Scripture Reading—Psalm 2:1-12

Why do the nations rage and the peoples plot in vain? The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers take counsel together, against the Lord and against His Anointed, saying, "Let us burst their bonds apart and cast away their cords from us." He who sits in the heavens laughs; the Lord holds them in derision. Then He will speak to them in His wrath, and terrify them in His fury, saying, "As for Me, I have set My King on Zion, My holy hill." I will tell of the decree: The Lord said to Me, "You are My Son; today I have begotten You. Ask of Me, and I will make the nations Your heritage, and the ends of the earth Your possession. You shall break them with a rod of iron and dash them in pieces like a potter's vessel." Now therefore, O kings, be wise; be warned, O rulers of the earth. Serve the Lord with fear, and rejoice with trembling. Kiss the Son, lest He be angry, and you perish in the way, for His wrath is quickly kindled. Blessed are all who take refuge in Him.

Reading of the Word-Acts 4:13-31

¹³ Now when they saw the boldness of Peter and John, and perceived that they were uneducated, common men, they were astonished. And they recognized that they had been with Jesus. ¹⁴ But seeing the man who was healed standing beside them, they had nothing to say in opposition. ¹⁵ But when they had commanded them to leave the council, they conferred with one another, ¹⁶ saying, "What shall we do with these men? For that a notable sign has been performed through them is evident to all the inhabitants of Jerusalem, and we cannot deny it. ¹⁷ But in order that it may spread no further among the people, let us warn them to speak no more to anyone in this name." ¹⁸So they called them and charged them not to speak or teach at all in the name of Jesus. ¹⁹ But Peter and John answered them, "Whether it is right in the sight of God to listen to you rather than to God, you must judge, ²⁰ for we cannot but speak of what we have seen and heard."²¹ And when they had further threatened them, they let them go, finding no way to punish them, because of the people, for all were praising God for what had happened. ²² For the man on whom this sign of healing was performed was more than forty years old.

²³When they were released, they went to their friends and reported what the chief priests and the elders had said to them. ²⁴And when they heard it, they lifted their voices together to God and said, "Sovereign Lord, who made the heaven and the earth and the sea and everything in them, ²⁵ who through the mouth of our father David, Your servant, said by the Holy Spirit, "Why did the Gentiles rage, and the peoples plot in vain? ²⁶ The kings of the earth set themselves, and the rulers were gathered together, against the Lord and against His Anointed'—²⁷ for truly in this city there were gathered together against Your holy servant Jesus, whom You anointed, both Herod and Pontius Pilate, along with the Gentiles and the peoples of Israel, ²⁸ to do whatever Your hand and Your plan had predestined to take place. ²⁹ And now, Lord, look upon their threats and grant to Your servants to continue to speak Your word with all boldness, ³⁰ while You stretch out Your hand to heal, and signs and wonders are performed through the name of Your holy servant Jesus." ³¹ And when they had prayed, the place in which they were gathered together was shaken, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and continued to speak the word of God with boldness.

Pastor: This is the Word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God.

Confession of Sin-based on Psalm 32:3-7

Pastor: This is the promise of God.


All: This is the Word of the Lord.

People: And also with you.


Pastor: Lift up your hearts.

Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, on Earth as it is in Heaven.


Give us this day our daily bread.


And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors.

Worship Notes:

In Acts 4, we see the Apostles presenting the gospel with tremendous courage in the face of intense opposition. The contrast between God and His people and their enemies is a theme found throughout the Scriptures, particularly in the psalms that make up much of our service this morning. The nations rage and plot vainly, but the voice of the Lord thunders over the waters and shakes the wilderness (Psalm 2:1; Psalm 29:3-4). While the wicked can be found "speaking lies with serpents' tongues" (*Do You Decree, O Earthly Gods—Psalm 58*), the church is an "army bold" that "stand[s] against the devil's lies" (*O Church, Arise*). Though our enemies may be terrifying, we pray for God to fill our hearts with courage as we wait on Him (*O Lord, Teach Me To Follow You—Psalm 27*), trusting that He will keep us secure (*I Lift My Eyes And See The Hills—Psalm 121*) even when we walk through the "shades of death" (*My Shepherd Will Supply My Need—Psalm 23*). We can rest on the firm foundation of His Word (*How Firm A Foundation*), secure in the knowledge that all the opposition we may encounter will serve to consume our dross and refine us like gold in the fire. —Henry C. Haffner
