Band Camp 2016



Soon, a new group of band students will fill the parking lot at Lafayette High School to begin a new year. Students will bring with them many different life experiences, but they will soon learn to march in unison and perform what is sure to be another memorable Lafayette show.

The first week of Band Camp for first-time marchers, percussion, and color guard begins July 18. They will be learning fundamentals to benefit themselves and the entire band in the months ahead. Full Band Camp will begin the following week on July 25. All band students are to attend. Read below and on the next page to learn how to have

the best Band Camp experience possible.



Things to Know about Band Camp!!

- Band Camp attendance is MANDATORY.
- Post the schedule on Pages 11 and 12 on your refrigerator and check it frequently.
- Remember upperclassmen do have some afternoon and evening practices during the week of July 18.
- All students should be at the school and ready to practice by 8:00 am each day.
- Lunch breaks are from 12:00-1:00 daily. Lunch is NOT provided during the week of July 18. Please plan accordingly.
- Lunch IS provided MOST days during the two weeks of full Band Camp. (See the e-news for schedule.) Write in any food allergies on top of medical form.
- All participants' information forms and medical permits must be turned in BEFORE camp begins. If we do not have these forms, you cannot participate for safety reasons. Forms can be accessed at www.lafayetteband.org.
- No visitors are allowed on campus during the day, even during the lunch break.
- Get a good night's sleep every night and eat a good breakfast every morning.
- Drink lots of water before, during, and after practice. Water breaks are frequent.

Red Bags for Sale Now!



Students travel with their red bags during marching season. The bags will hold items like shoes, socks, shorts, t-shirts, and that all-important deodorant! If you do not wish to purchase a red bag, one of the older Lafayette bags will be assigned to your student for the season. However, many students like having their own red bags, which is a little bigger and has their name screen-printed on the top. The price is \$26. You can place your order and pay for a bag at the July 18 Parent Meeting or during the Shoe Order on Wednesday, July 27.

P.S. You will be fitted for your marching band uniform during the two weeks of full band camp!

Tips for a Successful Band Camp

In order to get the most out of your Band Camp experience, it's important to be prepared. Listed here are some ways to make sure that you stay in tip-top shape during band camp.

Fluid Intake: WATER, WATER, WATER



- > Drink 16 ounces of water BEFORE you come to rehearsal in the morning.
- > Each evening, after rehearsals, drink 16 to 32 ounces of water.
- > It is essential that you stay hydrated. Guys will sweat and girls will glisten during Band Camp. It's hot on the pavement, sometimes REALLY hot. We are outside, it is summer and this is Kentucky! AVOID CAFFEINE (save the Red Bull for Band trips) or carbonated beverages with caffeine. Also stay away from sugar-loaded drinks (i.e., Kool-Aid or juice). They will dehydrate you. Water is best. Gatorade or other sports drinks are okay, BUT drink them in addition to water!

Nutrition: Everyone MUST eat breakfast, lunch and dinner every day.

Please eat a healthy meal before you come every day. Contrary to what you may think, food on your stomach will not sit like a lump while you are marching. Your body needs fuel to perform at the level necessary for Band Camp. Avoid all caffeine, greasy foods, carbonated drinks with caffeine, excessive candy or sweets, and dairy foods. During the week of July 18, you are "on your own" for lunch. You may bring a sack lunch or have someone bring you a lunch from offsite. During the two weeks



of full Band Camp, lunch is provided MOST DAYS. Students MAY NOT leave campus during the lunch break. Food truck meals will be available for students who wish to purchase a lunch on days when meals are not provided, or you may pack a lunch. See your e-news for the meal schedule.

Summer Conditions:



- > Wear sunscreen with SPF 30 or higher. Bring your sunscreen with you to re-apply during breaks.
- > Wear a hat—a baseball cap preferred.
- > Wear light-colored clothing.
- > Always wear socks and tennis shoes (no sandals or flip-flops).
- > Expect high temperatures and humidity! Many hours are spent on the asphalt!

Student Pick-up/Drop-off/Parking

The safety of our students is of the utmost importance! Strict rules have been established by the administration at LHS. All students are to park in the student parking accessed from Springhill Drive, NOT on the band practice field. Parking is always a problem at Lafayette, and school administrators ask that all students, whether attending Band, soccer or football camp, use the student parking lot. Parents are asked to use the student



parking lot for dropping off and picking up students before and after rehearsal. Please, never park your car in the driveway to the Band practice field or drive on the practice field at the close of rehearsals. Even after the Band is dismissed, students may be extending their rehearsals with sectionals or other meetings. ALWAYS, use a slow, safe speed in these congested areas.

And, finally...

Rehearsals are closed to non-Band students. No visitors during band camp!

Big Brother/Big Sister Picnic

The Big Brother/Big Sister Picnic is a special event organized by the drum majors each year prior to band camp. Its purpose is to welcome all new marchers into the band by giving them a fun way to meet their new peers and many of the upper classmen who will act as their big brother

or big sisters. Attendance is not mandatory, but if you are a new marcher and can make the picnic, be sure to attend. You should have received a postcard invitation with all the information and your newly assigned big brother or big sister.

Chaperones Collecting 8 oz. Water Bottles for Marchers

We will be collecting <u>8 oz.</u> water bottles as you drop off your kids at band camp each day.

We ask that each family help by donating some <u>8 oz</u>. water bottles over the course of band camp.

Each student gets an <u>8 oz.</u> bottle of water to ensure they are hydrated prior to performing throughout the marching season.

We use $\underline{8}$ oz. bottles to make them easier to carry with us, and we find that $\underline{8}$ oz. is the ideal amount.

Be watching for Lafayette Band Store hours of operation. Plan to support your child with band clothing, hats, blankets, lanyards, etc.!

Do We Have Your Forms?

Students cannot participate in marching band unless the proper medical documentation is completed and submitted. The chaperone team must have:

- a signed copy of your child's medical form on file.
- a copy of your child's KHSAA physical form.

Beginning this year, LBA's medical form procedures have been updated to match the Fayette Co. Schools policy. The student's medical form must be signed by a physician in order for the chaperone team to administer any over-the-counter (OTC) medication you approve on the form. We cannot take verbal approval over the phone if you have not designated an OTC medication or if there is no physician signature on the student's form.

The chaperone team must monitor the administration of all prescription medications. Drop off all prescription medication that your child may need during practice in their original containers to a chaperone team member in the student parking lot when you drop off your child for practice.

NOTE: Both forms are available on the downloadable forms section of the LBA website.

LBA Membership Required to Volunteer

The policy of LBA requires that all volunteers be paid LBA members in good standing. Dues must be paid every year to assure that you will be included in the insurance policy that we take out for all band activities for the coming season. If you haven't already done so, please include an extra \$10 for your membership in LBA in your next band payment. This covers your family's membership. You must also submit a 2016-2017 LBA Membership Form found on the band website.

Did You Know. . .

♦ When your child chose to become a part of the Lafayette Band, he or she joined the Pride of the Bluegrass. Unless you know someone who has been in the Lafayette Band or you have competed against Lafayette as a part of another band, the tradition might have eluded you and your student. The history of Lafayette Marching Band is long and eventful. The band is well-known across the state and beyond. The band has won 18 KMEA Class 5A State Championships and in 2013 went to California for the Tournament of Roses Parade! We welcome you to our "band family" and encourage you to get involved so

> This takes place on the last Friday night of camp and is preceded by a big band Family Cookout catered by our own Food Crew. Watch for details in e-news.

♦ You, your family, and friends can watch ballgame halftime performances

through a live stream on their computers, see hundreds of pictures, and watch videos of performances and concerts. Our media crew makes all this possible. A website will be available giving parents, families, and friends the opportunity to view band videos and photos taken by our Media Crew at band events.

◆ Your child will learn the value, art, and responsibility of working with a team while in band--just as much as if he or she were playing a sport. No one student could stand on a football field and put on a performance like one that can be given by a 200+ member marching band. Also, students must develop the skill of working with, helping, and learning from others to achieve success. Finally, each member of the band has the responsibility of learning the drill and music,


practicing daily, and performing to the best of his or her ability every time the band takes the field. People in the stands might not know if a member hits the wrong note, but they *will* know if he or she marches in the wrong direction!

◆ The more you get involved, the more you will see the benefits of band for your child. One of the most rewarding parts of being a parent is seeing your child set a goal, work toward it, and reach it with success. After the three weeks of band camp, feel free to come to an after-school practice a little early before pick up. Get to know other parents who come to watch the progression of the show throughout the season. Visit the Volunteer Fair at the Parent Meeting on July 18 to see all the other ways you can become involved.

- Your child will be very tired and hungry in the evenings after long days at camp. Many students feel overwhelmed after the first day of camp, but love band and all their new friends by the end of the first week. At the beginning, be sure to offer lots of encouraging words to your child!
- If your student is a new marcher, he or she will be given a "beanie" to wear during full band camp. This beanie has been worn during camp by first-time marchers since at least the



mid-1970's. Our drum majors construct the beanies for new marchers so upperclassmen and the staff can easily spot them

Year-round Fundraisers

Bingo. Since April 1996, LBA has sponsored Bingo in Keithshire Shopping Center. Every Tuesday and Thursday night, year round, members of our community come out to play and support our program. This is our largest, most successful fundraiser! Money earned each week provides a large percentage of the funds needed to support the band. Ten to 12 volunteers are needed to run each session, and each family is asked to volunteer for 12 bingo sessions during the year. Profits from Bingo go into the association's general fund. This is a major commitment on the part of the association, but the profits have made the effort very worthwhile. Bingo revenues help keep our band fees stable. Kroger Cards. The Kroger Community Rewards Program provides money to the band when you register and use your Kroger Plus Card. Register online at www.krogercommunityrewards.com. The Lafayette Band NPO Number is 10043. When paying at the checkout, present your Kroger Plus Card to receive cost savings for you and support for the Band. In addition, you can download digital coupons to your Kroger Plus Card via the Kroger app. Kroger pays the Lafayette Band Association a percentage of purchases, so use the card to purchase gift cards, gasoline, and pharmacy needs. Once registered, Lafayette Band is printed on the bottom of your receipt.

GoodShop (www.goodsearch.com). Earn money for the band by searching shopping online at GoodShop, an online shopping mall of over 100 of your favorite merchants dedicated to helping fund worthy causes across the country. Each purchase made via the GoodShop mall results in a donation to LBA averaging approximately 3% of the sale, but going up to 20% or even more. Just enter "Lafayette Band Association" to credit LBA.

Fundraising Events

Discount Card Fundraiser (July). A yearly community favorite, the annual Lafayette Band Discount Card Fundraiser kicks off at the first LBA Parent Meeting in July. The Discount Card is sold for \$10 and provides year-long savings and buy-one, get-one free offers at merchants located throughout Lexington. The cards serve both as a fundraiser for the Lafayette Band and as an advertisement for businesses in our community.

Cheese and Sausage Fundraiser (August). LBA kicks off the school year in August selling quality Wisconsin Real Cheese, Summer Sausage varieties/gift packs, high-quality wrapping paper, and premium candles. This fundraiser provides a wonderful opportunity to prepare for upcoming holidays while supporting the Lafayette Band.

Fruit Fundraiser (November/December). The "community favorite" fruit sales begin in November. In addition to a variety of citrus fruits, we offer country hams, apples, pears, baking nuts and decorative fruit gift boxes. Corporate orders are accepted.

Raffle (April/May). This is one of the largest fundraisers for the band. Each spring, LBA features the ANNUAL RAFFLE--\$10,000 GIVEAWAY. One winner receives the GRAND PRIZE OF \$10,000. Ticket sales begin in April and continue for a three-week period. NOTE: This raffle is conducted according to the rules and regulations of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Department of Charitable Gaming. All band parents are invited to take part in the band experience! Find out more at the Volunteer Fair and Parent Meeting on July 18 @ 7:00.

By the time our students enter high school, we as parents sometimes become disconnected to their education experience. As an active member of the Lafayette Band Association, you can be involved in a school activity with your child and make memories to last a lifetime! Please consider serving in one of the many volunteer opportunities available for families of the Band. There is a place for everyone no matter what your talent or interest. Listed below are areas in which parents can serve to help the band succeed.

<u>Band Store</u> The Band Store sells items such as t-shirts, sweatshirts, jackets, hats, flags, etc. to raise funds as well as encourage visual support of the band. Volunteers are used to choose inventory, create new items, organize inventory, and set up for sales at practices, football games, and contests. The Band Store is fully automated with a Point of Sale system that tracks sales, orders, and inventory. Working in the Band Store is a great way to use your creative abilities to benefit the Band, and it is also a great way to meet other members of the Band family. **Contact Stacy Haymes at lafayettebandstore@gmail.com** or **haymes@twc.com**.

Chaperones There are three levels of chaperones. The Event Chaperones attend games, parades and other local events. Day Chaperones travel with the band when there are no overnight stays. Travel Chaperones do all of the events including day trips and overnight travel. Volunteers could start as Event Chaperones and then learn the system and move to a different level. Chaperones accompany the band at all times, beginning at Band Camp. Through football season they station themselves in the band section of the stands and cheer on the Generals. During competition season, they travel on buses and sit in hotel hallways throughout the night. The Chaperone Crew assures the health and safety of the Band. Contact Mike

Color Guard Crew This crew makes sure the color guard is dressed properly and ready to take the field in costume, with hair and make-up done. Preparation is done on-site, whether in the cafeteria for football games, or in assigned rooms at competitions. Although a few will travel with the color guard, the biggest need is helping with hair. **Contact Frankie Stivers, frankiestivers@elderlawlexington.com.**

Field Crew The Field Crew usually travels ahead of the Band, loads and unloads uniforms, instruments, and backdrops—basically everything but the kids. They're also responsible for getting everything on and off the field, usually in a short amount of time. The Field Crew also creates props and items requested by Mr. Smith and the staff. Therefore, skills for building and fabricating are handy. Wherever you see the Band, you'll see the Field Crew. Contact Matt King, matt@bleedsblue.com.

Food Crew Volunteer opportunities as a part of the food crew would include your choice of the following: Serving meals at Band Camp, mini camps and before competitions (usually from 10:30-1:30—includes setting up, serving and cleaning up).
