PRIMARY TEXT: Matthew 6:9-13 "This, then, is how you should pray:

"Our Father in heaven,  
hallowed be your name,  
<sup>10</sup> your kingdom come,  
your will be done,  
on earth as it is in heaven.

<sup>11</sup> Give us today our daily bread.

<sup>12</sup> And forgive us our debts,  
as we also have forgiven our debtors.

<sup>13</sup> And lead us not into temptation,<sup>[a]</sup>  
but deliver us from the evil one.<sup>[b]</sup> '

Matthew 6:9 "This, then, is how you should pray: "OUR FATHER in heaven, hallowed be your name,

A. OUR

Acts 1:14 They all joined together constantly in prayer, along with the women and Mary the mother of Jesus, and with his brothers

B. FATHER

Specifically "Abba is an intimate, tender, folksy, pedestrian term, the warmest of the Aramaic words for 'father.'" Formality stripped away." (Before Amen, Max Lucado, 13)

A. HALLOWED BE YOUR NAME

Matthew 6:9b "This, then, is how you should pray:

"Our Father in heaven,  
HALLOWED BE YOUR NAME."

B. YOUR WILL BE DONE ON EARTH AS IT IS IN HEAVEN

Matthew 6:10 <sup>10</sup> your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

III. \_\_\_\_\_ PRAYER--HONEST ABOUT OUR NEEDS

Romans 8:26 In the same way, the Spirit helps us in our weakness. We do not know what we ought to pray for, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us through wordless groans.

Matthew 6:13 <sup>13</sup> And lead us not into temptation,<sup>[a]</sup> but deliver us from the evil one.<sup>[b]</sup>
