

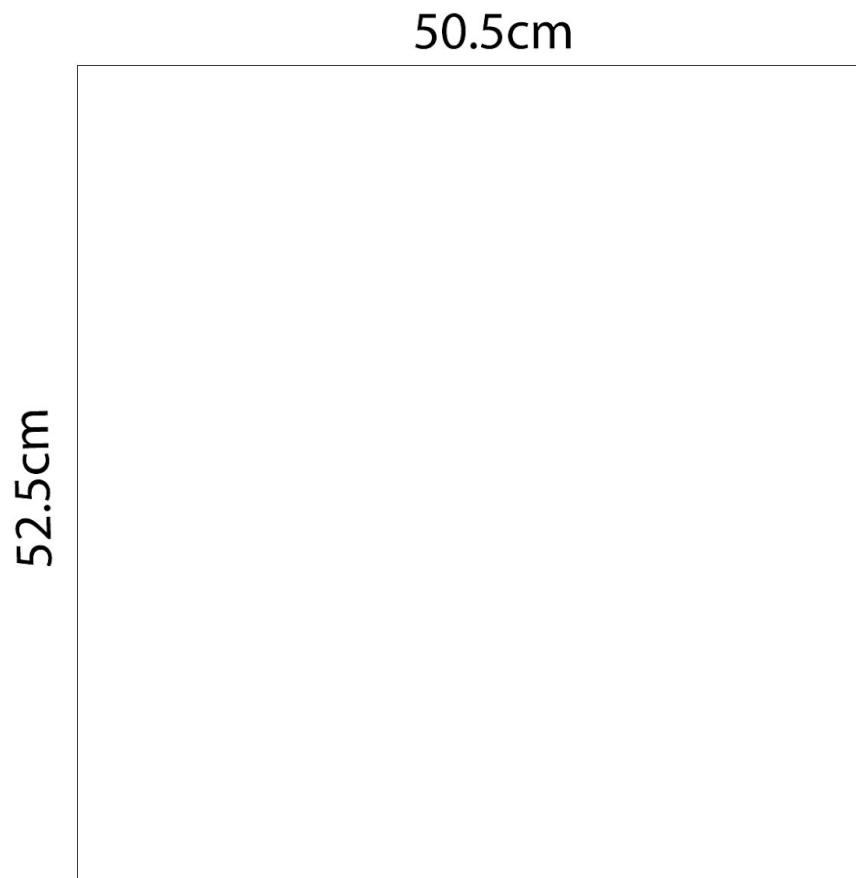
Drafting the Medical Head Cover

We know that some of you may not have access to a printer at home during this lockdown/quarantine period, so here is a guide on how you can draft your own head cover pattern.

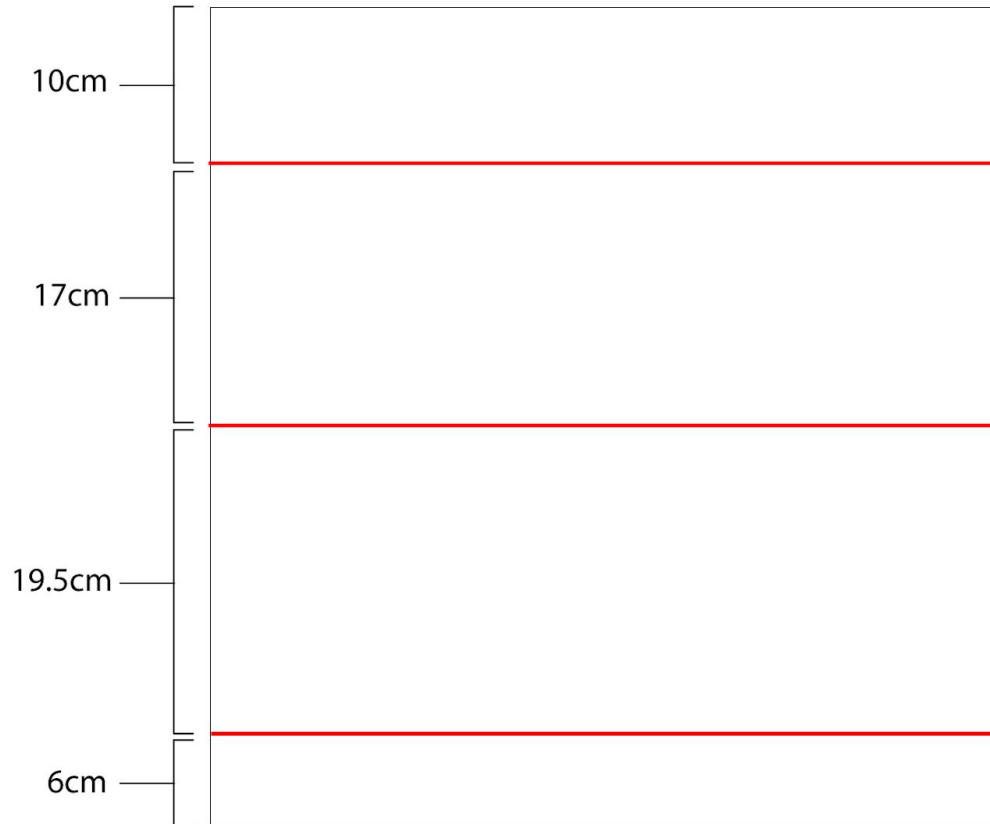
What you'll need:

- 1. A large piece of paper, or simply glue several A4 sheets together**
- 2. Pencil**
- 3. Long ruler**
- 4. Optional: Dressmaking ruler / French curve**

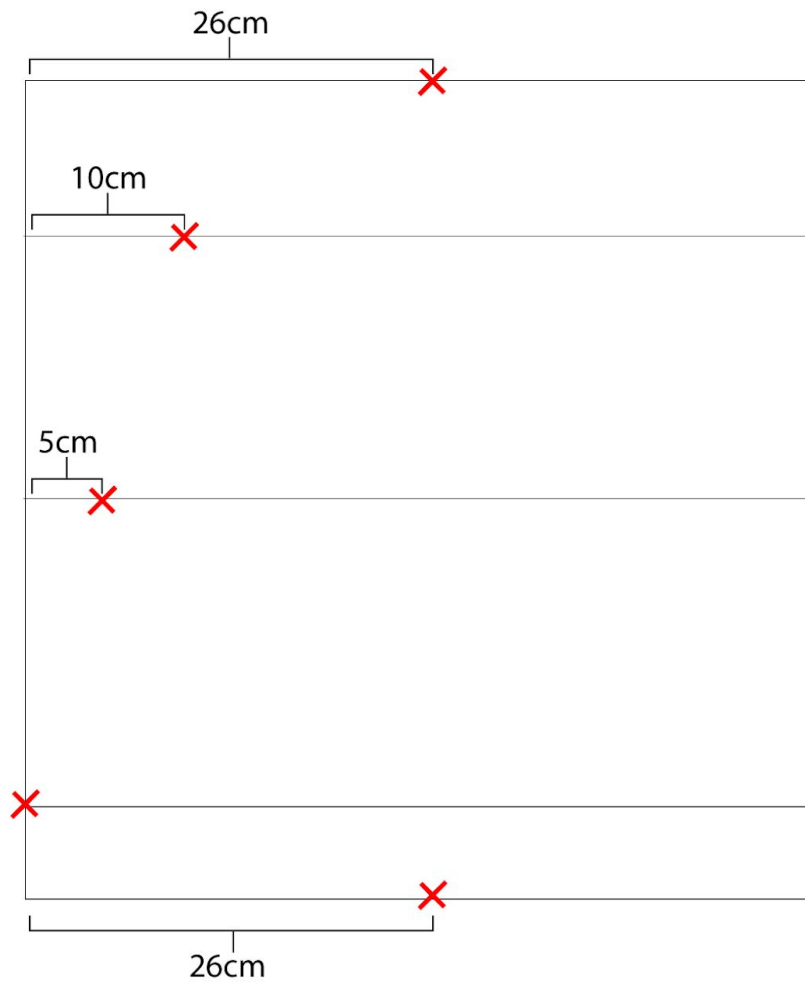
1. Draw a square measuring 50.5cm x 52.5cm



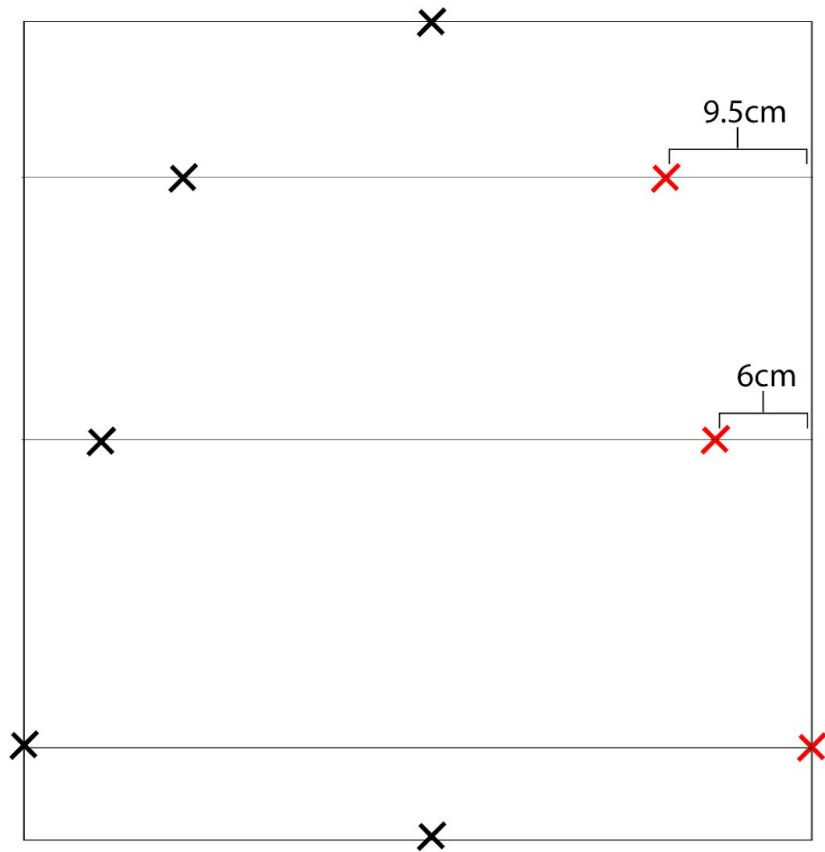
2. Divide the height of the box with 3 lines according to the measurements (marked in red below).



3. Mark the first 5 points following the measurements (red x's below):



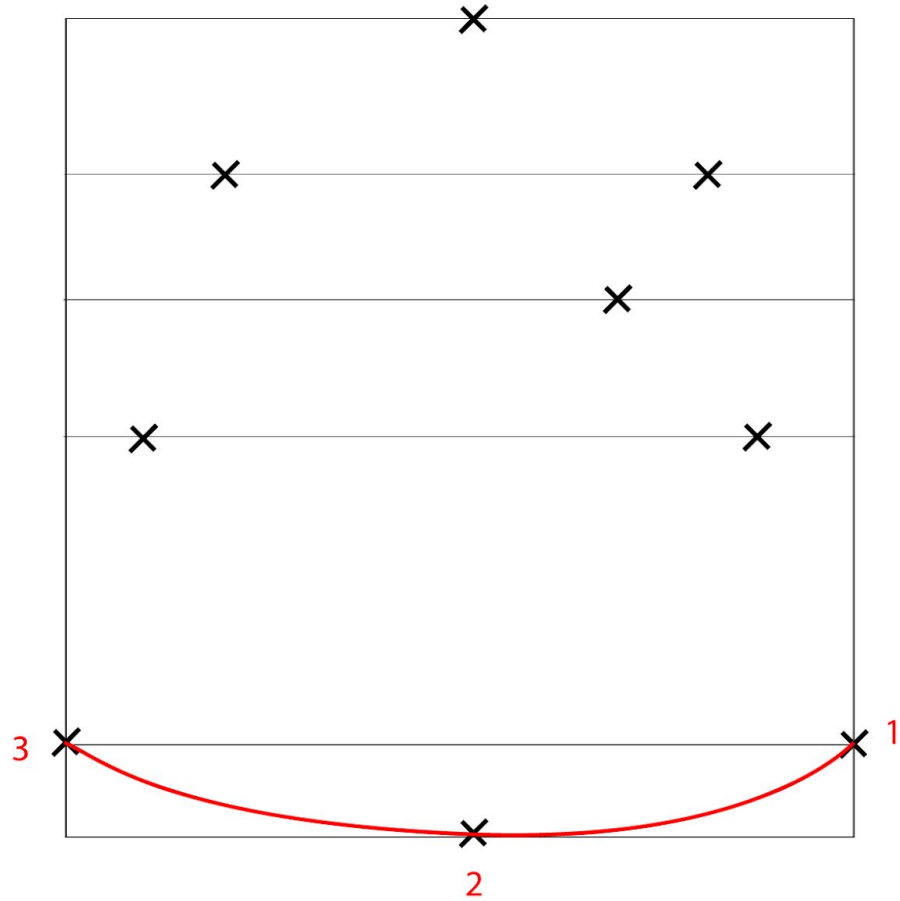
4. Mark the next 3 points below.



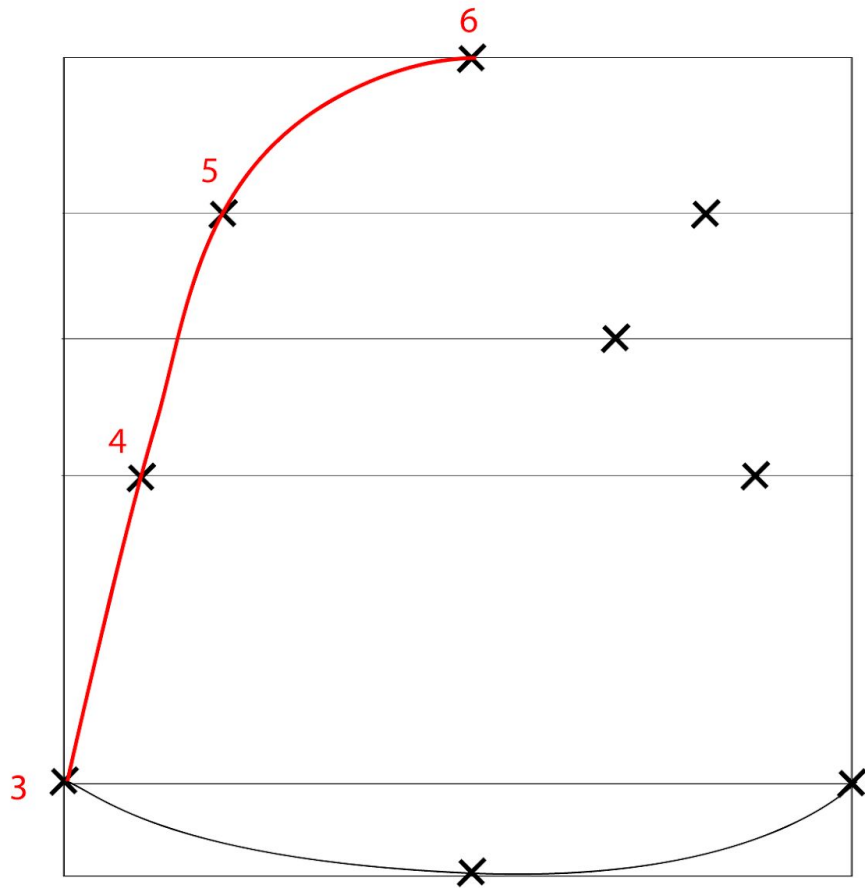
5. Mark the last point following the measurements below.



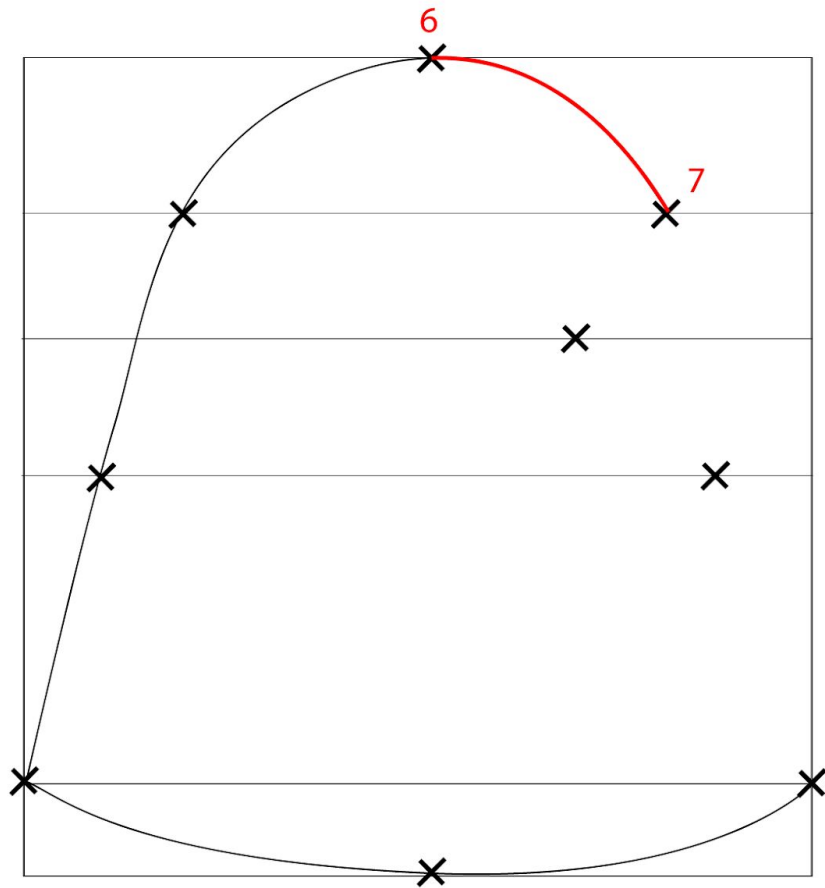
6. Time to join up the dots! Using a dressmaking ruler / French curve / eyeballing skills (don't worry, it doesn't need to be perfect), draw the curve lines connecting 1, 2 and 3.



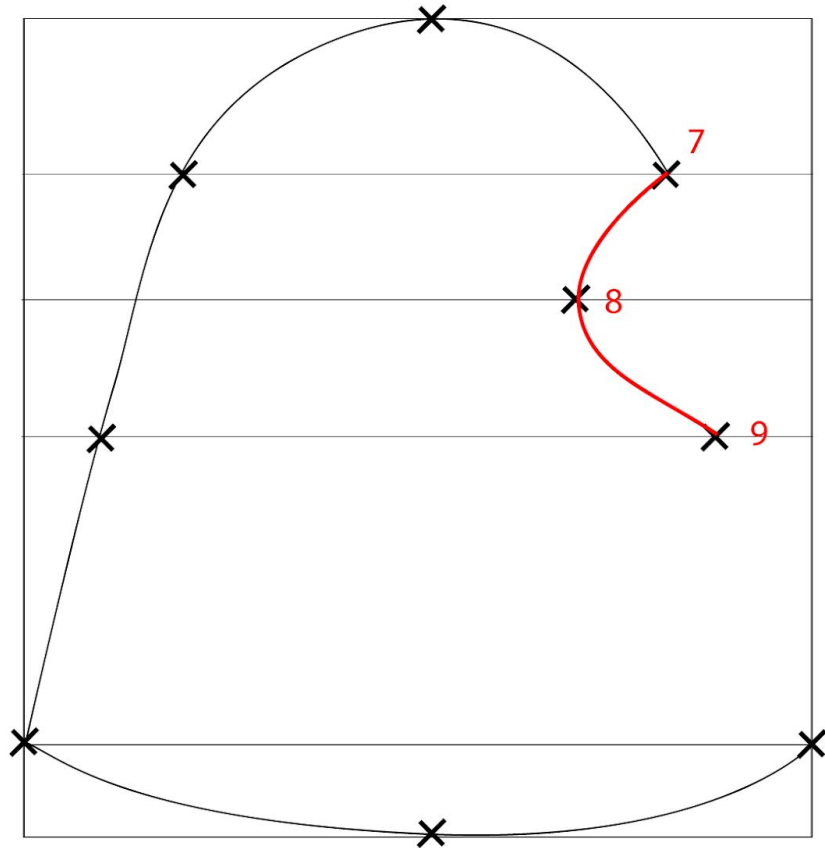
7. Continue on with 3, 4, 5, 6. Think of it as the back of Darth Vader's helmet.



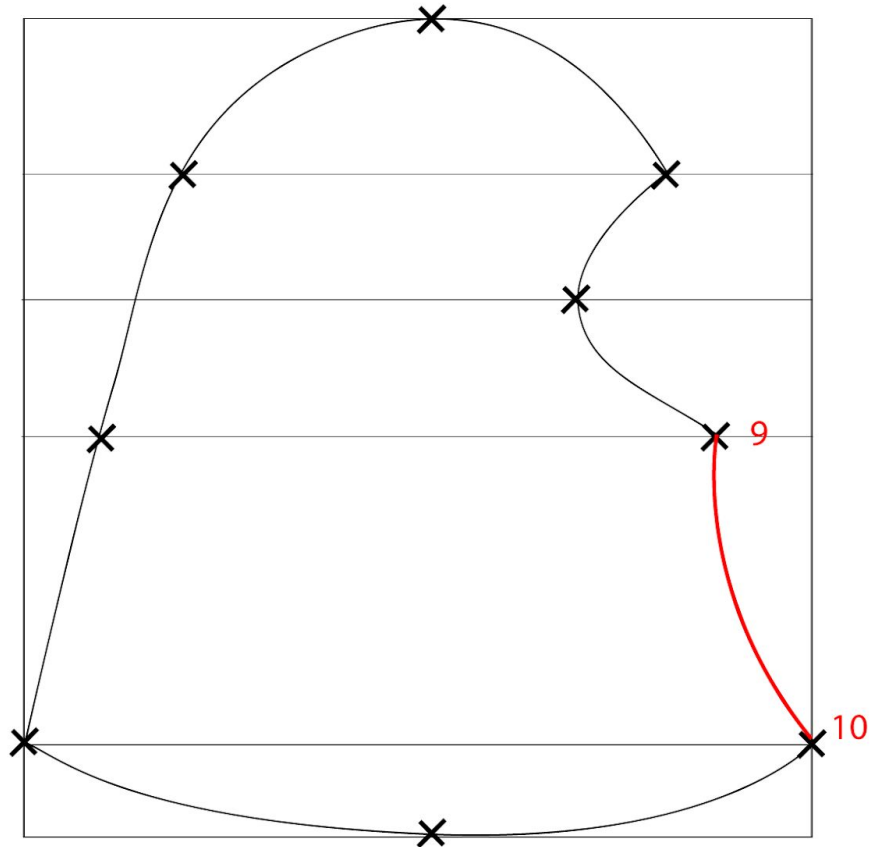
8. Now draw 6 to 7-- note that it isn't meant to be symmetrical to 5 to 6.



9. Now for the valley-- think of this as a rollercoaster ride where it dips and rises back up. Start by only drawing from 7 to 8 first. Next, connect 8 to 9-- note that this shape isn't a perfect "C".



10. Complete 9 to 10 with a curved line.



11. Lastly, here are the measurements for the straps.
