

Importing Equine Semen – Important!

In order to prevent the spread of bacterial and viral disease, which can survive in chilled and frozen semen, all imported semen from outside the UK must be accompanied by an **original**, valid health certificate issued in the country of origin. If this paperwork is photocopied or does not accompany the semen then we cannot inseminate the mare with it. It is not down to professional judgement as this is European Law and the studs supplying semen are aware of the legislation and usually comply. If you intend on using semen from a stallion residing outside the UK then you must request an **original** health certificate. Maintaining regular communication with the issuing stud and giving them as much notice as possible before we need the semen will make it easier for them to fulfil these requirements.

Notifying Border Control

If you are ordering semen from outside the UK and having it delivered directly to our clinic, please notify us at least 48hrs prior to delivery and you **must** notify APHA (Animal Plant and Health Agency) on 0300 303 8268 24 hours prior to delivery.

The Blue Cross Equine Health Survey

Horse owners are asked to spend a few moments in May to take part in a vital equine online survey on equine health. The National Equine Health survey run by the Blue Cross in conjunction with The British Equine Veterinary Association, gives a unique picture of equine health in the UK and plays an important role in monitoring endemic diseases. For the past six years it has provided feedback from the owners of horses, ponies, donkeys and mules and allowed vets to identify the most common diseases and problems. Wormer of the Month-Noromectin

Noromectin paste kills the adult and fourth larval stages of most of the important internal parasites including small redworms, lungworms and bots with a single dose. Each syringe treats up to a 700kg horse and cost just £6.50(inc). If you buy 10 we will give you a 10% discount, ask Karen for more details.
