# Mayor Vows Sustained, Extensive Drive vs. Illegal Vending

BAGUIO CITY – Mayor Mauricio Domogan on Wednesday vowed that the on-going crackdown on illegal vending will be sustained and will extend from the confines of the city market to other notorious vending areas all over the city.

The mayor said that from the on-going clearing operations at the city market, the city will also tackle other hot vending areas like Magsaysay Avenue, Lakandula, Harrison, Mabini, Governor Pack roads and even in Camp John Hay and Baguio General Hospital and locations frequented by ambulant vendors.

This is to rid the city unauthorized vending activities and illegal stalls and other obstructions and give the sidewalks backs to pedestrians.

"It has come to a point that we must do it. We are asking for the vendors' understanding and the people's total cooperation. This is the law and we have to implement it for the good of the majority," the mayor said.

The clearing drive, meanwhile, continued at the city market targeting illegal stalls and structures put

## 17-Year Old Girl Pleads for Help to Sustain Hemodialysis

If only she were a scion of the rich, Shaly Cris Bantas' transfer to Baguio might be counted as a statistic for "medical tourism", a link that may be unkind even if, indeed, the country's summer capital is also the medical center of northern and even central Luzon.

Like many others from other places who are similarly situated, the lanky teen-ager from Quirino, Ilocos Sur has been here since last March in a continuous struggle to survive. She has to be close to the Baguio General Hospital and Medical Center where she undergoes blood-cleansing treatment hemodialysis three times a week, on the 3:00 p.m.-8:00 p.m. schedule every Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

Home is where they take out in, and her maternal aunt, Jocelyn Degay, a housewife and mother of four, took her in at her home at Purok 21, Sariling Sikap, Irian Barangay.

Jocelyn, whose husband Frankie is a laborer in stonewall construction, now and then weaves and sells Igorot fabric to augment the family income and help send their kids to school. Jessica, 19, is in 4<sup>th</sup> year civil engineering at the University of Baguio. Rizaldy, 17, is freshman, also in civil engineering at UB. Janice is first year at the Pines City National High while Juvy, 5, is in the first grade.

As per clinical abstract issued by the BGHMC, Shaly Cris began her hemodialysis sessions last March 18, after she was diagnosed for end-stage kidney failure. At P2,200 per session or P6,600 a week, the cost of hemodialysis offered by the BGHMC is one of the cheapest hereabouts. It has made its renal center the busiest hereabouts, serving 179 patients from all over the Cordillera and neighboring regions as of last March.

It would be physically and financially taxing for her to commute to and from the family home in Lamag, Quirino. Ilocos Sur for her treatment. Her initial treatments were shouldered by her father, Christopher, who worked as an electrician in Dubai to raise her and two other daughters – Leony Rose and Jeanelyn.

"My dad is back home working again as a farmer," Shaly Cris said last Tuesday afternoon, when she signed a document allowing the publication of her medical plight, so Samaritans out there would know and be able to reach out to her.

"Prior to Shaly Cris' ... sufferings, life (was) considered smoothly sailing (as the) income of her father as an electrician in Dubai could sufficiently provide the family's basic needs," wrote social welfare aide Evelyn El-I in a social case study report she prepared to enable the girl to seek fund support to sustain her treatment. "Since 2010, when Sally Cris became ill, both income of parents and savings of her grandfather as barangay captain had been gradually exhausted."

El-I also noted that Shaly Cris' family "is well-known in their active participation in the Anglican church. Members of the family are refined and actively participate in any group activity conducted in the community."

The social worker joined the family in its appeal for assistance from agencies and individuals.

## Santiago Eyes Resolution to Ban Flashy Sona Outfits

Senator Miriam Defensor-Santiago sure knows how to make her presence felt despite her absence at the State of the Nation Address (SONA) Monday.

Even if she was still on sick leave a day after SONA, Santiago reveals a plan to file a resolution which would prescribe an official uniform for solons attending SONAs in the future.

"I watched TV and could not stand it. The SONA event should be a serious time for the Congress to pick up policy directions indicated by the President," Santiago said.

"It should not be treated as Oscar night in Hollywood, with a red carpet, where peacocks spread their tails and turn around and around, as coached by media in a feeding frenzy," she added.

In the last few years, the feisty senator decried how lady lawmakers and senators, even their spouses, showed off their dresses produced by designers.

She noted the spotlight about SONA should be put on President Benigno "Noy" Aquino III, not on the flashy women or men parading on the red carpet.

"The highlight of the SONA is the President. It is not the flashy women. Now the flaky men are even getting into the act," Santiago said.

"They also parade, sometimes with photogenic arm candy, into the session hall and preen like their female counterparts. Enough!" she pointed out.

This prompted her to file a resolution prescribing an official uniform for Congress members to prevent lawmakers from reducing their position to mere "endorers of expensive designers."

Santiago reminded lawmakers that the law frowns on conspicuous consumption which she called "the obsession to bling."

Citing Article 25 of the Civil Code, Santiago said thoughtless extravagance in expenses for pleasure or display public events may be stopped by order of the courts "at the instance of any government or private charitable institution."

She insisted that clothes should simply put distinction on the members of Senate and House of Representatives from those who are not.

Santiago suggested women to wear short pencil skirt, paired with a simple-sleeved barong blouse that can be accentuated with a single strand of Philippine pearls.

The veteran senator added that men should be a plain long-sleeved barong, noting both men and women could wear a ceremonial ribbon with the Congress logo.

She added those attending SONA in the gallery must wear an office attire.

"Most important of all, the attitude should not be frivolous and giggly. The attitude should be serious and businesslike," Santiago said.

Santiago clarified she is very proud of local fabrics and designers, who reinvent Filipino traditional dresses and costumes.

"Don't get me wrong. I am very proud of our local fabrics and our local designers, some of whom are world-class. But the SONA event is not the proper venue for their talents," she explained. / *By Rio Rose Ribaya | Yahoo! Southeast Asia Newsroom*

## City to Fast-Track Led Project

BAGUIO CITY – The city government needs to fast-track the streetlight replacement and management project using the Light Emitting Diode (LED) technology after the Benguet Electric Cooperative Inc. (BENECO) admitted it is hard up in maintaining the city's streetlights.

Mayor Mauricio Domogan on Wednesday said the BENECO officials informed him that they have been incurring losses in the maintenance of the city's streetlights but they will keep the deal as part of its corporate responsibility until the city's LED project materializes.

The power firm requested the city to hasten the LED project, to which the mayor said the city will abide.

The city and the BENECO last February entered into an agreement that authorized the power firm to take over the management and operation of the city's streetlights.

Since then, BENECO has been managing the city's streetlights and paid the equivalent of 12 burning hours of electric consumption for unmetered streetlights.

Under the agreement, the power firm assumed duties and all liabilities in administering the streetlights and lighting fixtures.

The LED project is still being facilitated using the approved terms of reference (TOR) as per Resolution No. 446. The deal aims to cut down on the city government's power costs which now run to P42.32 million per year for a total of 8,200 lighting fixtures lighting streets, alleys, parks, overpasses and flyovers plus P24.08 million for the lighting of government offices and schools by commissioning a qualified company to replace and manage all streetlights, park lights, including lights in overpasses, flyovers and City Government owned buildings and facilities with LED bulbs and repair and the maintenance on a private-public partnership and a cost-saving share scheme.

The winning company is expected to undertake replacement at no expense to the city within six months upon signing of the contract and to take charge of the repair and maintenance of all installed LED lighting equipment for a period of 12 years. / *A Refuerzo*

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## Lawmaker Bats for Cedula Abolition

Senator Chiz Escudero is pushing for the scrapping of the cedula saying it has long lost its significance and value in the present age.

Escudero filed Senate Bill Number 1082 (S.B.N. 1082) abolishing the use of cedula or the community tax certificate as a form of identification. The cedula is required when, as among others, one acknowledges a document before a notary public, takes an oath of office or is appointed to a government position.

The senator said the cedula is already useless to people of today as several other regular proof of identifications are already available and are more competent evidence of identity such as passport, driver's license and other government-issued identification cards.

"The cedula now proves to be an unnecessary burden imposed on our people who are required to present it when doing public transactions. It was deemed useless by our forebears during the colonial times, it is more so today".

The cedula was first implemented as a 19<sup>th</sup> century tax reform in the Philippines during the Spanish rule. After the tribute system or head tax to Spain was abolished, the cedula was issued to all Filipinos upon payment of a residence tax.

In 1896, katipuneros led by Andres Bonifacio tore up their cedula in defiance of Spanish rule in Balintawak. It was what is now known as the Cry of Pugad Lawin that signaled the beginning of the Philippine Revolution.

At the same time, the bill seeks to repeal the provisions of Republic Act No. 7160, the Local Government Code of 1991, giving powers to local government units to impose residence tax. The cedula serves as proof of one's payment of community tax.

"Abolishing the cedula practice is also like scrapping a relic of our colonial past. Yes, we must always look back at our past to know where we are going, but the cedula is a thing of the past that should already be buried for its obsolescence" Escudero said./

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## Peace and Order Council

### Reorganized

**BAGUIO CITY** - To enhance the city's thrust and direction on the peace and order in reducing crime rate in the city, Mayor Mauricio Domogan reorganized the City Peace and Order Council (CPOC) by issuing Administrative Order No. 83, series of 2013.

This is to ensure more comprehensive and effective coordination of government efforts and the active participation of citizenry relative to the conduct of national campaign against criminality and insurgency.

Said Administrative Order asserts that "the preservation and maintenance of peace and order is a prime concern of government, both national and local, necessitating the establishment of peace and order councils in all levels of government. It is the sworn duty of local officials, prosecutors, law enforcers and other government officers and employees tasked with the preservation of peace and order to help and coordinate in the efficient and effective enforcement of the laws and the administration of justice."

The Mayor Domogan will chair the CPOC with Vice Mayor as the Vice-Chairman and the members are Councilor Roberto Ortega being the head of the Committee on Human Rights, Justice and Peace and Order; City Director Jesus Cambay, Jr. Other members include the City Prosecutor, City Social Welfare and Development Officer, City Administrator, District Engineer, Head of Philippine Information Agency, Regional Directors or duly authorized representatives of the Commission of Human Rights-CAR, National Bureau of Investigation-CAR, National Police Commission-CAR, Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency-CAR and Criminal Investigation Detention Group-CAR, President of the Association of Barangay Councils and Baguio Correspondents and Broadcasters Club, and representatives of Religious Sector and Senior Citizens Sector.

## COMELEC Prepares for October 2013 Brgy. And SK Elections

**BAGUIO CITY** - With the recent national and local election and the newly elected officials already started their mandate, the Commission on Election (COMELEC) is again getting ready for the upcoming 2013 Synchronized Barangay and Sangguniang Kabataan (SK) Elections scheduled this October 28.

Acting Election Officer Anita Navalta informed the barangay officials during the special general assembly of the Liga ng mga Barangay last July 23 at the Sangguniang Panlungsod Session Hall that the special registration of new voters, transferees and those delisted from the COMELEC list already started last July 22 and will end on July 31. Considering that COMELEC is understaffed and a big number of registrants flock in their office, Navalta added that registration time is from 8 A.M. until 8 P.M.

She also requested the barangay officials to mobilize and encourage qualified voters in their respective barangays to register on time or earlier than the scheduled deadline to avoid last minute rush.

"Qualified SK Voters must be between 15 and below 8 years of age by the day of election and must be a resident of the area where they will be voting (at list 6 months before election day). SK voters must bring their birth and baptismal certificates, school records or any other proof of identity," said Acting Election Officer Navalta.

Filing of certificates of candidacy will be on October 15 up to 17 from 8AM to 5PM.

October 18 to 26 will be the campaign period and the election day is on October 28 from 7AM up to 3PM only. Canvassing will be on the barangay level only.

COMELEC Baguio-Benguet Election Supervisor Atty. Elenita Tabangin-Capuyan explained that based on COMELEC Resolution No. 9739 promulgated last July 10, 2013, "to require all local government units (LGUs) to set aside such amounts as may be necessary to augment the appropriations of the Commission for the conduct of the 2013 Barangay and SK Elections, which in no case shall be less than P10,000 but not more than 10% of the general fund of barangays which have been reserved and set aside for the SK".

"Candidates are required to file their sworn statements of election contributions and expenditures on November 27", stressed Navalta./Jho Arranz

## Mayor Reconstitutes Baguio City Housing and Urban Development Board

**BAGUIO CITY** - The city government of Baguio under the leadership of Mayor Mauricio Domogan took the responsibility and is committed to give the highest priority to the alleviation of poverty by implementing an integrated and comprehensive citywide development program by issuing Administrative Order No. 85.

It is the objective of Republic Act No. 7229 also known as the "Urban Development and Housing Act of 1992" to improve the capability of Local Government Units (LGUs) in undertaking urban development and housing programs and projects.

Section 39 of the act states that "the LGUs shall be charged with the implementation of this act in their respective localities, in coordination with the Housing and Urban Development Coordinating Council, the national housing agencies, the Presidential Commission for the Urban Poor, the private sector and other non-government organizations. They shall prepare a comprehensive land use plan for their respective localities in accordance with the provision of this act".

Thus, Mayor Domogan reconstituted the Baguio City Housing and Urban Development Board to be chaired by the mayor with Councilor Leandro Yangot, Jr. as action officer. Members of the said board are OIC Engr. Evelyn Cayat of the City Planning and Development Office, OIC Arch. Johnny Degay of the City Buildings and Architecture Office, City Social Welfare and Development Officer Betty Fangasan, City Assessor Nilda Navarro, and representatives from the HUDCC, HLURB-CAR, NHA-Region 1/CAR, DENR-CAR, PCUP, Urban Poor Organization and Non-Government Organization.

It is the function of the board to initiate the context of the decentralization program of the national government, the city's own program for the provision of affordable housing to low-income families; to formulate the city's housing and urban development policies; to review the city's housing development plan and program; to establish linkages with concerned government offices as regards national housing programs vis-a-vis city government efforts towards community level housing programs; to enhance, stimulate and muster full participation of the private sector especially in low-income housing programs through tax incentives/exemptions and other related incentives and opportunities provided by law; to establish a city data bank on housing related subjects for ready reference and retrieval of information and statistical data and; to monitor and evaluate the implementation of the housing and urban development projects of the city./Jho Arranz

# Stoning whistle-blowers

Photos of well-coiffed legislators, at President Aquino's State of the Nation Address, will cram Tuesday's media. Fine. But keep those festering issues up front, too. Take whistle-blowers.

Benhur Luy ripped the P10-billion pork of five senators and 23 congressmen. This humongous serving of taxpayer money had been funneled into 20 bogus nongovernment organizations. Luy owes the American activist Ralph Nader. In the 1970s, Nader cobbled "whistle-blower" to tag those who expose sleaze.

Luy alleged he had been detained by the scam's brains. Janet Lim-Napoles, of JLN Corp., sued Luy. Thursday, Luy badgered for—and got—provisional Witness Protection Program shield. If a warrant of arrest is served, the justice department will inform Pasig's Judge Danilo Buemio that Luy is under government protection, Justice Secretary Leila de Lima said.

When whistle-blowers end up as accused, it's time to ask: Is today's policy to canonize thieves as crusaders? Indeed, "governments must create an environment

**EDITORIAL** that encourages, instead of penalizes, citizens who denounce venality," urged the 9th International Anti-Corruption meeting in South Africa. The Philippines and 134 other countries cobbled that yardstick.

Remember "Deep Throat"? In 1972, this whistle-blower slipped to Washington Post data on White House involvement in the Watergate scandal. The uproar led to jail terms for five White House officials. Richard Nixon wrote a one-sentence letter: "I resign as President of the United States."

Vanity Fair magazine, 31 years later, reported "Deep Throat" was former Federal Bureau of Investigation associate director Mark Felt. The Post's executive editor during Watergate, Benjamin Bradlee, confirmed the report.

We have our share of "Deep Throats." Banker Clarissa Ocampo testified that Joseph Estrada signed the notorious Jose Velarde account—which she refused to certify. Threats cascaded in. Auditor Heidi Mendoza testified on her documentation of a P510-million theft by the AFP Comptroller's Office. Gen. Carlos Garcia has been convicted. But a partisan Commission on Appointments refused to confirm President Aquino's appointment of Mendoza as Commission on Audit commissioner.

"The nail that sticks out gets hammered down," the Filipino axiom warns. Ensign Philip Pestaño bucked in 1997 the misuse of Navy boats to haul illegal lumber and drugs. He was shot in his cabin. Ombudsman Conchita Carpio Morales reinstituted murder charges stalled for decades.

Marian School of Quezon City academic supervisor Antonio Calipjo Go exposed flawed textbooks. False charges were filed against him, and some columnists smeared him.

After Land Bank's Acsa Ramirez blew the whistle on tax scams, NBI agents shoved her into a police lineup which President Gloria Arroyo used for photo op.

Shanghaied by government agents, Rodolfo "Jun" Lozada testified before the Senate how a ZTE broadband loan, for \$132 million, ballooned to \$329 million. The overrun authors of this scam remain scot-free. Still guarded by Catholic nuns today, Lozada is harassed by charges.

Not every whistle-blower is a candidate for beatification. Former police officer Cezar Mancao II, who offered to blow the whistle on the Bubby Dacer murder, bolted NBI custody when courts ordered his transfer to jail.

Remember Mary "Rosebud" Ong? She blew the whistle on intelligence officers sloshing in narcotics trade.

Vidal Doble, of the Intelligence Service of the Armed Forces of the Philippines, revealed tampering the "Garci" tapes.

Primitivo Mijares was one of Ferdinand Marcos' chief propagandists. He wrote the book "Conjugal Dictatorship" and testified against the dictatorship. Mijares disappeared in 1977 and his 15-year-old son was later found murdered.

Auditors are constitutional whistle-blowers. The COA has gone through pork barrel funds from 2007 to 2009, Chair Maria Grace Pulido-Tan revealed. Funds squandered already exceed P10 billion. Both administration and opposition legislators splurged. The COA's next report will identify more legislators who squirreled taxes in dubious NGOs. "Whoever will be hit will be hit," she said. "But what can we do?" More of the same, please.

"Both the kind and extent of support that a legitimate whistle-blower should be able to expect remains unclear," says an earlier Asian Institute of Management study titled "Whistle-blowing in the Philippines: Awareness, Attitudes and Structures." "An explicit policy that will govern whistle-blowing" is needed.

Whistle-blowers who tell the truth make corruption a high-risk activity, Dr. Romulo Miral wrote in the AIM study. But the absence of a legal framework makes the personal costs of whistle-blowing very high. It is sometimes a "matter of life and death," the study noted.

Tell that to the family of Dacer. The PR man never made his appointment to brief former President Fidel Ramos on scams involving government. He and driver Emmanuel Corbito were intercepted by 22 military agents in Makati. Blindfolded, then strangled, their bodies were burned in Indang, Cavite.

Thieves are lionized, not ostracized, here. Cash ushers them to first places at tables. Those in a position to adopt reforms are often the very persons whistles are blown at. Would Senators Ramon Bong Revilla, Juan Ponce Enrile, Jinggoy Estrada, Ferdinand Marcos Jr. and Gringo Honasan ever scrap the pork barrel? "Ti uwak uray adigos, nagisit lata," an Ilocano proverb says. "Though a crow bathes, it

### INSIDE STORY ON CEB PAC SETTLEMENT

**FULL SETTLEMENT**—A few days ago, a team coming from head office of **Cebu Pacific** in Manila flew to **Davao City** and met at a downtown hotel with a group of passengers of **Flight 5J 971**. After some preliminaries, checks were given each to the passengers present that day. And they voluntarily signed quit claims or waivers so both parties could put total closure to an unfortunate incident and move on. The amount written on each check represents financial assistance and in full settlement of that incident last June 2 when the Cebu Pacific aircraft, upon landing during a rainy day, skidded out of the runway of the **Davao International Airport** and stuck its nose on the mud. Some **165** passengers, although no one was physically injured, suffered from shock and others obviously traumatized—and angry—because of the incident.

Last Thursday, about five weeks after the incident, the Cebu Pacific team met with the initial group of passengers in Davao City and informed them of a financial assistance that would be given equally to all 165 passengers. Since not all the 165 passengers were there last Thursday, Cebu Pacific also announced that it would schedule releases on other days so the rest of the passengers could receive their own checks, if they so wish.

**NON-DISCLOSURE CLAUSE**—I was in Manila that day when **Andrew Bautista**, president of the "**Flight 5J 971 Crash Victims Association**" and **Atty. Robert de Leon**, the group's legal counsel met with its members at Royal Mandaya Hotel in Davao City and announced to the media that a fair and satisfactory settlement had been forged with the airline company. When asked about the amount, the group which earlier demanded **P1 million** each for the passengers, declined to give details except to say that the amount was "reasonable" and that they were "happy"

**THE AMOUNT**—No sooner had the reporters returned to their respective desks to write their stories when I received, while still in Manila, text messages inquiring whether it was true that I helped "broker the deal". Evidently, someone mentioned my name as having assisted in arriving at a settlement. One flash report said: "A former government official acted as broker", clearly referring to me. Of course, I had no choice but to confirm that indeed, I helped facilitate the settlement. However, I declined to give details as I had to defer to the better judgment of the passengers on agreeing to the non-disclosure clause in their agreement with Cebu Pacific. I am sure rumors about the actual amount involved must now be circulating in the grapevines or in whispers, but nonetheless, the non-disclosure clause must be observed. **METRO CRIMINALS NOW VERY BOLD:** DZRH anchors Deo Macalma ang Ruth Abao on Wednesday, July 24, 2013, correctly expressed their collective fear that criminals in the Metro Manila area have become so bold and brash that they now carry out their crimes, particularly kidnapping and abductions of young boys and girls, in broad daylight, in full view of the public, and near police authorities yet.

The two cited the case of a 15-year old girl who was just waiting for a ride at a very busy intersection in Pasay City the other day when, out of the blue, a taxi named "El Pueblo" stopped near her. Two burly men came out of the vehicle and, without any word, slapped the girl several times, punched her in her abdomen, and then loaded her into the back compartment of the car.

The girl was then brought to a motel in Pasig City, where she was repeatedly raped by her kidnappers, including the taxi driver. Luckily for the girl, however, she was not killed by the criminals. She was left near a funeral parlor where she managed to call her relatives and ask for help. A police operation led to the arrest of two of the criminals subsequently.

**HOW CAN WE ASSURE THE SAFETY OF OUR LOVED ONES?** Macalma and Abao then asked a police official from Pasay City as to what young children should do to avoid being victimized in a similar manner. The policeman said children should never ride taxis alone and should endeavor jot down the plate number and the name of the driver and text these data to their relatives right away.

But then, these pieces of advice really will not solve the problem. The question really is, how can parents be assured that their children could be safe once they get out of their houses? Technically, there is nothing that the parents can do anymore to help their children, once they go out of their houses and go to their schools or to some other places.

Except, of course, to bring them up to the care and protection of God which, by the way, is the only thing that parents can really do for their children nowadays. The times have become so bad that criminality lurks in every corner of the metropolis, and it is clear that police and other government authorities can no longer do anything to protect anyone. The only way therefore is to place all our loved ones under God's protection.

**LISTEN TO, AND OBEY, GOD:** But, how do we do that? Praying is simply not enough. up by itinerant vendors along sidewalks and will include the unauthorized extensions built by even the legitimate traders.

The city has adopted new rules in the light of the campaign including the setting of new vending time of from 5-9 a.m and from 5:30 p.m. onwards. Those who will violate will no longer be allowed to sell at anytime.

The city has also designated specific areas where vending will be allowed on said allowable hours and will prohibit selling totally in certain areas like Zandueta St. and the front and back of the Maharlika Livelihood Center, among others.

Beginning August 1, the city will revoke all the special permits earlier granted the vendors and will scrap the color-coding scheme.

The mayor said the reforms are needed to put back order at the city market after years of tolerance by the city and abuse by the vendors.

He said the city has given the vendors too much leeway but this was met with wanton disregard of the city's rules particularly on the payment of the dues, the putting up of stalls and the upkeep of the vending areas.

"Many have not been cooperating and were looking only after their own interests. Many were not paying their dues and had the gall to put up permanent stalls with some even subleasing their extensions. They have also neglected the maintenance of cleanliness in their spaces as if it is the city's obligation to clean up after them," the mayor lamented.

The mayor said the city has to put a plug to these abuses. "I'm sure they know that the privilege granted to them is not permanent and the city can take that away anytime," he said. "We can just appeal to them for understanding and cooperation."

The crackdown started the other week and enforced by combined elements from the city treasury office, the public order and safety division, the Baguio City Market Task Force and the Baguio City Police Office.

The affected traders flocked to the city council last Monday and appealed for reconsideration and for a consultation promising to cooperate with the city.

The BCMA last Wednesday accommodated the vendors for a dialogue where they aired their sentiments leading to some adjustments in the vending hours but the mayor said the city stood by its decision to pursue the clearing drive.

The mayor encouraged vendors who will be displaced to join the night market which he said has become a good source of livelihood for many since becoming a hit among tourists.

He also warned politicians taking advantage of the situation to gain the vendors' favor for their political ambitions saying people know their ulterior motive.

"To politicians taking advantage of the situation to make people indebted to them, better watch out. It is very clear what their interest is and people are aware of it," he said. /A Refuerzo

## City Opens own Seed Bank

BAGUIO CITY – the city government thru the City environment and Parks Management Office has opened a local seed bank here. CEPMO Officer Cordelia Lacsamana Monday officially called on City Officials to witness the very first Bio-Resource Center put up in city hall last July 22.

The center which is a show window of the city's core thrusts in green governance is intended to advocate among city hall employees and the public the importance of environmental protection and sustainability.

The center will also serve as a seed bank for those who want to donate fruit and plant seeds and a green bank for the adoption and donation of plants and tree seedlings.

The Bio-resource center is located beside the CEPMO office which is the most polluted side due to the acceleration of vehicles going up.

'The center which is also a buffer garden is designed to help shield city hall from smoke emission coming from this vehicles,' Assistant CEPMO Officer Ruben Cervantes said.

The garden also features a botanical gallery where life stages of the Pine tree is presented.

It is adorned with exotic plants and flowers where the by-product organic fertilizer from the Environmental Recycling System (ERS) machines are being used and tested for its efficacy alongside the sludge coming from the city's Sewer Treatment Plant (STP).

Mayor Mauricio Domogan said the organic fertilizer can also be used by interested parties most especially the barangays in their roadside gardens.

The garden is also equipped with a gutter cistern which will be used as a rain water harvesting facility, a mulching area for garden waste and a vermi-bin.

The launching the Bio-Resource Center was earmarked by the ceremonial planting of Pine Seedlings by city officials and employees around city hall to kick-off the planting of more than fifteen thousand trees in support of the national greening program of the government./Paul Rillorta

Domogan said, 'the re-organization is aimed towards including those whose technical knowledge and expertise are vital in the realization of the program geared towards strengthening the twinning and sisterhood ties of the city within the Philippines and overseas.'

Meantime, Vice mayor Daniel Farinas was voted chairman of the Committee on ethics, Governmental Affairs and Personnel Monday during regular sessions with lone member Association of Barangay Councils President and ex-officio member Rocky Aliping.

Chairmanship of the Committee was vacated after Councilor Edison Bilog submitted an irrevocable resignation which prompted the council to temporarily assign Councilor Faustino Olowan as chair.

## Baguio Day Parade to Depict City's History

City Hall is again drawing from a long-forgotten legislative mandate it resurrected last year as guide in giving substance to the annual parade marking the 104<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the city's founding on Sept. 1.

As provided for by Resolution No. 118-88, unanimously adopted by the city council in May, 1988, "a street parade depicting the history of Baguio be continually included by the City Mayor in the annual celebration of Baguio Day..."

With this mandate in mind, the Baguio Day committee led by city councilor Elmer Datuin assured residents this year's parade will be a moving pageant of Baguio's history, not the drab, colorless processions or walks recent "parades" along the inclined and historic main street had turned out to be.

As in last year, the committee designated Dr. Elma Donal, principal of the Baguio City National High School, as chair of the historical tableau preparations. As such, the parade will follow historical chronology, beginning from the city's pre-founding as the original settlement of the Ibalays, the coming of the Americans and the missionaries, the formative years, the war years and liberation, reconstruction, until the present dispensation.

Groups who would like to help depict periods in the city's history, such as the building of the Kennon Rd., the coming of migrants from all over, its development as a top educational and commercial center, the rise of pop music in the 1960s as symbolized by the Beatles, the student activism of the '70s and other events and movements until the present dispensation, may get in touch with Dona-al, through teacher Marilyn Api-it, head of the school's special program for the arts.

"Promoting the history of Baguio is the most appropriate way fo celebrating the city's anniversary to create awareness, elicit public interest and loyalty among its citizens," noted the then city council in 1988.

The council pointed out that "during the city's celebration of its 74<sup>th</sup> anniversary, the Baguio pageant feature was grealy Appreciated by many with a clamor for its re-staging".

The idea for a moving historical pageant then came from the late Baguio newsman Freddie Mayo who also wrote the script for the parade.

Also providing substance to this year's observance are a cultural presentation showcasing the city's cultural heritage under the direction of Dr. Rachel Bugtong, principal of the Pines City National High School, Culture and Arts led by Dr. Fernando Eleponga, a museum tour and sports events.

Also on tap under the theme "Continuing Steadfast Service to the City" are the traditional program, the annual "Out-standing Citizens of Baguio" awards, Cont. on page 7
