What is news agency? (3 Marks)

A news agency is an organization which gathers news from a particular country or all over the world and distribute to different newspapers, magazines, television, radio, government agencies and organizations. It is also called a press agency, wire service and news service. News agency do not publish news itself, it collects and distributes to its subscribers by paying fees for this service.

All Mass media depends on news agencies for getting news. They prepare hard news and all mass media depends on them for getting news. These news can be used with little or no modificaiton. Now a days they provides through internet and in bulk.

Establishment of News agencies? 3 Marks

In newspaper industry the establisment of news agencies were very important. To get most updated commercial information from nationally and international was not easy. This gap was filled by news agencies. In 1835 the French Agency Havas was established to engage in international activities followed by Associated Press (USA) in1846, Wolff (Germany) in 1849, Tuwora (Austria) in 1850 and Reuters (UK) in 1851.

Reuters were providing commercial and financial information while Havas was dessiminating information and advertising. Havas, Wolff and Reuters signed a treaty to devide the world market into three parts and each of them was responsible to collect news in his territory. Initially news agencies used to dessiminate news through telegraphy and now it has been replaced by internet.

Four major international news agencies are:

- Reuters (Reuter Telegram Company of London)
- Associated Press (AP)
- United Press International (UPI)
- Agence France-Presse (AFP Agence Havas of Paris)

Expalin MacBride Commission Report Points? 3 Marks

In 1970-80 many people rasied concerns on the domination of broadcast media by developed countries. Most channels were airing American movies and series. This unbalanced media coverage was coined in New World Information and Communication Order (NWICO). Below are the main four concerns which were the basis of creating MacBridge Commission.

The commission studied four main aspects of global communication which are: what is the current status of world communication; what are the problems in the way of free and fair flow on information; and how the needs of the developed countires are to be fulfilled with free flow of information and how media can educate public opinion on world issues.

What do you know about telegraph? (3)

The word Telegraphy derived from Greek. "Tele" means at a distance and "graphien" means to write. It is a communication system which send information through electric signals over a wire between stations. The transmission line was connected with the transmitter and receiver. The prototype was demonstrated by Joseph Henry in 1830 which was refined by Samuel Morse in 1837. The first officaial telegraph message was sent on 1st May 1844 from from Washington, D.C., to Baltimore, Maryland.

Telegraph made possible transmission of information quickly at long distance places. It was used to make business and earn profit first. Telegraphy link was setup in British in 1838 and unified the British empire. In 1851 Public telepgrpah service was introduced in British and by the end of the centruy Colonial and India office are linked to British Empire. They can communitace with each other within minutes which takes months before. British merchants used telegrph to find the current prices of cotton and other commodities in England and exporting them from India to Egypt.

Explain the concept of Free Flow of Information? (3 Marks)

It means the free movement of information, news, advertisements across the world without any hinderence. This ideas was promoted by USA after the World War II during cold war with Soviet Union. USA and Western countries want freedeom of expression, open markets to promote democracy. This is called capitilism approach where economic and political system country's trade are controlled by private owners to gain profit rather than by a state.

This concept is used to get benefits on both economic and political fronts. Big media houses of the western countries tried to persuades others not to put trade barriers on their products and services in the cover of democracy, freedon expression and media role as a watch dog and educate people. Their concept promoted capitalism and individualism.

Discuss the key challenges to Freedom of Media in Pakistan?

Freedom of Media means that news and inofrmation will be desseminated without any restrictions of government. Article 19 of the Constitution of Islamic Republic of Pakistan protects the fundament rights of individual and media. Every citizen and media has the right of speech and expression subject to the restrictions imposed by law.

Press freedom has never been consistant in Pakistan. Different govt used different tactics to control the media. In Pakistan there are 56 constitutional provisions and laws which ristrict the freedom of media. Pakistan ranking is 136 in 2017 in World Press Freedom Index issued by Reporters sans Frontiers. The predators of Press Freedom are extremist group, islamist organizations and intelligence agencies.

Following are the key challenges:

- Censorship of programmes, taking programs off air and censoring publications.
- Editors having pressure from Media owners, fear of loosing advertisiements, and licensue renewal issues.
- Physical threats, violence, harrassments and killings of journalists.
- Using Law on Blasphemy against journalists.
- Govt non serious attitude to provide protection and solve cases of violence against media professionals.
- Lack of professional training of journalists and their accountability.

Under Prevention of Electronic Crimes Act 2016 the criticism on military, judicial system can lead to imprisonment but we see people are criticising on both institutions in the name of freedom.

Explain Communication used in Mughal era (period)? (3 Marks)

The era of Mughal Empire was from 1526 to 1857. Mughals ruled parts of Afghanistan, Balochistan and Indian Subcontinent. The Mughal Empire is known as a "gunpowder empire" also.

During the Mughal period "Tavaqi'a Nawis" news writers were employed by the king which are responsible to inform the progress and development in the empire. They made arrangements to send post from one part of the country to another part. It was done through rely of horses and runners. They built towers at a distance of few kilometers to see if a runners is coming while clanging the bell and the next runner will take his burdon quickly.

How the term "Third World" got popular around the globe? 3 marks

In 1952, French economic historian Alfred Sauvy used the word "Third World" during cold war. It was an era when the world was devided into two blocks. The First World is capitalist led by USA and its allies, Second World is used for Communist in Soviet Union and the countries which were not part of these two blocks are called "Third World" countries.

Most of the Asian, Africian and Latin Americans are part of "Third World". Now a days "Third World" pharase used for underdeveloped or developing countries. In these countries the education level is low, lack of proper infrastructure, poor health care facilities, improper sanitation services and people living conditions are inferior. The process of industrialization is very slow, people have low levels of per capita income, and their dependence on agricultural and commodity exports.

Differentiate between leftist and rightest approach in Gramsci theory of hegemony? (3 Marks)

Herman and Chomsky argued that the propaganda model succeeds because there is not clear indication of government to use force to persuade people. They were following the ideology and role of state power in a capitalist society. The French Marxist Louis Althusser also called the media as a "ideological state" agent.

In 1971, the ideas of Italian Amrxist Antonio Gramsci (1891-1937) has got major influence in Great Briton when his notes prepared in jail, translated into English titled "Selections from the Prison Notebooks". It is called the "Theory of Hegemony" which was based on his political experience. He explained in his theory that it is not necessary for the ruling class to use military force to retain power. They have much influence through intellectual means and with moral direction to build a news system which supports their aim. It is possible when the elite or ruling class apply leadership skills. It can be done through schools, religious bodies and effective use of mass media.

In International Communication, concept of Hegemony is used in mass media by doing propaganda and maintain the ruling elite ideology. The news and entertainment production will be according to their ideology. Although media is free from government control but act as an agent to persuade people to accept dominant ideology.

Factors behind the rise of Reuters

Reuters is a news agency established in 1851 in UK. Reuters focus was to provide commercial and financial information. As long as British Empire spread the Reuters grow along with it. There was a huge demand of business news during nineteen centruy due to the expansion of trade and business.

To exapnd its services, Reuters used new communication technologies like telegraphy, to provide information to British and European clients. By 1870, Reuters had its offices in major important cities like Calcutta, Bombay and Point de Galle in Srilanka connected to their head office in Landon through telegraphic wire. They monitor Reuters's services in Asia, China, Japan and Australia. In 1914, Reuters News Services had three main channels covering news from London to Bombay, London to Hong Kong and another in Cape Town, Durban and Mauritius. The trade and business volume increase by 25 fold from 1800 to 1913 and it was possible with the link between capital and communication. It is also called "The Reuters Factor".

Reuters also built good relationship with the British foreign and colonial administration. Although it was an independent news agency but become the voice of the British Empire and promoted British views. Reuters revenue from 'India' as a British Colony increased more than tripple from 1898 to 1918. Reuters also supported British Empire by making propaganda during First World War. In 1920 Reuters launched the trade service to provide business and commercial information to its client like providing Indian Cotton prices in News York market. By 1999, Reuters become the world's biggest multimedia corporations providing information on business, fianacial markets, new products and realtime financial data along with news, graphics, video and photographs.

By the end of twenth century, Reuters becomes world largest financial data provider plus news provider for news papers. due to the birth of internet. It has regional headquartes in London, New York, Geneva and Hong Kong and offices in 217 cities.

The foundation of any successful relationship is a good communication whether personal or professional. Communication is a combination of Verbal and Non Verbal Communication.

Verbal Communications

The use of sounds and words, said or written to express yourself for communication is called verbal communication. It is an interpersonal communication through linguistic means.

Non Verbal Communication

Our nonverbal communication plays an important role—our facial expressions, gestures, eye contact, posture, and tone of voice—that speaks loudly. If there is contradiction, the nonverbal message expresses true feelings more accurately describe the person than its verbal message.

Do you think that the flow of international communication is one sided, biased and a source of planned propaganda against the Muslims? Discuss by giving examples and logical arguments.

Yes! It is true that the flow of communication is one sided, biased. Propaganda is used as a weapon to influence international opinion against Muslims. Media portrait this with an objective to show Muslims as a terrorist, rigid and having old ideologies not relevant to the current world. It creates this perception by reporting partial news or in prejudiced manner or ignoring an important aspect.

Most Muslims countries are underdeveloped and have less economic opportunities. People live in hand to mouth just to meet full their daily living requirements. Islam or Muslims are slowly linked to extremism, militants, mass murdered of innocent civilians and raising the slogan for Jihad. As soon as any incident happened the media sees who committed? He the culprit is a white man he will be declared mentally ill or disturbed loner. If the same thing committed by Muslim, he will be declared terrorist and committed the act of terrorism. Let's see the following examples:

Las Vegas shooting kills at least 59 in deadliest ever US gun attack. Las Vegas Sheriff said that it is not an act of terrorist and we have not found anything which link to terrorism. If the similar act will be committed by Muslim, they declare him terrorist without establishing his motives and solid evidence.

What is Social Responsibility Theory

Social Responsibility is a terminology used for looking welfare of the people while generating business activity. It is a belief that the press has a responsibility to inform their public on the issues of concern of their society. They have obligation towards society, culture, economy and environment. The freedom of media must not be on the basis of harming society and its socio-cultural aspects and economy.

Social Responsibility theory is a new concept introduced in mid 20th century by Robert Hutchins, president of the University of Chicago. This model was reshaped by Siebert, Peterson and Schramm in 1956. It encourages total media freedom but regulated by social responsibilities and external control.

Sensationalism and irresponsible state of media in Pakistan have put doubts over it working for society in Pakistan. In this situation what steps should be taken by Government to ensure a balance form of freedom of media in Pakistan? Discuss only those steps that are feasible in our society. (3 Marks)

The Social Responsibility Theory will help in creating professionalism in media and freed form of media freedom by setting up a high level of accuracy, truth, and information. Steps feasible in Pakistani society are:

- 1. Formulate the code of conduct for the press.

- 3. Safeguarding the interests of journalism and journalist.
- 4. Criticise and make some penalty for violating the code of conduct.

Differentiate between network society and information society? Information society

World Trade Organization (WTO) and what was its agenda? 3 Marks

World Trade Organization was established on 1st January 1995 in Geneva, Switzerland. It is the result of the negotiations held 1986-94 called Uruguay Round and earlier negotiations under the General Agreement on Tariffs and Trade (GATT). Its member countries are 164.

WTO was set up for privatization and liberalization. It is the only global organization for promoting trade between nations by lowering trade barriers, revising trade rules to ensure smooth and free trade flows. Economic growth is only possible if free flow of information is available for goods and services. It also help to settle trade disputes between nations .

Following are the key areas where WTO operates:

- Trade negotiations
- Implementation and monitoring
- Dispute settlement
- Building trade capacity
- Outreaching International and non govt organizations about its activities.

Explain characteristic of conflict area?

A disagreement among people with opposing opinions are called conflict. It could happen between people, groups, political parties or different countires. After the end of cold war there have been many conflicts which took lifes of millions of people and displaced many millions. The pattern of conflicts differs from state to state or within state. Often it takes the shape of violence and it remains present for a long time due to which achieving peace is very difficult. Following are the characteristics of conflict:

- Violence is committed by law enforcement agencies, non-state actors or armed groups. Sometimes non-state actors commit violence along with paramilitary forces also.
- In conflict area the economy is based on looting, taking people hostage and releasing them for ransome, smuggling arms, drugs, oil and other necessary commodities.
- Terror and fear of life is the main tactic used in the war area. Attacks on civilians, women's rape and violation of human rights are common.
- Conflicts within states occur if the state writ is weak and criminal and terrorists have easy access to their targets and political institutions are not stable.
- Media is under threat and deos not have access to the affected areas and not free to inform people truth. Journalists facing life threats, strict censorship and control over media especially local media is one of the causes.

Which satellite system help US denfense servises in 1990s?

Hughes Space and Communications Company is one of the world biggest satellite manufacturers providing services in commercial satellites worldwide. Hughes was a vertically integrated satellite firm and a major supplier who helped US defence services in designing and launching the Leasat satellites in 1984, 1985 and 1990. These satellites were used for military communication and doing surveillance world wide. In Boeing bought Hughes in January 2000 and became world's biggest producer of defence related information and communication systems.

What is liberalization and privatization?

Liberalization is focused on the local economy. It means relaxation of government rules and eliminating state control over economic, social or political activities. Privatization means transfer of assets or services from public sector to private sector. It means all under corporate rule and working for profit. Liberalization and Privatization gives greater autonomy to the business industry and essential for economic growth.

Who got benefit from liberalization and privatization?

The biggest beneficiaries of liberalization and privatization are Transnational corporations (TNCs). TNC's are the parent enterprises which have foreign affiliations with other organisation outside their home country. They control their assets and services by owning their shares or investing heavily in it.

TNC's dominate the global trade and shape the global economy. They are so powerfull that their annual sale is more than many countries GDP.

TNC's has three basic characteristics:

- Coordination and control of production units in different countries.
- Take advantage of geographical differences in production like availability of natural resources, cheap labour and govt policies and taxes.
- Have geographical flexibility to move its resources and operations internationally or globally.

Philosphy behind open skies.

There was rapid development and technology change in 1980. Private companies were trying to get licenses for commercial satellites. Telecommunication traffic increased and TNC's were asking for reduction in tarriffs in local and international services. US Government were promoting international business development through liberalization and privatization. The US President Ronald Reagan announced Open Skies Policy in 1984 to allow private companies to compete with state owned companies in satellite communications. Private companies enter in telecommunication network and as a result the biggest US telecom company American Telephone and Telegraph (AT&T) was split into 22 local companies and telecommunication sector liberalized and privatised. British followed US a year later by privatising British Telecom 51% shares. This policy started deregulizing some of the state owned organizations and cut the redtape, a hurdle in economic growth.

If media is can not solve the problem then it is part of problem Elaborate this statement.

"Journalist have to decide whether they are going to be part of the problem or part of the solution" said former British Ambassador Sir Robin Christopher.

Media has an important role to play during conflict and must promote peace. Journalists have thier own ideology and they should contribute for peace and justice by framing stories in fair way with accurate information and providing insight news of conflict is called peace journalism. The journalism must be peace/conflict, people and solution oriented. Giving voices to all parties, humanization of all sides and preventing more violence. It should expose untruth from all sides, focus on human suffering, naming evil doings and highlighted peace initiatives along with resolutions and reconciliation. Describe Intelsat?

INTELSAT stands for International Telecommunications Satellite Organization. It is a Non-Profit company jointly owned by 100 countires to operate global satellite system. Currently INTELSAT has a one of the largest fleet of 52 satellites used for domestice and international communications. INTELSAT endoresd UN resolution in 1971 by giving access to satellite communication to every nation. To make sure that less developed countries also benefit from satellite technology. It used revenues from high traffic routes (Europe , Japan andNorth America) and subsidized less profitable routes.

In 1999, INTELSAT woned 19 satellities and providing video and internet services to more than 200 countries. Many countries still depend on INTELSAT for their internationl communication.

Exlain the social construction of reality?

Peter Berger and Thomas Luckmann wrote a book in 1966 called "The Social Construction of Reality" They argued that society is created by humans with their interaction also called habitualization. Any action repeated over time and become a pattern and will be done again in the same manner in future. It creates mental representation of each others action and labelled those actions according to the pictures created in our head. It means meanings of actions are in our head which is embedded by society. Therefore is is said that Reality is socially constructed. We accept this reality because it was created by others for us.

For instance school existes as a school not for the building because it was embedded in our mind that it is school not biulding.

Explain Traditional system and modern system? 5 marks

Media was a tool to organized relationship between the rulers and its population during the Ottoman Empire. It was based on traditional system on the principles of respect, obedience and loyalty for rulers and political authorities. The concept of western media came when countries tried to come our of colonialism. Nationalists win and kept media under their control. Censorship and legislation stoped free speech and independent press.

In the modern system many gulf and middle eastern countries spend billions of dollars earned from oil on the development of media inside and outside the country and kept media under the control of Ministry of Information. Media was used to support the governments. In 1996 AI Jazira established in Qatar not due to the freedom of press because of the liberalisation and change the Qataris view about world and how world sees Middle East. The power of satellites and internet has changed the media. People saw how US forces captured Baghdad, what happened in Gaza and fighting in Kosovo through the eyeys of CNN. In modern system media play a role to support government inestablishing their writ and promote their version of nationalism.

How did the 'Arab Spring' begin?

Tunisia is the Birthplace of the Arab Spring and it started in late 2010 when Mohamed Bouazizi set himself on fire infront of the government building after being humilated by local police by slapping and spatting on his face. He sells fruit to earn livings for his widow mother and 6 siblings. Protest began and it was captured on cell phones and shared on internet. After his death the protest spreads all over the country and forced President Zine El Abidine Ben Ali and his govt to step down. Soon after Tunisia, people in Egypt stood agains President Hosni Mubarak, who was in office since 1981. After Egypt it affect Yemen uprising, Libya Revold and Syria Uprising.

What do you about The Press, Newspapers and News Agencies Registration Ordinance 2002? Expalin

The Press, Newspapers and News agencies Registration Ordinance (PNNARO) replaced Press and publication Ordinance in 1963 and Registration of Printing Press Ordinance in 1988. This law introduced self governing code of conduct for the press. This put made some regulations to the affairs of the news agencies in Pakistan. Before anyone can assuem the role of news agency with a fax and e-mail service. With this law government can not ban publishing of any newspaper but may impose some financial penelties against violating rules or on irresponsible reporting.

"Page-in-charge" is responsible for checkking the contents of the pages and make sure the material sent to the printer and publisher is accurate and fullfill the requirements. This law made journalists responsible at each and every step of press media. Govern claim that this law will protect the press freedom and on the other hand make journalist accountable for their wrong doings.

Write about the cold war propaganda against the third world countries (5 Marks)

Cold war make the world hostile in East-West blocs. East block represented by Russian and its allies to promote communism and west block represents USA and its allies to promote capitalist and democracy. It had deep consiquences on the development of Third World Countries (conutires not part of any block. In 1952, the French economic historian alfred Sauvy used this terminlogy. Pro-Americian values were promoted in fildm, television, music and literature. They propogated thorugh Radio dramas that people living in capitalist countires are living properous life.

Propaganda used for the Third world countries that people in their countires are uneducation, uncivilised. They do not have basic health facilites and are religious extremists. The benefits of things such as the nuclear family, school, community, obedience and loyalty were openly promoted.

What is Propaganda and explain Origin of Propaganda?

The term "Propagnada" first used in 16th century to promote Faith and Missionary activities of Catholic church. In its origin it is an honourable word associated with religious activities and got respectful attention

Later on it was used for selfish, dishonest and manipulated views for malicious intentions and used during World War II. It explains how to control the mind of public through manipulated spoken or written words or in pictorial representation in mass media. Propaganda is used to spread information with malicious intentions or gaining support for an openion or belief. It lacks truth and generally an appeal to emotion, not intellect.

Propaganda can be devided into three types:

Black propaganda - White propaganda - Grey propaganda

Black Propaganda

It is deliberately created and distributed with malicious intentions. It could be true or false but released with bad intent. Its effectiveness is that it look like to be produced by a legitimate or trustworthy source. Deliberately dessiminated rumurs or gossips also comes under this category. Used in world war II by Nazi's.

White Propaganda

Although it does not tell complete truth but most of the information is based on truth and factual elements. Its source is clearly identified. It is dessiminated in a way that convience people that the sender has good reputation. It is also used to distract people attention from problematic issues. Like testimonials of war prisoners that they are treated well and life is much better there.

Grey Propaganda

It is in between white and black propaganda. The dessiminated information might or might not be false. The information passed without checking its authentication because it suits his/her interests. Sometimes its source also not be correctly identified.

Exemplify a situation describing hyperreality of media. (3 Marks)

He explained that it is not necessary for the ruling class to use military force to retain power they have much influence through intellectual means and with moral direction to build a new system which supports their aim.
