Pastor: Your decrees are very trustworthy; holiness befits Your house, O Lord, forevermore.






His tongue tells no lies, His hands do no e - vil He ne - ver brings shame on a friend.


# Scripture Reading—Revelation 4:1-3, 5-6, 8


# Reading of the Word—Psalm 11:1-7

## GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO CONFESSION, REPENTANCE, AND RECONCILIATION

The people of God respond to His Word by confessing their sins, repenting of their sinful ways, and seeking God's favor through the reconciling work of Jesus, the Son of God.

#### Confession of Sin—based on Genesis 6:3, 5-8

Pastor: Lord, we come confessing. You know our sin, and You have said, "My Spirit shall not abide in man forever, for he is flesh: his days shall be 120 years." Lord, You saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth.

All: Lord, You see that every intention of the thoughts of our hearts are only evil continually.

Pastor: Lord, You have regretted that You had made man on the earth, and it grieved You to Your heart.

All: You created us, and You would be just to blot out us out from the face of the land. But may we find favor in Your sight.

#### Assurance of Pardon—Isaiah 53:10-11; Acts 1:8

It was the will of the Lord to crush Him; He has put Him to grief; when His soul makes an offering for guilt, He shall see His offspring; He shall prolong His days; the will of the Lord shall prosper in His hand. Out of the anguish of His soul He shall see and be satisfied; by His knowledge shall the righteous one, My servant, make many to be accounted righteous, and He shall bear their iniquities.


Pastor: This is the promise of God.

#### Worship Notes:

In Psalm 11:3, David cries out in distress "If the foundations are destroyed, what can the righteous do?" The comforting answer is found in the following verse, "The Lord is in His holy temple" (Psalm 11:4). God is on His throne, He sees our troubles, and He will put all things to right—a sentiment found throughout the service this morning. We enter worship with the words of Psalm 93, declaring that the Lord reigns, that He is robed in majesty, that He is mightier than the waters of the sea, and that His throne is established from of old. We respond with My Hope Is Built On Nothing Less, calling Christ our solid rock, our anchor, and our support in the overwhelming flood. Hymns like O The Deep, Deep Love Of Jesus, Come, Ye Disconsolate, and Alleluia! Sing To Jesus remind us that the Lord's throne is in Heaven, that He watches over us from His throne, and that pure waters flow from that throne—pure enough to remove all our sorrows. Even if we, like David, must "flee like a bird to your mountain" (Psalm 11:1), Incarnate God—Psalm 91 describes the Lord with the image of a shelter, where the little birds are safe from the fowler's snare. —Henry C. Haffner
