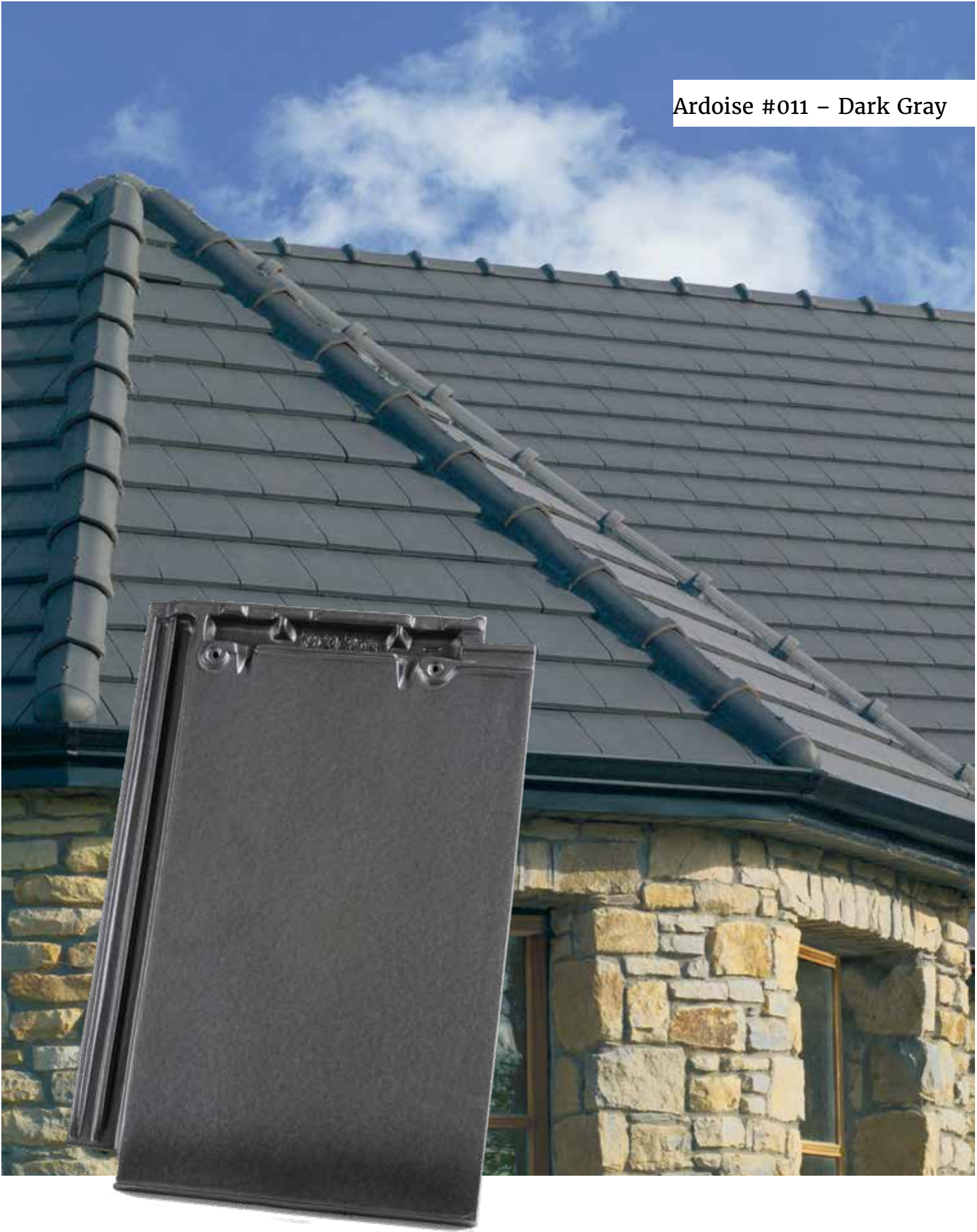

HP10’s smooth clean lines will compliment any modern minimalistic design. It’s double side and head locks allow this tile to be safely installed on low pitched roofs.

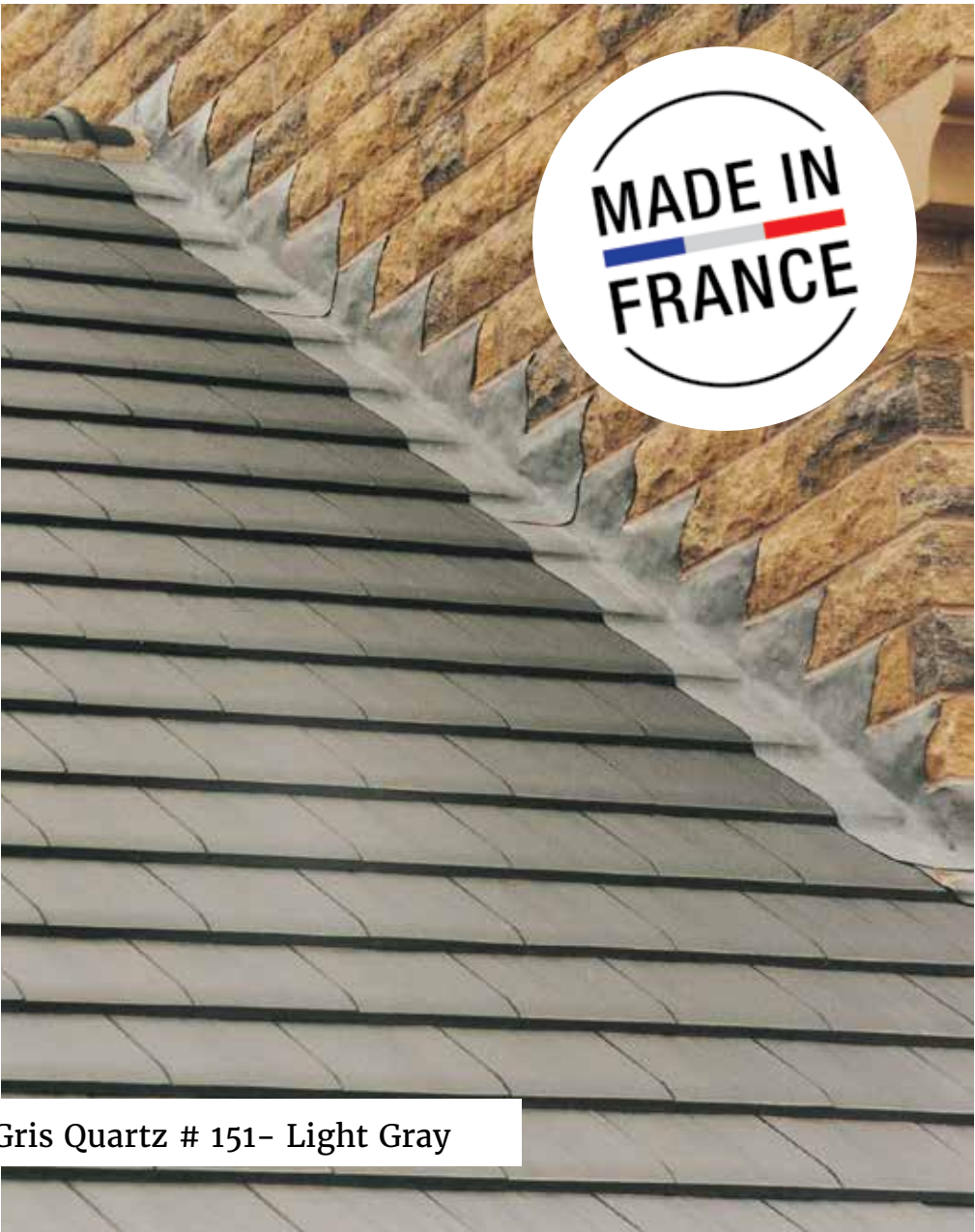

Flat Interlocking – Option #1 HP10

Solid colors and HP10’s thick butt (bottom edge) will create strong horizontal shadow lines and give definition, especially on low slope roofs. 92 pieces per sq. • Weight – 9 lbs. per sq ft.

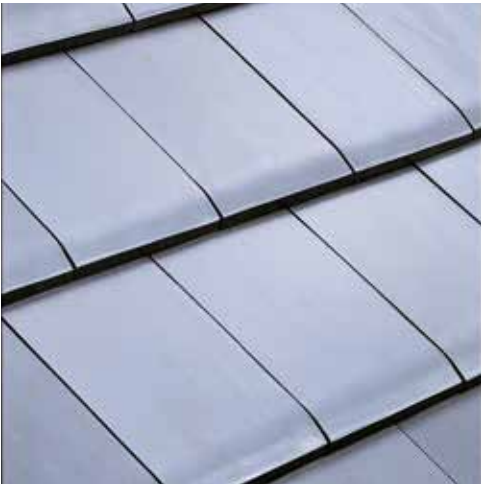

Flat Interlocking – Option #2 Beauvoise



BEAUVOISE

Beauvoise is a smaller flat interlocking tile. It has a smooth flat surface, square edges and butt (bottom edge) .

HP10, the bigger HP10 it's double side and head locks allow it to be installed to lower pitches.

- Weight – 9 lbs. per sq ft.

Flat Interlocking – Option #2 Beauvoise



This is a Beauvoise with a slate like riven surface and chamfered edges and butt. It takes the smooth clean lines of a regular Ardoise color and gives it a more uneven rustic look.

- 92 pieces per sq.
- Weight – 9 lbs. per sq ft

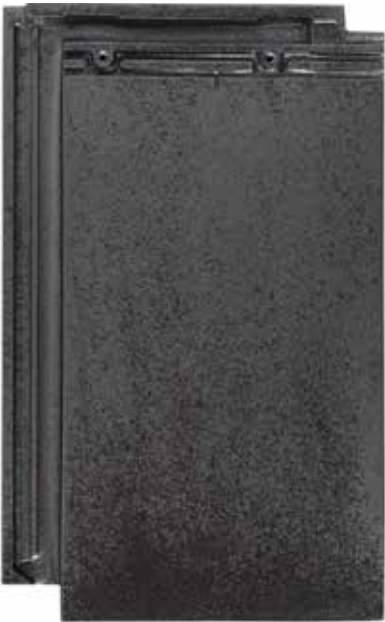

Flat Interlocking – Option #4 Plana

Plana also has a flat smooth surface clean square sides but with a thick square butt (bottom Edge)
This square butt gives a very strong horizontal shadow line and on low pitched roofs an almost stepped appearance to the roof.

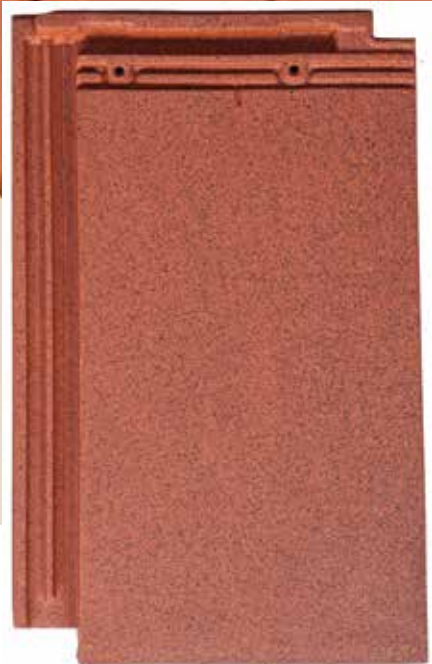

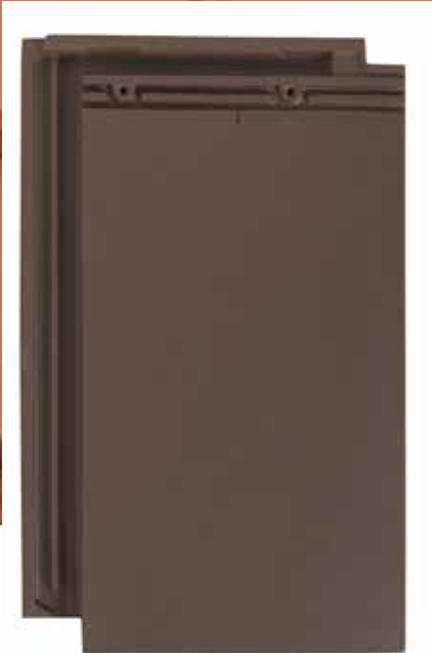

Interlocking with a *difference*- Diamant

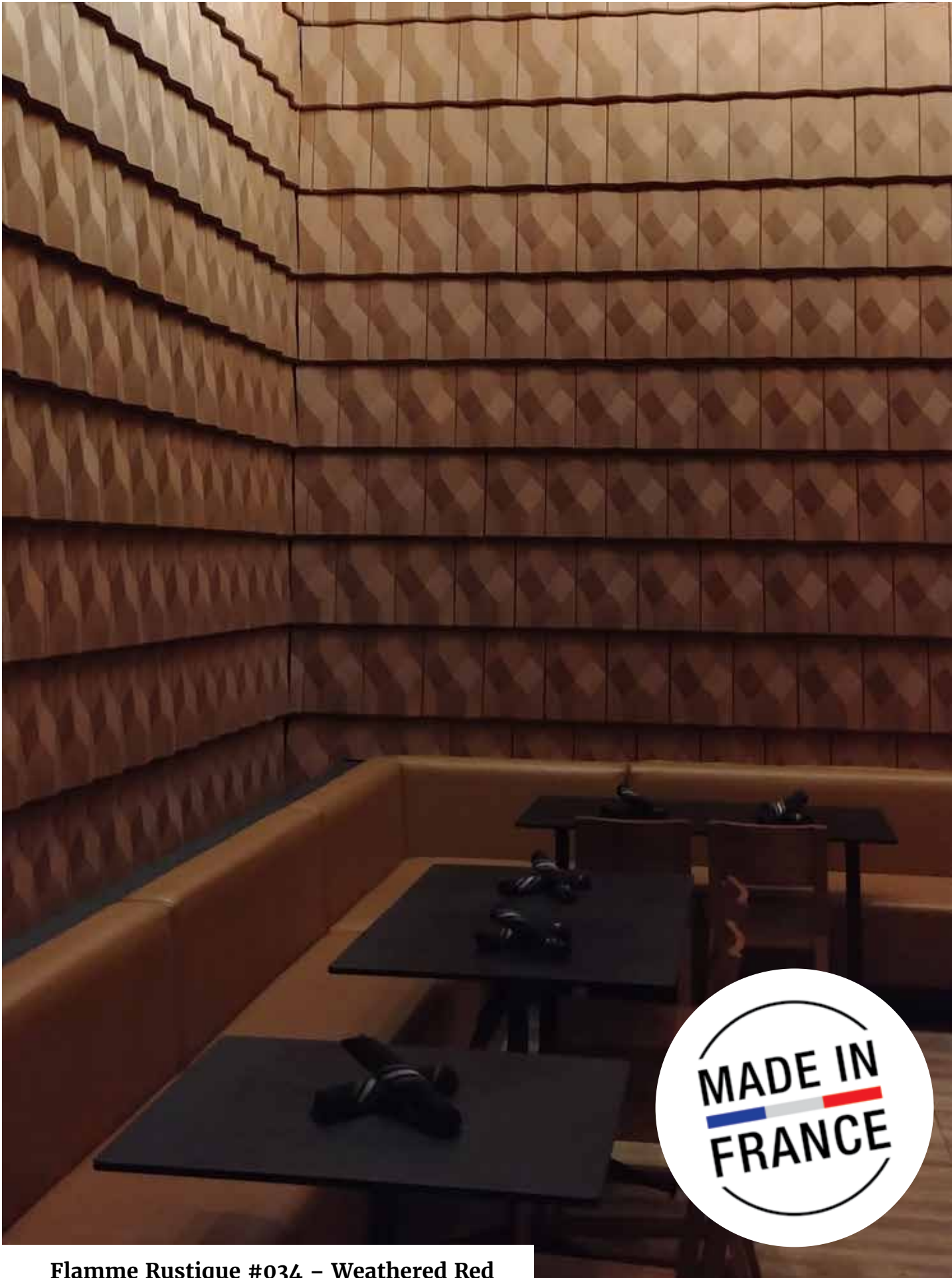

Interlocking with a *difference* – Diamant

The creative use of Diamant’s unique profile put to the ultimate test. The architect had the tiles installed vertically as a wall cladding as well as on the pitched roof. Plus glass tiles of the same profile were supplied to create the ‘after dark’ effect.

Ultra Modern Circa 1904



In 1904 Frank Lloyd Wright was commissioned to design a new home for a wealthy Buffalo, NY businessman, Mr. Darwin Martin. The main house plus the stable block, pergola and a smaller house for Mr. Martin's sister all used a flat, smooth shingle tile on a roof of only 3/12 pitch! In the early 1990's work started on the restoration of all the buildings and Northern Roof Tiles was proud to supply all the new roof tiles.

Frank Llyod Wright pioneering prairie style of architecture can be described as MODERN..... almost minimalistic even 117 years later.

All the colors, other than the natural Red are created by varying the oxygen levels in the kiln. No color pigments, dyes or surface coating involved.

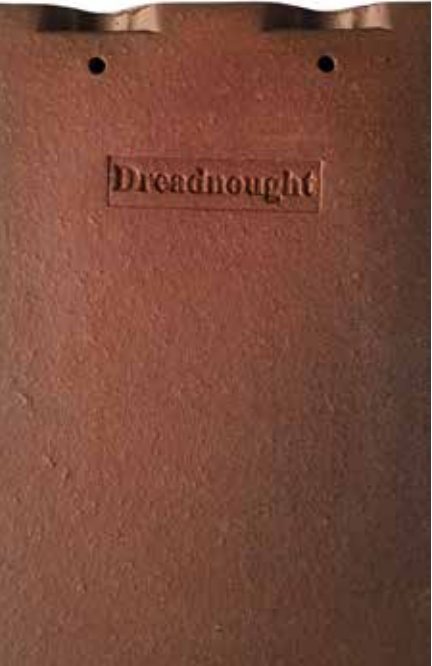

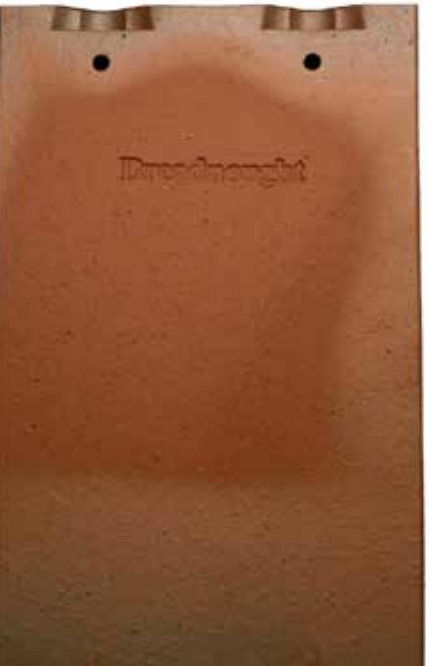

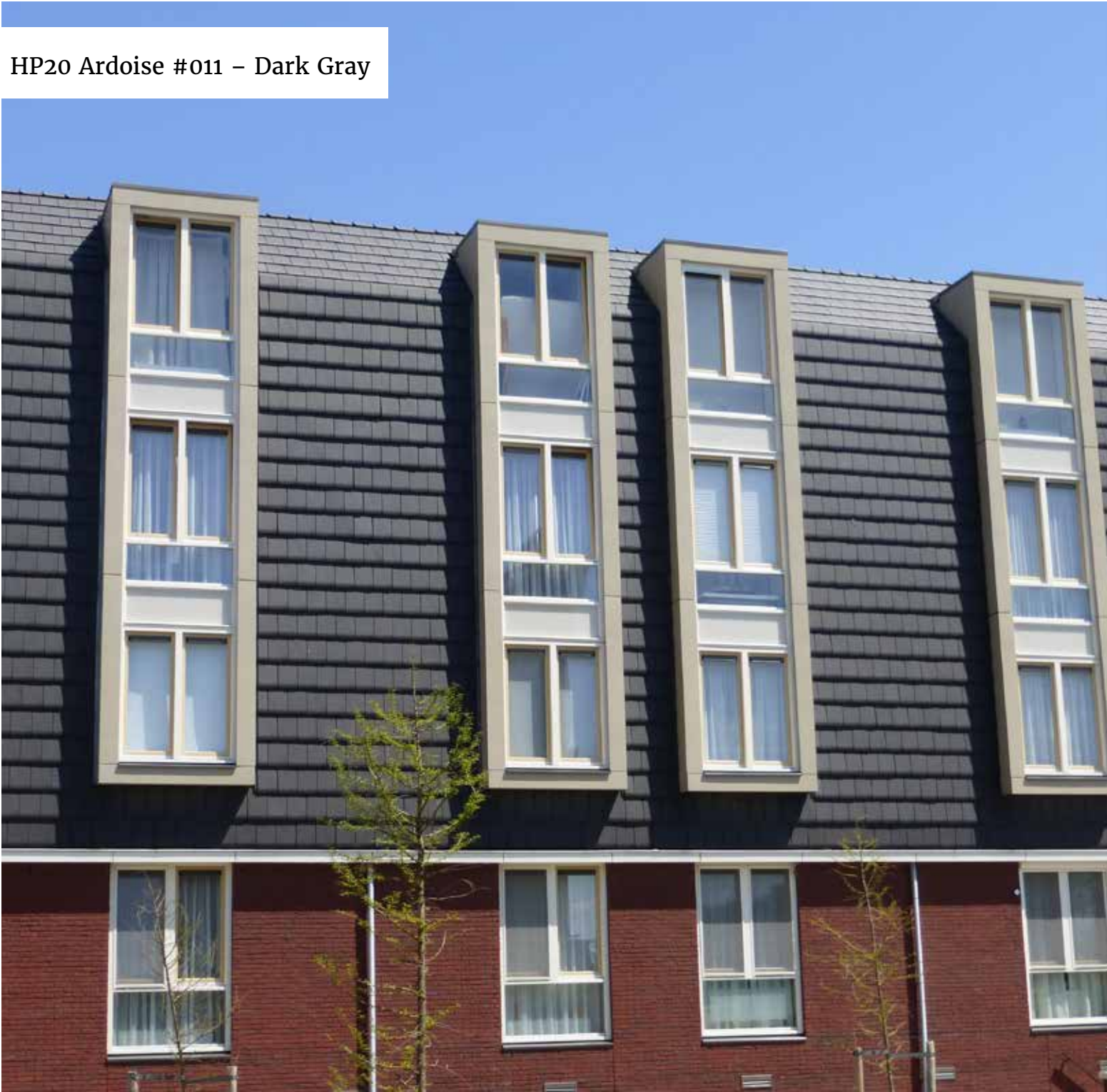

All the flat interlocking tiles offered by Northern Roof Tiles can be installed vertically making for an interesting and cost-effective alternative to regular cladding materials.

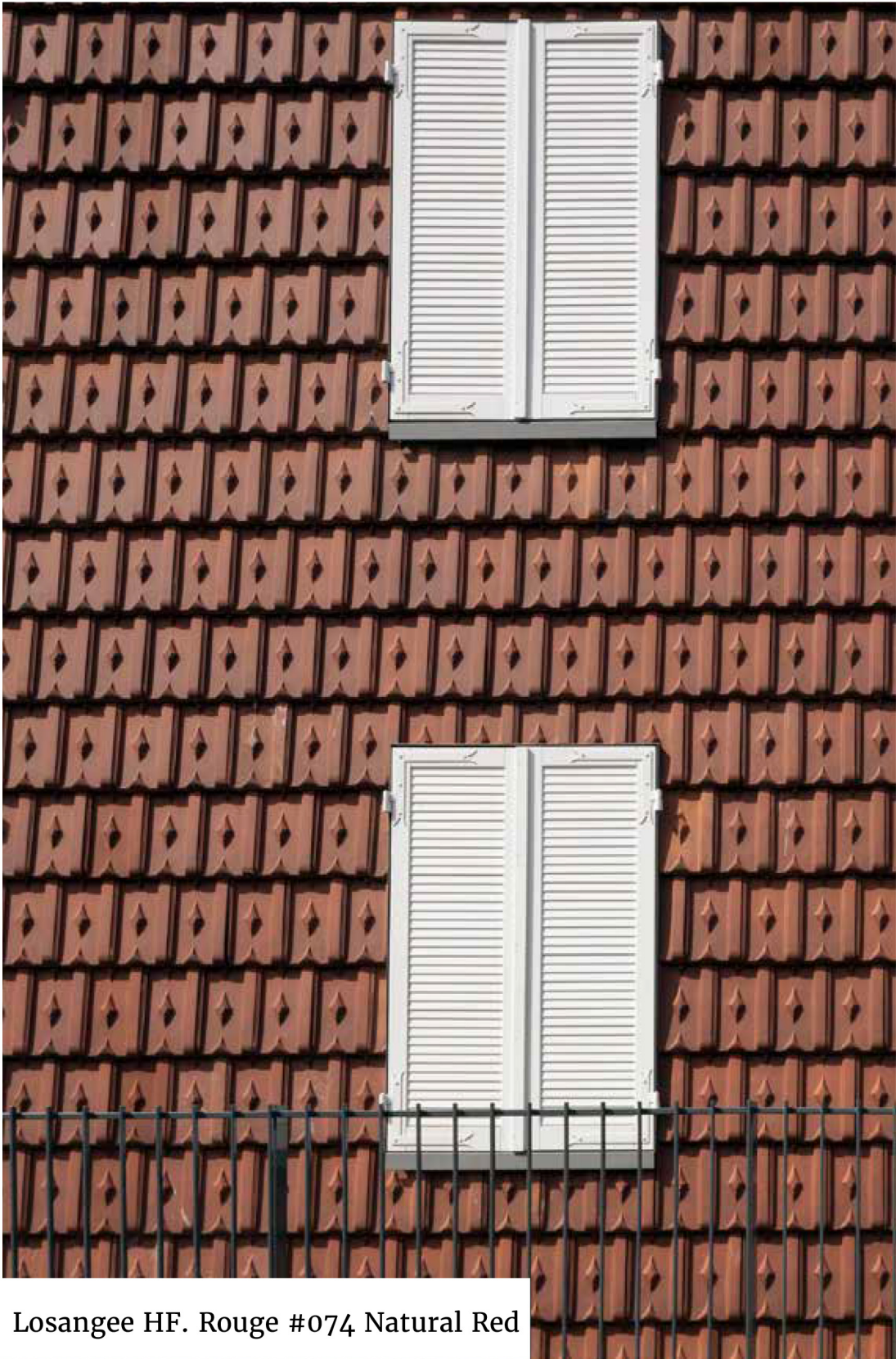

Going with the Curve – Dreadnought



We all know that the shortest distance between two points is a straight line, but sometimes life, or an understanding client, allows you to ‘follow the curve’. And as you can see our shingle tiles can follow the curves very well.



Going with the Curve Part 2 – Edilans

Believe it or not interlocking tiles can also be made to ‘follow a curve’. Some design considerations must be taken, but as you can see, it is very possible.

Rather than going from vertical to pitched roof with an awkward detail, this architect took the softer approach and transitioned through a gentle curve.

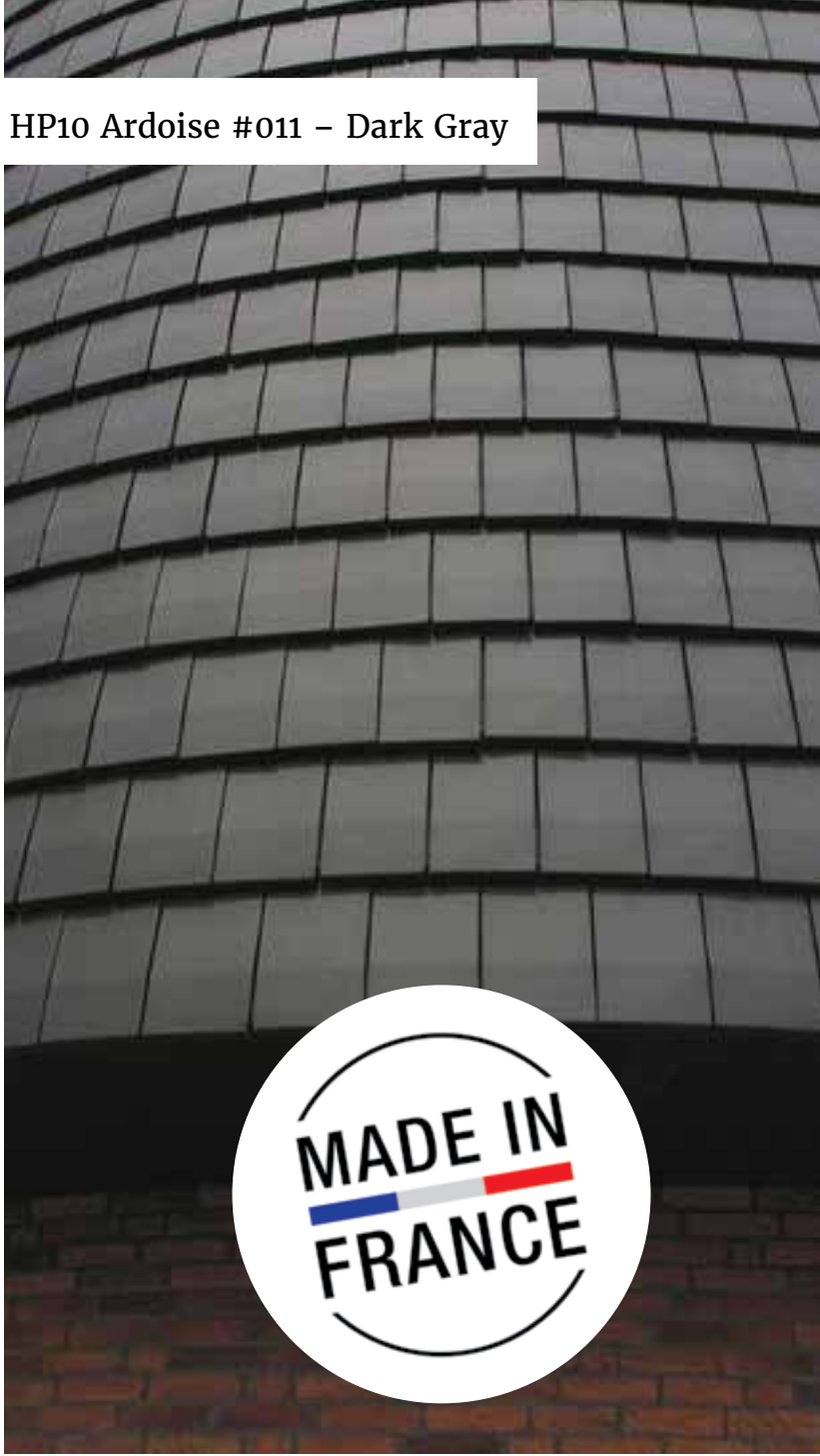
