, largely as an offshoot of the radio program "Double B Batas ng Bayan" aired at GMA DZBB, 594 kHz, which started as a public service segment of broadcaster Rey Pacheco's "Senior Balita". But then, it went on to become an independent radio and TV program as well.

Lately, it has likewise become a vehicle for spiritual expositions, particularly on expounding on the doctrines of the Anak ng Diyos Kadugo Ni Kristo (Children of God Blood Kin of the Christ) Church, a Philippine-established Christian Church which, since 2007, espouses the truth that Jesus Christ is God and Savior, and is God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. SEPARATION OF SPOUSES DOES NOT ANNUL THEIR MARRIAGE: There is an avalanche of queries coming from our countrymen who are abroad either as overseas Filipino workers or as immigrants, on our item about Filipinos who are in other countries having the capacity to file cases to annul their marriages with their Filipino spouses, most of which center on whether or not separation in fact for at least seven years could automatically mean that the marriage is already dissolved.

The answer is no, which means that, the mere separation of the spouses even for a period longer than seven years does not give rise to an automatic annulment. The interested spouse, whether living abroad or still in the Philippines, must file with the Regional Trial Courts here a petition for annulment of marriage, which must be favorable granted by the courts.

Right now, there are several grounds to annul a marriage in the Philippines, but the most popular and most oft-resorted to among many couples is Art. 36 of the Family Code, which says that when a spouse could no longer discharge his or her marital obligations, he or she can be sued for annulment by the other spouse. In our succeeding columns, we will deal with this ground more lengthily, God willing.

Tissue culture in coffee

MANILA - Do you appreciate the richness in taste and aroma of coffee? Do you know that the Philippines is also exporting coffee?

However, Filipino coffee growers/farmers deal with challenges. Among these include diseases in coffee (such as leaf rust, stem borer, nematodes, coffee berry disease), pests, unproductive trees, poor technology utilization, and low market prices.

According to the Philippine Council for Agriculture, Aquatic and Natural Resources Research and Development (PCAARRD), an attached agency of the Department of Science and Technology (DOST), tissue culture could help address these challenges as this could bring rapid production of quality planting materials

With this, PCAARRD has funded the "Enhancement of Micropropagation techniques to meet the demand for quality planting materials" project.

Recognizing that tissue culture could fast track the mass propagation of coffee, especially when planting materials are limited in conventional vegetative propagation, the Cavite State University (CvSU) has adopted the somatic embryogenesis technique, which is part of PCAARRD's project.

According to Wikipedia, somatic embryogenesis is a process where a plant or embryo is derived from a single somatic cell or group of somatic cells. It added that somatic embryos are formed from plant cells that are not normally involved in the development of embryos (e.g. ordinary plant tissue).

PCAARRD explained that somatic embryogen esis plant propagation technique is efficient, rapid, and thus, can improve Coffee Arabica and Liberica varieties' productivity.

These two coffee varieties were chosen due to their superior bean yield, and bean quality. PCAARRD also cited that Liberica variety is resistant to common insects, pests, and diseases.

CvSU, Benguet State University (BSU), Central Philippines State University (CPSU), and Central Mindanao University were identified as cooperating agencies. Moreover, these universities will also represent Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao.

The agency said the methods of propagating coffee in the country were stem cuttings and the use of seeds. It noted that buds, grafts, and cuttings must be sourced from vertically growing shoots such as the primary fruiting plagiotropic branches or branches growing at an almost horizontal angle to maintain the uniformity in the population of coffee plants.

In its project, PCAARRD has involved the development and optimization of the different stages of somatic embryogenesis: callus induction phase, differentiation phase and embryo development, plantlet regeneration phase, rooting and acclimatization phase.

CvSU targets production of 600,000 coffee seedlings in three years, and hopes to sustain these to support the livelihood of coffee farmers. The university also aims to stabilize coffee prices.

According to PCAARRD, beneficiaries of this project include coffee farmers, coffee producers, cooperatives, associations, coffee researchers and extension workers, coffee consumers, entrepreneurs. and industries or processing companies.

Promoting somatic embryogenesis in coffee is one of the agency's initiatives to provide science-based know-how and tools to enable the agricultural sector raise productivity to world-class standards./(PNA) LGI/MCCA/EDŚ
