Last year, Wildlands Conservancy celebrated our golden anniversary of 50 years. We amplified the visionary voices that gave rise to conservation and education mission all those decades ago, and the call to support our efforts on behalf of people and nature in the Lehigh Valley and Lehigh River watershed is more critical than ever.

Our board of directors and staff praised our successes, acknowledged our challenges, and altogether, we remain resolved about being in this forever business for future generations. We are committed to caring for our shared and loved Lehigh Valley and Lehigh River watershed today and tomorrow—and for the next 50 years and beyond.

Protecting Land

Last year, thanks to your generosity, we expanded South Mountain Preserve in Emmaus by nearly 4 acres, and you helped us permanently protect more than 630 acres in Penn Forest Township, Carbon County, to expand state game lands, enhancing access to outdoor recreation while upholding our commitment to clean water and a healthy environment.

Advancing Water Quality

Your support helps advance the whole health of our 10-county Lehigh River watershed, and last year, we continued the restoration of Bushkill Creek as it flows through the City of Easton, removing two dams, which opened fish passage to the Delaware River for the first time in 200 years.

Educating a Tomorrow

A tomorrow for conservation is only as secure as the young minds we educate today, and last year, with your support, Wildlands benefited more than 4,500 school-age children with environmental education, plus connected more than 17,000 community members with local, natural areas, including Dorothy Rider Pool Wildlife Sanctuary, South Mountain Preserve, Trexler Nature Preserve, the Lehigh River and destinations in Carbon and Monroe counties.

The Future of Our Wildlands

Last year also closed our five-year **capital campaign for the** *Future of Our Wildlands*, raising \$20.4 million to support transformational accomplishments (page 5) for land protection, stewardship and education, Dorothy Rider Pool Wildlife Sanctuary, and our land trust's long-term financial stability.

On behalf of our board of directors and staff, I thank you for the world of nature you make possible for our shared Lehigh Valley and Lehigh River watershed, this year and for many milestone anniversaries to come. You make conservation happen – forever!

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN FOR THE FUTURE OF OUR WILDLANDS: 2019-23

Our region is losing 2,000 acres of open space each year, and land protection is vital to our quality of life by giving us clean water, expansive green space, opportunities to connect with nature, find a home for rare, threatened and endangered species. To these ends, Wildlands' five-year capital campaign raised \$20.4 million to accomplish:

Land Protection:

- Protected 3,879 acres with Lehigh River watershed
- Added three conservation easements
- Established three new nature preserves
- Expanded preserves by 132 acres

Dorothy Rider Pool Wildlife Sanctuary:

- Restoration of the barn and boardwalk along the Floodplain Trail
- Improvements to Air Products Environmental Education Center
- · Establishment of a visitor center

Building Long-term Financial Stability:

- Established the Land Preservation Endowment
- Designated \$890,000 of campaign funds to the organization's endowment

Stewardship & Education:

- · Led the Lehigh Valley Riparian Buffer Initiative
- Continued habitat management at Thomas Darling Preserve to facilitate the return of the Golden-Winged Warbler and monitor for at-risk Northern Flying Squirrel presence
- Hosted programs for 61,121 students and 86,501 community members




