Teacher Notes

Interesting Facts About Saskatchewan: Correct Sentences (for teacher eyes only!)

- Have students work in groups of 5 to read the <u>Interesting Facts About</u> Saskatchewan (A).
- Each group member can read one of the sections, and then report back to the rest of the group about what they read.
- Students then read the six "facts" on the <u>Interesting Facts About</u> <u>Saskatchewan (B)</u> sheet and decide which two sentences are not actually "facts", based on the text they just read.
- Students cut out and colour the "true" facts, and then assemble the pocket for the lapbook component.
- Students put the 4 facts in the pocket and glue the pocket onto the lapbook.

ANSWERS:

Interesting Facts: incorrect statements are crossed out!




Symbols of Saskatchewan



 Ahead of time, you will need to decide which version of page 2 of the booklet you want students to have: blank or completed. Photocopy accordingly.

- Discuss the symbols found on Canadian coins, and why they may have been chosen.
- Explain that each province and territory in Canada also has its own official symbols. They may be:
 - > Motto
 - Flaa
 - > Animal
 - Bird
 - Tree
 - Flower
- You may want to use a projector to either:
 - show students the provincial and territorial symbols of this province using this website: https://www.canada.ca/en/canadian-heritage/services/provincial-territorial-symbols-canada/about.html
 - show students the Official Symbols of Saskatchewan page and have them complete the information on page 2 of the booklet.
- Students cut out each of the two pages that make up the Symbols of Saskatchewan booklet. They cut apart the first page on the horizontal lines, and then glue along the left-hand side before attaching the booklet to the lapbooks.
