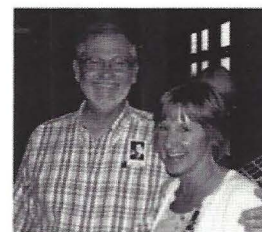
Janet Beck Roberson: My husband, Rob & I

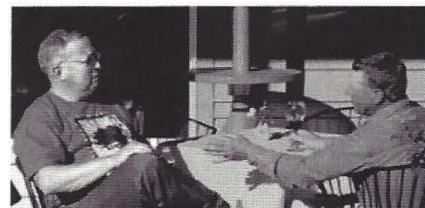


mom for many years, then worked in a physician's office and then as a school nurse in Snohomish

Charles Bright: Still raising kids. Youngest is 9. Kids keeping me young - often times mistaken for a 45 year old -

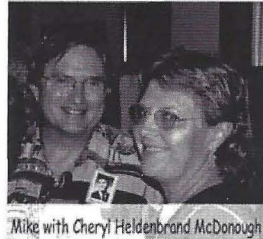
till someone asks how old my grandkid is. Retired early, maybe worn out from

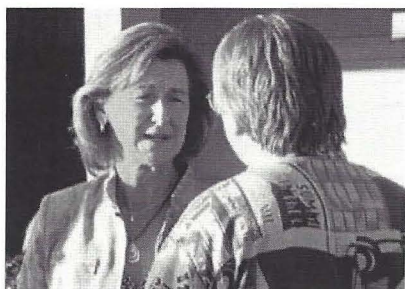
I am lucky enough to have good health, a happy marriage, and two fantastic children.

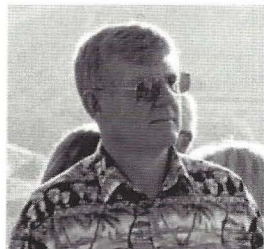
Becky Feil Besel: I am now retired but busier than ever! I worked as a Radiologic Technologist for 35 years, specializing in Mammography. I have lived in

graduating in June, then to flight school), and Mariesa (25, a commercial artist, married to a helicopter pilot).

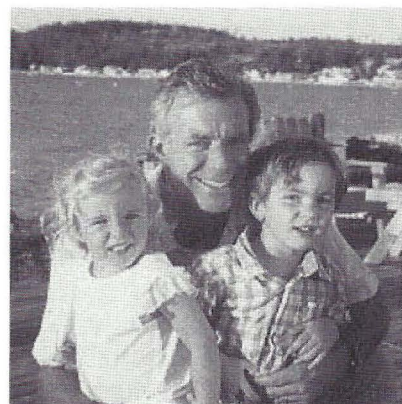

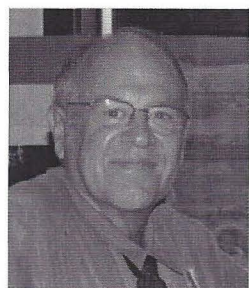

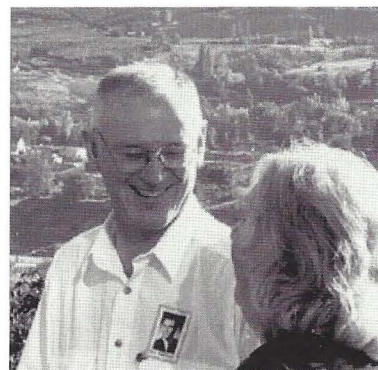

Mary Ann Waverek Gerber: Met Tom Gerber in '65 at Western in Bellingham. We were married in

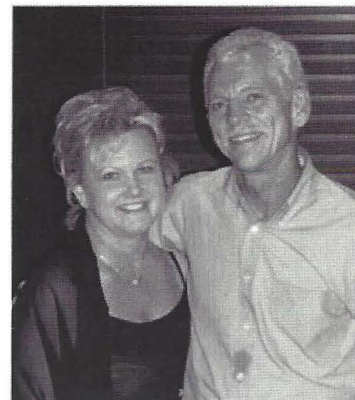
