Bakit hindi pinansin ng apat na kandidatong ito ang ating kahilingan, samantalang mayroon naman na silang SALN na sinumite sa kani-kanilang mga opisina bagama't ito ay luma? Ang kay Cong. Aliping, inaatay na lang natin ito mula pa Kongreso. Si Atty. Molintas ay may napakalumang SALN noong siya ay Konsehal. Kay former Judge Claravall, mayroon siyang SALN noong siya ay Judge pa ngunit napakahirap kumuha nito sa Korte Suprema.

Bakit kailangan pa tayong pahirapan at abalain ng tatlong kandidatong ito para kunin ang kani-kailang mga SALN at hindi na lang nila ibigay ng kusa kung sila ay walang tinatago? Ang ITR at FS ni Mr. Go ay mga pribadong dokumento na naka-file sa Bureau of Internal Revenue (BIR) na hindi natin makukuha unless bigyan tayo mismo ni Mark Go ng pahintulot para makuha ang mga ito. Ang tamang gawain ng isang pribadong indibidual na tumatakbo para sa isang mataas na posisyon sa gobyerno ay kusa niyang ibigay sa atin ang mga ito for public information purposes. Ang kanyang ITR ay maaring samahan na rin niya ng kanyang audited FS. Ito ay kung wala siyang tinatago. Bakit ang ating request sa kanya ay kanyang dinidina at hindi pinansin? Siya lamang ang makakasagot niyan. Inyong mababasa ang liham (letter request) na ating pinadala kay Mark Go noong February 5, 2016.

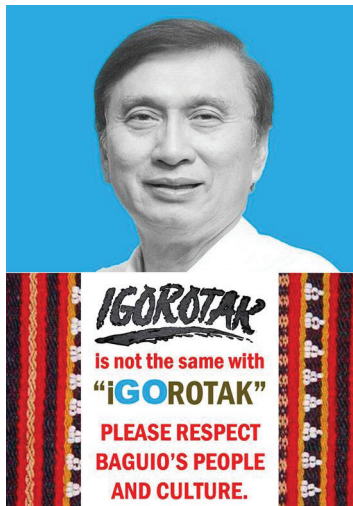

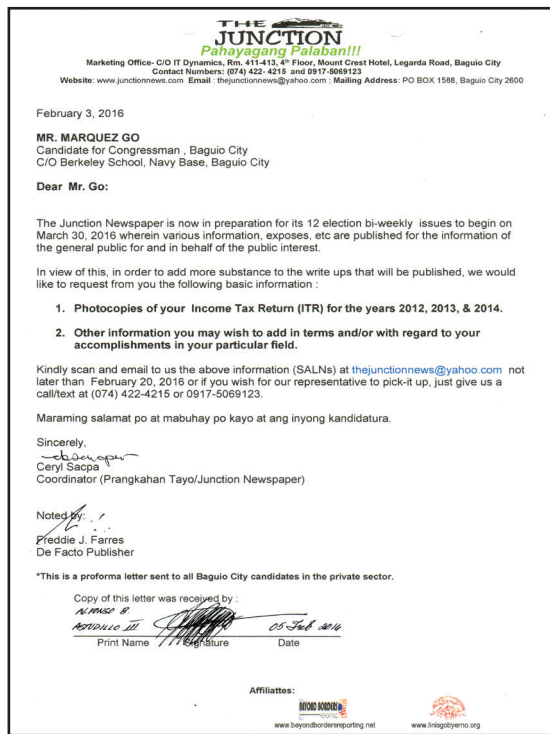

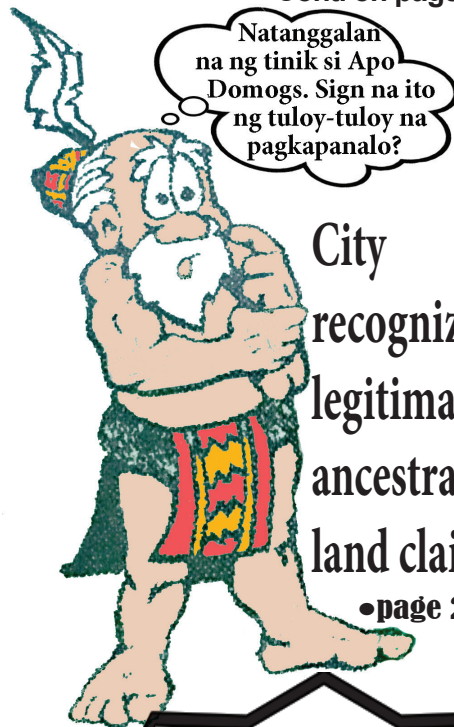


Comelec junks disqualification case filed versus Domogan

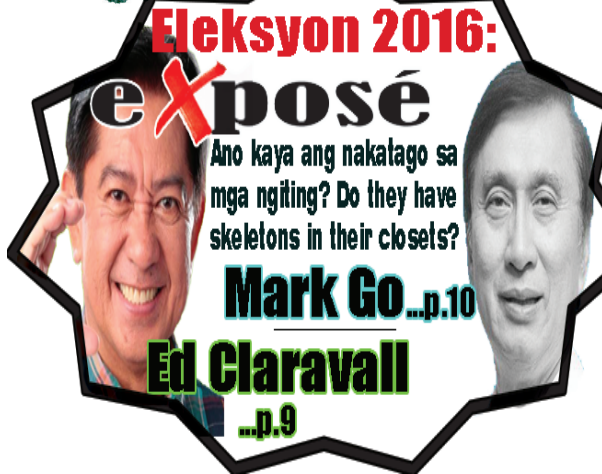

City recognizes legitimate ancestral land claims

BAGUIO CITY – The city government recognizes the existence of legitimate ancestral land claims by indigenous peoples living in the different parts of the city pursuant to the pertinent provisions of Republic Act (RA) 8371 or the Indigenous Peoples Rights Act (IPRA), Mayor Mauricio G. Domogan said that while it is true that the city will continue to be governed by its century-old Charter

and that all lands will remain under its townsite reservation, prior vested rights recognized by competent courts and quasai-judicial bodies before the effectivity of the law on November 1997 will remain valid.

He explained that vested rights include, ancestral land claims, road-right-of-way river easements among others that is why those who are found to have encroached on such vested rights for the benefit of the legitimate claimants.

“While we are restricted from our law practice, we continue to provide legal advises to our legitimate ancestral land claimants, especially to our fellow Ibalois, who frequently visit us to solicit our opinion on how to proceed with their claims among other related issues,” Domogan stressed.

It can be recalled that the city objected to the issuance of certificates of ancestral land titles (CALTs) to portions of the Forbes Park, Wright

Park forest reservations, the Loakan airport area and the Bureau of Animal Industry within the Baguio Dairy Farm considering that most of the CALTs that were issued were not part of the Igorot claims recognized by the courts and quasai-judicial bodies before the effectivity of the IPRA.

According to him, even in the proposed amendments to the century-old Charter of the city, one of the salient provisions incorporated in the proposed law is the recognition of the legitimate ancestral land claims pursuant to the provisions of IPRA among other related laws.

He said that what is important now is the close coordination between the city NCIP so that ancestral land applicants will be appropriately screened in order to ascertain whether or not their applications fall within the vested rights that were recognized by the courts and quasai-judicial bodies before the effectivity of IPRA.

Further, he added the passage of the necessary amendments to the City Charter will put an end to the city’s land woes because it will be able to solve the existing boundary dispute between the city and the neighboring Tuba municipality, identify alienable and disposable lands and put in order to classification of lands in the different parts of the city as well as how the same will be disposed.

Domogan called on individuals wanting to purchase lands in the

Solutions to garbage problem always prioritized

BAGUIO CITY The city government always prioritized short, medium and long-term solutions to the city’s garbage solid waste problems since the present administration assumed the leadership on June 30, 2010.

Mayor Mauricio G. Domogan cited the previous administration was not successful in the implementation of the appropriate interventions that could have solved the city’s garbage woes, thus, it was passed on to his administration prompting him to formulate the possible approaches that would prevent the proliferation of garbage on the city’s streets and barangays.

He said that when he took over as local chief executive in 2010, the hauling cost of garbage from the city to the Capas engineered sanitary landfill in Tarlac was around P3,400 per ton and the city was bringing out over 160 tons per day.

“We always prioritized appropriate solutions to our city’s solid waste management concern because it had placed us in a bad light previously and we do not want the same situation to happen during our watch. We will not stop looking for permanent solutions to the city’s garbage disposal problem for the benefit of the present and future generations,” Domogan stressed.

In order to compel residents to help in solving the city’s garbage problem then, the city government mandated households to segregate their garbage at source to help in significantly reducing the volume of garbage being hauled out of the city and lessen the government expenses on the hauling of waste to Tarlac.

Further, the city government purchased two Environmental Recycling System (ERS) machines that were used to convert some 48 tons of biodegradable waste to compost fertilizer and such machines are still operational to date contrary to false allegations by his critics that the multi-million peso units of equipment are no longer operational.

In fact, he added the city government is ready to sell the treated compost fertilizer to interested buyers by next month considering that a machine was installed to remove the plastic s that were included in the compost fertilizer produced by the ERS machines.

For the past six years, Domogan revealed the city government was able to purchase 12

different barangays to first verify and validate the status of the lands they intend to buy before releasing the necessary payments required from them so that they can be updated on what will be the status of the properties that they want to own to prevent further complications in the future.

Under the old City Charter, the lands in the city are within in the townsite reservations and the disposal of the alienable and disposable lands is through the townsite sales application filed with the AO 504 clearing committee./Dexter A. See

brand new dump trucks and 2 compactors in order to improve the collection of garbage in the different barangays and prevent garbage from being scattered in streets and barangays that would again put the city in a bad light.

As one of the long-term solutions to the city’s garbage disposal woes,

Cordillera has 906,162 registered voters for May polls

BAGUIO CITY- The Commission on Elections (Comelec)- Cordillera reported a total of 906,162 registered voters in the region who are qualified to vote in May 9, 2016 polls.

Benguet has the most voters with 204,497 followed by Abra with 156,968; Baguio with 147,794; Kalinga with 121,375; Ifugao with 112,328; Mountain Province with 98,333 and Apayao with 64,867.

There are also 9,656 persons with disability (PWD) who registered and are eligible to vote. 3,336 are in the province of Abra; 2,633 in Kalinga; 1,479 in Ifugao; 843 in Benguet; Apayao 835 in Apayao; 530 in Mountain Province and 192 in Baguio City.

Of the total, 1,115 have physical disability, 280 for hearing loss, 200 with speech impairment and 819 visually-impaired.

Lawyer Vanessa Roncal, Comelec assistant regional director, is advising the electorate to be early to check their names in their respective precincts. Voting starts at 6:00AM and closes at 5:00PM.

She recommends for voters to bring along their list or "codigo" on the candidates they will vote to cut on time looking at the long lists of candidates.

Roncal also reminds that cell phones are not allowed in the voting precincts and vote receipts are also not allowed to be brought out of the precincts.

"We should be vigilant and report any unlawful acts committed by the candidates, supporters and the voters so that we will have an honest, orderly, peaceful elections", Roncal stated. (JDP/JBZ-PIA CAR)

Hog raisers ordered to construct septic tanks

BAGUIO CITY- Some 32 backyard hog raisers in barangay Holy Ghost Extension agreed to construct standard quality septic tanks in order to prevent the waste being generated from their piggeries from being willfully dumped in the tributaries of the Balili river that causes pollution.

During a meeting presided over by Mayor Mauricio G. Domogan and representatives from the different offices of the city government, the concerned backyard hog raisers agreed to the proposal of the local chief executive for them to construct their own standard septic tanks to serve as the outlet of their piggeries.

Furthermore, CEPMO was given three days to provide the backyard hog raisers with the appropriate design of the standard quality septic tanks in their compounds in order to minimize the pollution of the tributaries of the Balili river.

Domogan cited the hog raisers will be given one month from Tuesday to build their own septic tanks

At the same time, a monitoring team composed of representatives from the City Health Office, CEPMO, Holy Ghost Extension Barangay Council, the affected backyard hog raisers and the complaining residents.

Mayor Domogan expressed that piggeries in populated areas of the city is prohibited, thus, hog raisers must institute the construction of septic tanks to cater to the volume of waste generated by the piggeries to avoid continuous foul odor emanating from such piggeries.

He appealed to the owners of backyard piggeries to cooperate with the stringent regulations imposed by the barangays and the city government to avoid the subsequent closure of such piggeries that would deprive them their additional source of income./ Dexter A. See

Save Baguio's heritage sites - Vergara

"We should save Baguio's heritage sites and other areas that hold importance for our city's residents for the future."

Thus said former Baguio Representative Bernardo Vergara during a barangay meeting where he said that we should preserve many heritage sites in Baguio, not only for their importance as they are as traditional sites, but also for their historical significance.

"There are many places in Baguio that need protection, not only from unneeded 'development', but more to keep them in their natural or

former state as heritage sites," he pointed out.

"Marami ang ganyan dito. One is the BIBAK-dormitory, which should be restored to its original purpose -that is to provide shelter to our indigenous sons and daughters -

who are from elsewhere in the Cordillera, but who are studying here in Baguio, para hindi naman sila mahirapan sa pagbo-board nila sa siyudad natin. As for our brother informal settlers who have been occupying the area, importante na mailapat sila sa iba at tamang lugar. Dito nga po papasok ang napapanahong housing program para mabigyan ng respetadong pabahay ang mga nangangailangan. Kapag mamarapatin ay tutulungan ko ang city government na mailapatupad ang programang pabahay na abot-kaya at mayroong livelihood and

job opportunities. Ang aking simpleng paniwala ay bigyang bagong buhay ang mga kapatid natin para magkabahay," Vergara stressed.

"Sa usapin naman ng ating post office, naniniwala din ako that it must also be preserved as a heritage site, given its part in Baguio's history. Pero, anuman ang restoration at renovation ay dapat ikonsulta sa may-ari ng lugar, ang Philippine Postal Authority. At the very least, linisin natin ang architectural façade, but again, as a major decision of its owner, which we must respect," he continued.

"As for the Baden Powell Hall, which housed the Philippine Commission that held sessions here in Baguio and which gave our city its charter, malungkot na isipin na nasa private ownership ang lugar. Siguro, we should make appropriate representations with the owner to encourage its preservation," Vergara suggested.

"Let us not forget, however, that these are local government concerns, and when espoused as your next congressman, let us respect our local government decisions," he added./The Junction News Team

Benguet Sanggunian now into digitized legislative data bank

LA TRINIDAD, Benguet - The Sangguniang Panlalawigan (SP) is now into the digitization and indexing of legislative measures which eases tracking, retrieval and accessing of records online and ultimately aids better and improved service.

Newly installed SP Secretary Atty. Brian Crispin said the digitization of all ordinances and resolutions is anchored on the office's mandate to inform the public of its services.

It was incumbent Vice Governor Nelson Dangwa's vision to come up with a digitized data bank of legislative measures but has come into realization just recently, Crispin said.

The project dubbed, e-legislative Computer Research Data Bank, aims to digitize all ordinances and resolutions from 1967 to 2013 including the creation and development of a computer program to manage such records. To date documents, encoded were from 1997 to this year.

It has two features, tracking and the data base of resolutions and ordinances. The tracking system shows the progress of the measure until the completed

staff work and reaches the end-user. The data base system shows the archived measures, according to SP Administrative Officer I Gusvaliani Bolisli who manages the said records.

Now on its first phase which started last quarter last year, it is now operational but accessible only within the SP.

The future plan of this continuing endeavor is to make it online and accessible not only within the capitol premises but

to clientele such as the municipal local governments, provincial offices and provincial departments.

It will eventually be open to the public for easy access as they plan to put up a desk once they transfer to the Provincial Capitol Building II, according to Crispin.

There are also plans of archiving data as early as 1945 while Benguet was still part of the old Mountain Provinces. (JDP/SCA-PIA-CAR, Benguet)

Tito F. Guia, Arthur D. Lim, Ma. Rowena Amelia V. Guanzon and Sheriff M. Abas, the petition for disqualification filed by Jose M. Molintas against Mayor Mauricio G. Domogan did not present substantial pieces of evidence that would warrant the positive action of the Commission, thus, the subsequent dismissal of the same for lack of merit.

The resolution stated that the commission of the unlawful acts of the respondent should have been committed during the election period pursuant to the provisions of Section 68 of the Omnibus Election code (OEC), otherwise, unlawful acts committed outside the prescribed election period are not considered election offenses.

The commission cited that assuming for arguendo, that the act complained against Domogan constitutes giving of prohibitive donations under Section 104 of the OEC, it is still does not warrant the disqualification of the local chief executive as it was committed outside of the campaign period.

Further, Molintas in his petition admitted that violation of Section 261(o) of the OEC is not a ground for disqualification under Section 68, however, he claims that by using the property of the Lions Club in Burnham Park for free, Domogan committed some other grounds for disqualification under the OEC.

The Commission noted that the allegations that Domogan violated Section 95(d) and Section 68(c) of the OEC were matters that were brought up for the first time in petitioner's memorandum, as they were never raised in the petition., thus, petitioner should not be allowed to raise new matter ins his memorandum, for the main purpose of the memorandum is merely to expound the previously raised grounds contained in the petition. "To do so constitutes substantial amendment to the petition, thus, this may only be done with leave of the Commission. For reasons of fair play, justice and due process, this Commission cannot pass upon the said questions," the resolution stated.

The Commission cited that respondent's alleged solicitation of the participation of the barangay officials of Irisan is not a ground for his disqualification and contrary to petitioners claim, it cannot be considered as vote-buying.

The resolution asserted that vote-buying is committed when a person has given money or other material consideration to another in order to induce him to vote for against any candidate and in the case filed by the petitioner, the evidence presented against the respondent failed to establish that respondent gave money to the barangay officials of Irisan for the purpose of buying their votes.

"This Commission finds no reason to depart from the assailed resolution of the second division," the resolution stated.

The en banc resolution was no longer appealed to the Court of Appeals (CA) by the petitioner rendering the same final./Dexter A. See

Despite the failure to certify the voting system before the JCOC, Brillantes on Friday allayed fears over the poll body's "deficiencies."

"Defects and deficiencies will always be encountered, and non-compliance of some mandatory requirements of the law will not render the entire process null and void," Brillantes said in a statement.

Brillantes, for one, agreed that the TEC certification is mandatory under the law.

The former elections chief, however, said that the lack of a TEC report "will not render the elections null and void."

In a phone interview with Rappler, Brillantes said, "Since hindi nagawa, anong gagawin mo do'n? Hindi itutuloy ang eleksyon dahil walang TEC report?" (Since it was not accomplished, what will you do with that? Will we not push through with the elections because there's no TEC report?)

"Wala namang kasalanan ang tao," he added. (It's not the people's fault.)

He said critics can always run after the Comelec over this requirement after the May 9 elections.

For one, he said, they can file an administrative case against Comelec officials over certain deficiencies.

Before pointing out the lack of a TEC report, Larrazabal also criticized the Comelec for pushing for mall voting, as well as a rule allowing replacement ballots on election day. On Larrazabal's criticisms, Brillantes said former Comelec

members "should not be too publicity conscious in criticizing deficiencies of any current commission."

"The better alternative is for former Comelec officials to meet with the incumbents and assist in solving problems and deficiencies instead of picturing oneself as seemingly knowledgeable of everything on election matters," he added./ Paterno Esmaguil II / Rappler.com

On the Issue of Legalization of Irregularly-Issued Franchises for Public Utility Vehicles (Part 2)

In failing to pass Proposed Resolution Nr. PR 0042-10 sponsored by Atty. Richard Cariño in the City Council in 2010, aiming to recommend to the LTRFB the legalization of thousands of franchises issued by the LTRFB-CAR during the period of moratorium from 1996 onwards, the City Council deprived its constituents of the one speedy and infallible solution to their big problem of being conveyed by thousands of public utility vehicles (mostly taxis) with illegal franchises --- a problem existing only in our city or region.

Thanks but no thanks to Councilors BALAJADIA, TABANDA, BAGBAGEN and Vice Mayor BILOG who led the continuing assault against the passage of Atty. Cariño's proposed resolution, banking merely on the mistaken belief that "irregularly- issued franchises cannot possibly be legalized."

Atty. Bagbagen had even the temerity to say that the Councilors would be answerable to the Ombudsman were they to pass the proposed measure. I said to myself then, how could that be when the Council would only be recommending the legalization to the LTRFB. Coming from a would-be candidate for the position of Vice Mayor, the argument was "mababaw kaya!" Then there was Vice Mayor Bilog who had the gall to tell Mayor Domogan (when I sought the latter's help on the issue) that he was not allowing the proposed resolution because the private proponent of legalization, Atty. Valeros, was allegedly collecting huge sums of money from operators signifying for legalization. To my mind, how could a P500 worth of voluntary contribution from few operators be a relevant consideration by a Presiding Chair of a Council in not allowing a proposed resolution to pass? "Mababaw rin kaya!" It appears that the Councilors had other reasons for denying passage of the proposed resolution like perhaps, the absence of lobby money.

In retrospect, had they only relented in their mistaken view that "irregularly-issued franchises cannot possibly be legalized" (because the truth is LTRFB has been legalizing irregularly-issued franchises such as lately the illegal vehicles-for-hire vans in CAR being legalized or converted to UV Express Service) the legalization as proposed could have been had in less than one year from passage of the proposed resolution, similarly as the legalization of illegal taxis in 1999 as recommended by the City Council in its Resolution Numbered 323, S. of 1999 which passed in the Council in a record time of less than one month.

The perennial problem we have with our City Council in Baguio is that it has always been composed of enduring or long lasting members (continuously running for re-election, that's why) individually behaving during Council sessions like grandstanding demigods but who, in the end, are all conspiring in the passage of measures, for gain. This is what I see in my dealings with the City Council whenever I submit issues or proposals in my advocacies for the consideration of the council such as the legalization of irregularly-issued franchises.

This is one reason why I am opting for a change in the composition of the City Council and hoping
