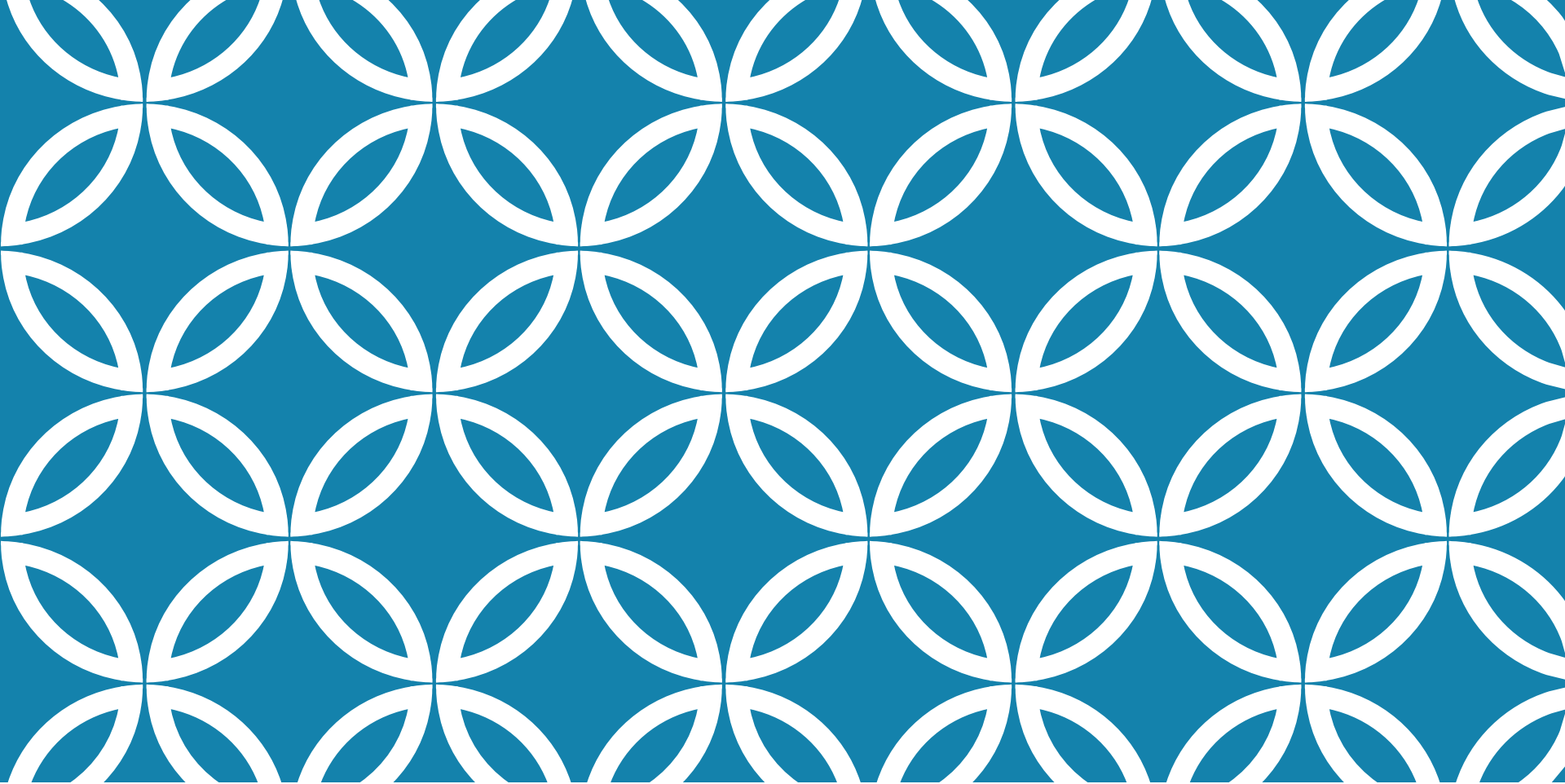

WHY ELECTRICAL ESTIMATION MATTERS

Cost Accuracy – Prevents overspending on materials

Time Efficiency – Helps schedule manpower effectively

Professional Credibility – Builds trust with clients through transparent pricing

STEP-BY-STEP ESTIMATION PROCESS

1. Identify the Scope

Count outlets, switches, fixtures, wiring runs

2. Calculate Material Costs

Wires, conduits, breakers, panels, safety devices

3. Estimate Labor

Total hours $\times$ local labor rate

4. Add Overheads & Profit Margin

Transportation, permits, tools, contingency



COMMON MISTAKES TO AVOID

Forgetting to account for material wastage

Ignoring local electrical codes

Underestimating future load requirements

Not including permit and inspection fees
