

Veterinary Nursing Awareness Month

Who is caring for your animal?

Have you ever wondered who is responsible for the nursing care of your pets when you leave them at the veterinary practice?

The formal veterinary nursing qualification that has been recognised in the UK for over half a century is that of the VN, nowadays amended to the Registered Vet Nurse to indicate that the holder's name is held on the RCVS list of registered nurses. The role of the vet nurse is very varied and responsibilities include: in-patient care – carrying out nursing care & working alongside the vet, administering medication, wound management, monitoring IV fluids, surgical assistance, and diagnostic procedures (x-rays, laboratory work) and providing accurate information for clients. Training to become an RVN can take between 3-4 years. The post nominal REVN means the qualification was taken with the horse as the main nursing species.

Registered veterinary nurses have the technical knowledge and hands on expertise to care for animals with skill and empathy and are a valuable part of our team.

Wormer of the Month-Noromectin

Noromectin paste kills the adult and fourth larval stages of most of the important internal parasites including small redworms, lungworms and bots with a single dose. Each syringe treats up to a 700kg horse and cost just £6.18(inc). If you buy 10 we will give you a 10% discount, ask Karen for more details.
