
GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO WORSHIP

All: Indeed, none who wait for You shall be put to shame; they shall be ashamed who are wantonly treacherous.


Reader 1: Make us to know Your ways, O Lord; teach us Your paths.

Scripture Reading—Romans 15:8-13

For I tell you that Christ became a servant to the circumcised to show God's truthfulness, in order to confirm the promises given to the patriarchs, and in order that the Gentiles might glorify God for His mercy. As it is written, "Therefore I will praise You among the Gentiles, and sing to Your name." And again it is said, "Rejoice, O Gentiles, with His people." And again, "Praise the Lord, all you Gentiles, and let all the peoples extol Him." And again Isaiah says, "The root of Jesse will come, even He who arises to rule the Gentiles; in Him will the Gentiles hope." May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in hope.

Reading of the Word—Psalm 18:30-50


³⁰This God—His way is perfect; the word of the Lord proves true; He is a shield for all those who take refuge in Him. ³¹For who is God, but the Lord? And who is a rock, except our God? —³² the God who equipped me with strength and made my way blameless. ³³He made my feet like the feet of a deer and set me secure on the heights. ³⁴He trains my hands for war, so that my arms can bend a bow of bronze. ³⁵You have given me the shield of Your salvation, and Your right hand supported me, and Your gentleness made me great. ³⁶You gave a wide place for my steps under me, and my feet did not slip. ³⁷I pursued my enemies and overtook them, and did not turn back till they were consumed. ³⁸I thrust them through, so that they were not able to rise; they fell under my feet. ³⁹For You equipped me with strength for the battle; You made those who rise against me sink under me. ⁴⁰You made my enemies turn their backs to me, and those who hated me I destroyed. ⁴¹They cried for help, but there was none to save; they cried to the Lord, but He did not answer them. ⁴²I beat them fine as dust before the wind; I cast them out like the mire of the streets.

⁴³ You delivered me from strife with the people; You made me the head of the nations; people whom I had not known served me. ⁴⁴ As soon as they heard of me they obeyed me; foreigners came cringing to me. ⁴⁵ Foreigners lost heart and came trembling out of their fortresses. ⁴⁶ The Lord lives, and blessed be my rock, and exalted be the God of my salvation—⁴⁷ the God who gave me vengeance and subdued peoples under me, ⁴⁸ who rescued me from my enemies; yes, You exalted me above those who rose against me; You delivered me from the man of violence. ⁴⁹ For this I will praise You, O Lord, among the nations, and sing to Your name. ⁵⁰ Great salvation He brings to His king, and shows steadfast love to His anointed, to David and his offspring forever.

GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO CONFESSION, REPENTANCE, AND RECONCILIATION

The people of God respond to His Word by confessing their sins, repenting of their sinful ways, and seeking God's favor through the reconciling work of Jesus, the Son of God.

Confession of Sin—based on Psalm 25:6-7, 11, 18

Pastor: Lord, we come confessing. We confess that we do not take refuge in You as we ought. Remember Your mercy, O Lord, and Your steadfast love, for they have been from of old.

All: Remember not the sins of our youth or our transgressions; according to Your steadfast love remember us, for the sake of Your goodness!

Pastor: For Your name's sake, O Lord, pardon our guilt, for it is great.

All: Consider our affliction and our trouble, and forgive all our sins.

Assurance of Pardon—Psalm 103:6-7, 10-12; Romans 1:16-17

The Lord works righteousness and justice for all who are oppressed. He made known His ways to Moses, His acts to the people of Israel. He does not deal with us according to our sins, nor repay us according to our iniquities. For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is His steadfast love toward those who fear Him; as far as the east is from the west, so far does He remove our transgressions from us.

Pastor: This is the promise of God.


All: This is the Word of the Lord.

Congregational Psalm—I Love You, Lord, My Strength (Psalm 18)




GOD SENDS HIS PEOPLE OUT

Eight years ago, I moved to Franklin in one of the most tumultuous weeks of my life. A week and a half prior I had just had my wisdom teeth removed when we received a phone call that my grandfather had just been diagnosed with a rare form of Leukemia and had two weeks to live. We immediately packed up the car and made the 36 hour drive from Colorado to Pensacola, Florida. A week later, I said goodbye to my grandfather for what I thought was the last time so that I could fly back to Colorado and pack my bags to make it to Franklin in time for Freshmen orientation. Little did I know that I wouldn't just be spending the next four years in Franklin, but the next eight. Over the course of these eight years, I have seen the Lord's abundant kindness and generosity. For one thing, my wisdom teeth don't hurt anymore, but also my grandfather, who had been given two weeks to live, is still alive. There are other gifts too that I didn't even know I needed: the gift of living with some of my dearest friends, the gift of being on staff with some of the most gracious people I've ever met, and the gift of a church that seeks to live covenantally. I am joining David from our passage this morning in Psalm 18. Our God is a shield for those who take refuge in Him. His way is perfect, and though our lives may seem tumultuous, He is faithful. He is guiding us with His powerful hand and feeding us with the bread of heaven. As we seek to walk the path of righteousness, may we know that our feet stand on solid ground and that our God is a refuge to those who seek Him. —Emma Marsh
