

Yukon Territory is a beautiful place in the northwest comer of Canada. The capital city is Whitehorse and it's named after the Yukon River which means "great river" in the local indigenous language.

Yukon is the smallest and westemmost of Canada's three territories. Only about 40 thousand people live in Yukon Territory today. Many of them belong to various First Nations groups such as Tlingit and Tagish Kwan who have lived here for centuries.



Much of the ground in the northern part of the territory is always frozen. This land is called **tundra**. Trees and plants can't grow in tundra. Some of the warmer, southern part of the Northwest Territories is forested.

The hard, frozen ground here makes it hard for many fruits and vegetable to grow. You will not find many farmers here!


Yukon Territory has mountains, plateaus, forests, and rivers. The wildlife in Yukon includes bears, caribou, moose, wolves, and many more animals





Economic Sectors

 As a class, compile a list of jobs that are common to the citizens of Yukon Territory.


- Have students suggest ways in these jobs may be sorted.

- Students assemble the <u>Economic Sectors Lapbook Template</u> and attach it to their lapbooks.








