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Bell Work Teacher Information

- The first day of every month I give each student a copy of the current bell work sheet on colored paper, which is kept folded and placed inside his/her "BELL WORK" notebook.
- While I take care of attendance, milk money, etc., the students begin to answer that day's question in their notebooks.
- After I have finished getting everything in order, we take up that day's bell work. At the end of the month students are welcome to bring their sheets home to share with a parent, or put in our scrap paper bin.
- These questions are a mix of creative and academic tasks, with some questions adapted from state and provincial tests.
- This is the Canadian version with appropriate spellings and measurement units. I also have an American version!



August Bell Work

- 1. What do you want your teacher to really know about you? Write a short paragraph (4-5 sentences) letting your teacher learn all about you!
- 2. Continue this number pattern as high as you can: 1, 3, 6, 10, 15...
- 3. Your teacher has made a rock garden behind her house. Four of the largest rocks weigh 420 grams, 730 grams, 850 grams, and 680 grams. Calculate the total mass of the rocks. Can you write it in more than one way?
- 4. Write as many words as you can using the words in "summertime".
- 5. Write a **recount** about a frustrating day that you experienced recently. Remember to tell about the events in that order they happened. Give your recount a title.
- 6. There were 18 people sitting in six cars in line at the drive-through window at McDonalds. Each car held the same number of people. How many people were in each car?
- 7. Draw coins to show as many ways as possible to make 78 cents. For example: 2 quarters, 2 dimes, and 8 pennies.
