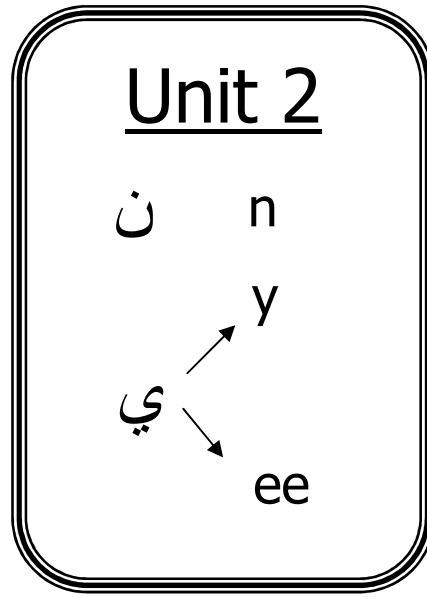


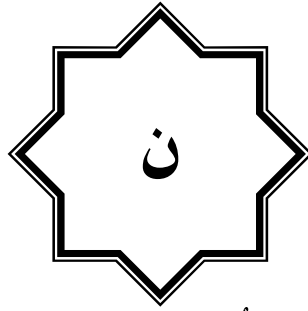

Noon نُون

Al-qiraa'ah الْقِرَاءَةُ

Phonetics

Pronunciation: Like N in English.

Exit: Between the tip of the tongue and the gums of the two upper central incisors.

Noon is a light letter.



Noon with Fat-hah is na = نَ

Noon with Kasrah is ni = نِ

Noon with Dammah is nu = نُ

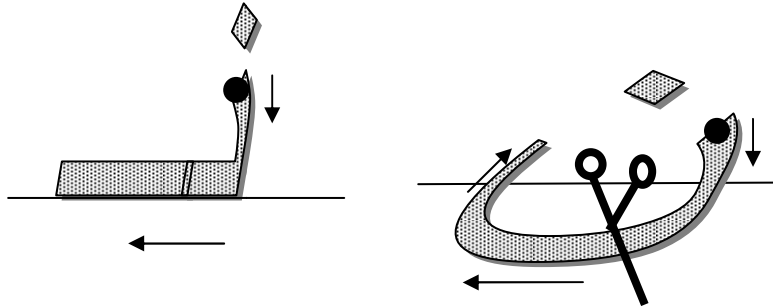

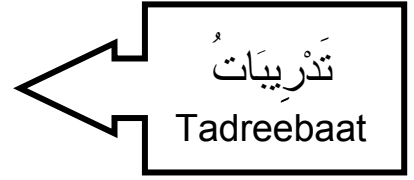
Notice that:

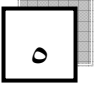

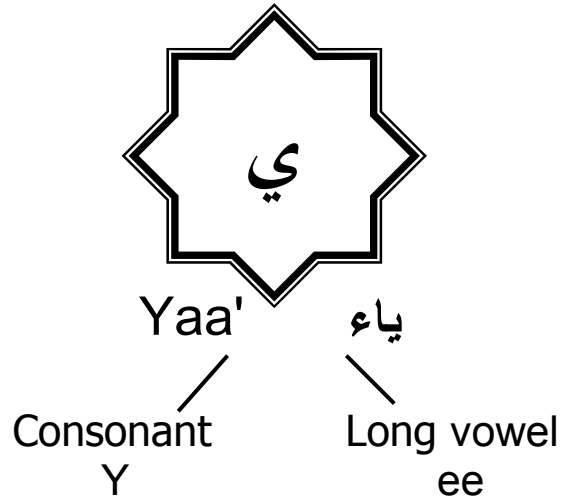

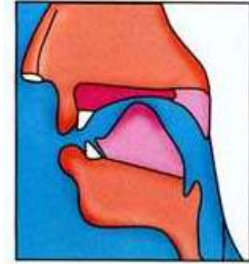


1- Yaa' as a Consonant

Al-qiraa'ah الْقِرَاءَةُ

Phonetics

- Pronunciation: Like Y (yarn) in English.
- Exit: The middle of the tongue with what corresponds from the roof of the mouth.
- Yaa' is a light letter.



Yaa' with Fat-hah is ya = يَ

Yaa' with Kasrah is yi = يِ

Yaa' with Dammah is yu = يُ

Yaa' with shaddah and Fat-hah is nayya = نَيَّ

Yaa' with shaddah and Kasrah is nayyi = نَيِّ

Yaa' with shaddah and Dammah is nayyu = نَيُّ

2-Yaa' as a Long Vowel

Yaa' Maddiyah (Prolonged) ياء مدية

القراءة Al-qiraa'ah

Phonetics

Pronunciation: Like ee (deed) in English.

Exit: The interior or the chest area.

Yaa' Maddiyah

- If the letter Yaa' (ي) comes **after a letter with Kasrah** and **has no mark above or below it**, then this Yaa' will be pronounced like double Kasrah as “ ee ” in “ beep “. bi ب is short but bee بي (ب + ي) is long.
- We call it "Maddiyah" (prolonged) because it is doubling the time of Kasrah
- An Arabic word cannot start with Yaa' Maddiyah.

ت + ي is tee = تي

ث + ي is thee = ثي

ن + ي is nee = ني

ي + ي is yee = يي

* (Yaa' Maddiyah has no mark)




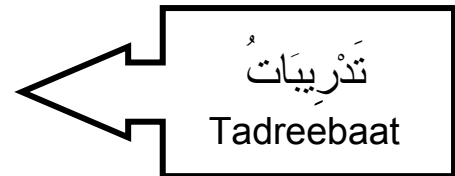

Easy grammar lesson:

Possessive pronouns in Arabic are letters attached to the end of nouns.

Yaa' Maddiyah is the equivalent to the pronoun "my"

So if we attach Yaa' Maddiyah to the end of a noun, it will mean "my"

Ex. بِنْتٌ means girl or daughter & بِنْتِي means my daughter

بَيْتٌ means house & بَيْتِي means my house
