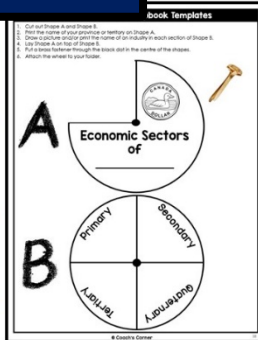
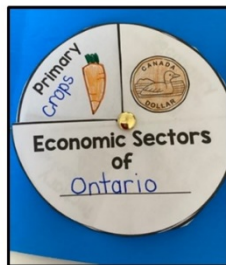


# EVERYTHING YOU NEED!!

## Economic Sectors

- Have students work in small groups to brainstorm jobs they know are held by many people in your local region. You may want to provide each group with a few books about Ontario that show different types of jobs.
- As a class, compile a list of jobs that are common to the citizens of Ontario.
- Have students suggest ways in these jobs may be sorted.
- Introduce and discuss the Economic Sectors text.
- If desired, you can photocopy or simply project the chart showing the different sectors for each province and territory.
- Students assemble the Economic Sectors Lapbook Template and attach it to their lapbooks.

# Differentiated Options for Students

## Interesting Facts About Alberta: Correct Sentences (for teacher eyes only!)

5

- Have students work in groups of 5 to read the Interesting Facts About Alberta (A).
- Each group member can read one of the sections, and then report back to the rest of the group about what they read.
- Students then read the six "facts" on the Interesting Facts About Alberta (B) sheet and decide which two sentences are not actually "facts", based on the text they just read.
- Students cut out and colour the "true" facts, and then assemble the pocket for the lapbook component.
- Students put the 4 facts in the pocket and glue the pocket onto the lapbook.



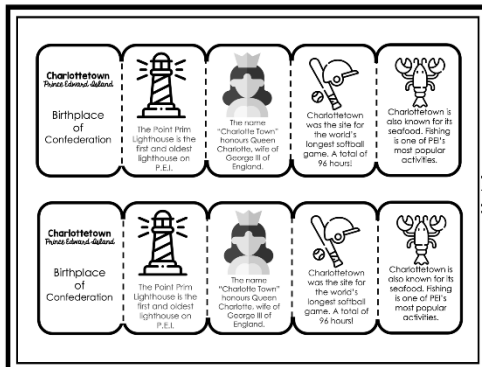
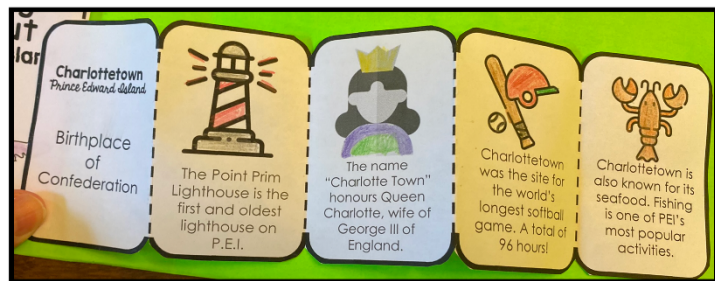

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## Capital City

- Ask students where they think decisions that are important to **Prince Edward Island** are made.
- Explain that a large city in each province or territory has the "capital" city. The capital city has special buildings where elected citizens vote on laws for the region.
- In **Prince Edward Island** the capital city is **Charlottetown**.
- One person from each **municipality** in **Prince Edward Island** is voted by citizens to represent them as their **Member of Provincial Parliament (MPP)**.
- The MPPs work in the **Legislative Assembly of Prince Edward Island** in **Charlottetown**.
- Students cut on the solid lines of the **Charlottetown, Prince Edward Island** accordion-book, and fold on the dotted lines before gluing onto the lapbook.

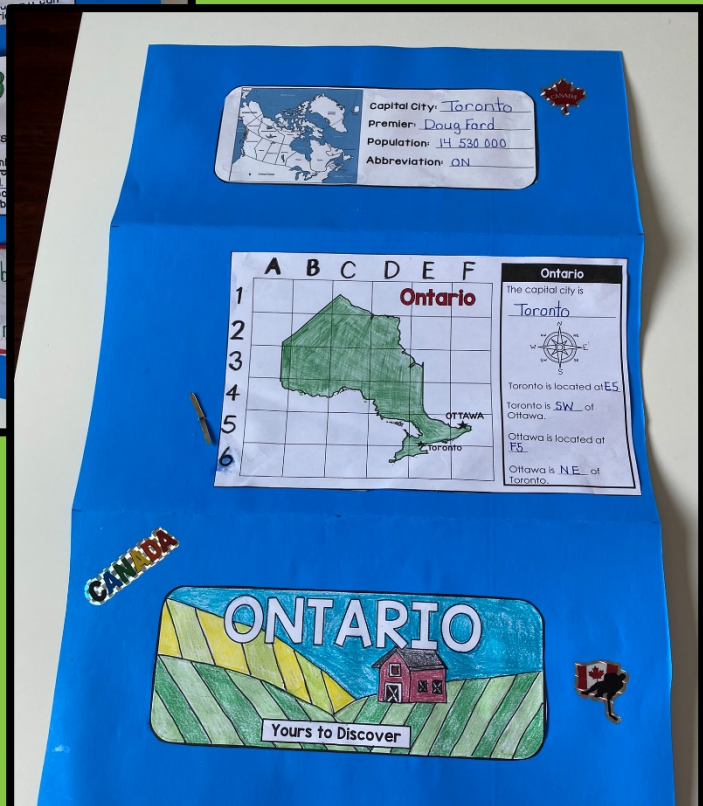
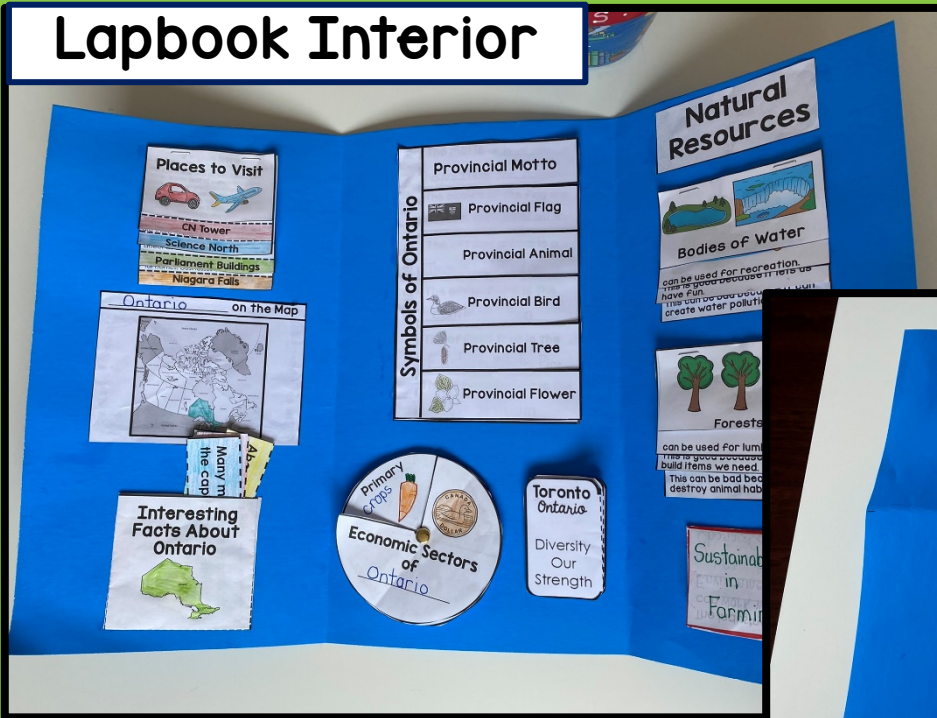
