About Dorothy Rider Pool Wildlife Sanctuary

As late as the 1970s, this property was a working dairy farm complete with grazing pastures, crop fields, and orchards throughout much of these 77 acres.

Today, the property is a thriving nature preserve where stewardship has restored native forests, wildflower meadows, floodplains, and wetlands to flourish along the Little Lehigh Creek, a tributary of the Lehigh River.

Thanks to Pool's vision and the committed support of like-minded businesses and individual donors, Dorothy Rider Pool Wildlife Sanctuary is a special place that encourages nature discovery and learning all the days of the year. Its diversity of plants, pollinators, and wildlife, including more than 130 different bird species, provides the perfect, natural environment to help educate future environmental stewards, keeping conservation alive for the Lehigh Valley and Lehigh River watershed today, tomorrow, and always.

Here, against the backdrop of an ever-urbanizing Lehigh Valley, the sanctuary stands as a tucked-away destination that is enjoyed by hikers, birders, trail runners, families, and more, offering respite and recreation for the local community, as well as critical habitat for the wildlife who call these irreplaceable acres home, too.

The Legacy of Leonard Parker Pool




Air Products founder Leonard Parker Pool and his wife, Dorothy Rider Pool, cared deeply about the local natural environment and educating future environmental stewards — so much so that, in 1975, Leonard entrusted his 72-acre property

to Wildlands Conservancy to preserve, "for its open space, aesthetic and wildlife values, and the enjoyment of those values by the public."

Today, the property known as the Dorothy Rider Pool Wildlife Sanctuary provides the opportunity to connect thousands of people to nature each year.

Trail Map & Guide Dorothy Rider Pool Wildlife Sanctuary

The Dorothy Rider Pool Wildlife Sanctuary boasts nearly **three miles** of trails on 77.5 acres that are open to the public from dawn to dusk. Visitors can explore unique ecological features, catch views of birds and other wildlife, and access the Little Lehigh Creek along the boardwalk of the property's highly sought-after Floodplain Trail, which is ADA accessible with a parking area nearby.
