


#### Scripture Reading—John 12:12-16

# GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO CONFESSION, REPENTANCE, AND RECONCILIATION

#### Confession of Sin—based on Nehemiah 1:5-11

Pastor: O Lord God of heaven, You keep covenant with those who love You and keep Your commandments. Let Your ears be attentive and Your eyes open to the prayer of Your servants.

All: We confess that we have sinned and acted corruptly. We have not kept Your commandments, Your statutes, and Your laws.

Pastor: We remember the words You spoke to Moses that if we were unfaithful, You would scatter us among the peoples.


All: But Lord, remember Your promise that if we return to You and keep Your commandments, You will gather us again and dwell among us.

Pastor: We are Your servants and Your people whom You have redeemed by Your great power and by Your strong hand.

Give us this day our daily bread.


And forgive us our debts,

#### Benedictory Hosannas—from Revelation 7:9-12



#### Worship Notes:

With this Sunday marking the first worship service in Clovercroft Hall, I think it would be fair to say that this will be a Palm Sunday like no other in the history of Parish Presbyterian Church! In addition to our traditional Palm Sunday elements (hymns like Lift Up Your Heads, Ye Mighty Gates, All Glory, Laud, And Honor, We Will Glorify, and Crown Him With Many Crowns, "benedictory hosannas" from Revelation 7, and the waving of palm branches as in Jesus' triumphal entry), you may notice other elements that celebrate God's provision for our new building. At the beginning of the service, the pastors will process in with a responsive reading from Isaiah 60, followed by the singing of All People That On Earth Do Dwell (Psalm 100), highlighting our commitment to the proclamation of the Scriptures. This is echoed in the opening hymn, How Firm A Foundation, which declares that our faith is built on the "excellent Word" our God has given to us, and thanks Him for His grace and provision amid deep waters and fiery trials. The musical responses in the center of the service are the "Clovercroft" service pieces—called by their Greek and Latin titles Kyrie, Gloria, Sanctus, and Agnus Dei. While most of these pieces are familiar to our congregation, having been written in 2019 and recorded in 2021 when this new building on the hill was still an unrealized plan, they have never been used all together in a service. Now, we will sing them as a complete set, in the long hoped-for place which shares their name. —Henry C. Haffner
