GOD SPEAKS TO HIS PEOPLE THROUGH HIS WORD

The Bible is the means by which God graciously reveals Himself to His people—so we listen, read, and study with expectant hearts. God particularly entreats us in His Word to sing psalms. And while all Scripture is appropriate for hymns and spiritual songs, there is a specific exhortation for us to make use of the Psalter as the church's songbook.

Reading of the Word—Hebrews 11:1-7


Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen. ² For by it the people of old received their commendation. ³ By faith we understand that the universe was created by the word of God, so that what is seen was not made out of things that are visible. ⁴ By faith Abel offered to God a more acceptable sacrifice than Cain, through which he was commended as righteous, God commending him by accepting his gifts. And through his faith, though he died, he still speaks. ⁵ By faith Enoch was taken up so that he should not see death, and he was not found, because God had taken him. Now before he was taken he was commended as having pleased God.

⁶ And without faith it is impossible to please Him, for whoever would draw near to God must believe that He exists and that He rewards those who seek Him. ⁷ By faith Noah, being warned by God concerning events as yet unseen, in reverent fear constructed an ark for the saving of his household. By this he condemned the world and became an heir of the righteousness that comes by faith.

GOD CALLS HIS PEOPLE TO CONFESSION, REPENTANCE, AND RECONCILIATION

The people of God respond to His Word by confessing their sins, repenting of their sinful ways, and seeking God's favor through the reconciling work of Jesus, the Son of God.

Confession of Sin—based on Matthew 6:25-26, 28-32, 34

Pastor: Lord, we come confessing. You have told us not to be anxious about our lives, what we will eat or what we will drink, nor about our bodies, what we will put on.

All: But we have doubted our heavenly Father, as if the birds are of more value than us.

Pastor: Consider the lilies of the field, how they grow: they neither toil nor spin, yet I tell you, even Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed like one of these. But if God so clothes the grass of the field, which today is alive and tomorrow is thrown into the oven, will He not much more clothe you?

All: But we have little faith. Therefore we are anxious.


Assurance of Pardon—Matthew 2:3-5; Mark 12:30

People: We lift them up to the Lord.


Pastor: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Worship Notes:

O how sweet to trust in Jesus, just to trust His cleansing blood, Just in simple faith to plunge me 'neath the healing, cleansing flood. —Louisa Stead

Today, we begin a journey of several weeks through Hebrews 11, the great "hall of faith" which details a host of Old Testament characters who walked "by faith." The hymns we sing in this morning's service encourage us to trust in Christ, to place our hopes upon Him, and rely on Him in faith, just as those ancient heroes trusted in the promises of God. The psalms remind us that "He is blessed whose hope of blessing on the Lord his God is stayed" (Hallelujah, Praise Jehovah—Psalm 146). We respond, declaring, "My trust is in the Lord" and "all my trust on Thee is stayed," even when all around us is failing and the tempests are high (My Trust Is In The Lord—Psalm 11; Jesus, Lover Of My Soul). We wait in quiet expectation, "trust[ing] in nothing but His love" (My Soul Waits In Expectation—Psalm 62), because Jesus "holds our faith when fears arise" (Christ Our Hope In Life And Death). After all these stirring calls to faith, trust, and hope, we conclude by asking the Lord for "grace to trust Him more." —Henry C. Haffner
