All: The Lord is our shepherd; we shall not want. He makes us lie down in green pastures.


Reader 1: He leads me beside still waters. He restores my soul.

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
Reading of the Word—Hebrews 13:20-25

Sermon—Benediction of the Risen Shepherd

GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO CONFESSION, REPENTANCE, AND RECONCILIATION

The people of God respond to His Word by confessing their sins, repenting of their sinful ways, and seeking God's favor through the reconciling work of Jesus, the Son of God.

Confession of Sin—based on Matthew 26:31-35

Pastor: Lord, we come confessing. As Jesus said to His disciples on the night He was betrayed, "You will

all fall away because of Me this night. For it is written, 'I will strike the shepherd, and the sheep

of the flock will be scattered.' But I will be raised up and go before you."

All: But each of us says with Peter, "Though they all fall away because of you, I will never fall

away."

Pastor: Jesus tells us that that without a shepherd, we will deny Him three times before the rooster crows.

All: Yet we all say that even if we must die with Christ, we will not deny Him.

Assurance of Pardon—Jeremiah 31:33-34; John 3:16-17

For this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, declares the Lord: I will put My law within them, and I will write it on their hearts. And I will be their God, and they shall be My people. And no longer shall each one teach his neighbor and each his brother, saying, 'Know the Lord,' for they shall all know Me, from the least of them to the greatest, declares the Lord. For I will forgive their iniquity, and I will remember their sin no more."

Pastor: This is the promise of God. This is the Word of the Lord.

All: For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life.

Pastor: For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through Him.

All: Thanks be to God.

Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done, on Earth as it is in Heaven.


Give us this day our daily bread.

Worship Notes:

The author of Hebrews concludes his letter with a blessing from "Jesus, the great shepherd of the sheep." Pastoral images abound in this morning's service: readings from Psalm 23 and Micah 5 describe Christ as our shepherd, along with the hymns Jesus, Shepherd Of Thy People, How Sweet The Name Of Jesus Sounds, and O Thou In Whose Presence. As we sing All People That On Earth Do Dwell (Psalm 100) and Hear Me, All You People (Psalm 49), we give thanks that the Lord takes us as His own sheep and we are warned that those who trust in earthly riches and wisdom will find that death is their shepherd. The service concludes with a string of hymns that attempt to capture the central theme of the book of Hebrews. Give Me Jesus, My Jesus, I Love Thee, Jesus Shall Reign, and O Christ, Our Hope all proclaim the message that our pastors have emphasized to us so many times these past nine months—"Jesus is better."
