K. ELICIT DEF: To bring to light. To evolve or develop	11. DEMOGRAPHICS/ ODDS




Chart1: Jobs by designated education level of occupations, May 2013


**Level of education, by age, 2012


Earnings and unemployment rates by educational attainment, 2015


