I. <u>Predicate Nominative</u>: If the main verb of a sentence is a form of *sum*, it is often accompanied by a noun or adjective in the nominative case. This is referred to as a <u>predicate nominative</u>.

Vir <u>poeta</u> est.	The man is a poet.
<u>Laetī</u> sumus.	We are happy.

II. <u>Complementary Infinitive</u>: If a sentence contains a form of the verb *possum*, it is often accompanied by a verb in the infinitive form. This is referred to as a <u>complementary infinitive</u>.

Magister bene <u>docēre</u> potest.	The teacher is able to teach well.
Nunc <u>discere</u> possumus!	Now we are able to learn!
