Smallest continent on earth


(7,687,000 Sq. Km)

The lowest point on Earth is on Antarctica located 8,327 ft
(2,538 m) below sea level

There are no countries in Antarctica. The U.S. and many other countries operate science stations there, but no nation owns the land

Antarctica is a desert due to its cold climate

French



Notable Facts:

- Led by Queen Elizabeth II of England and Governor General David Johnston





Namibia

- It was the first country to officially protect the environment.





- Sudan has 15 states




South Sudan

Capital: Juba




Egypt

Russia is the largest country in the world.




Indonesia




IRAQ

United Kingdom



